## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending Titles 53 (Municipalities Generally) and 66 (Public Utilities) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in transportation network companies, further providing for distinctive signage; and, in transportation network service, further providing for licensure requirements and for transportation network company drivers.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. Section 57A10(a) of Title 53 of the Pennsylvania
10	Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
11	§ 57A10. Distinctive signage.
12	(a) DisplayA personal vehicle used to provide
13	transportation network service shall display consistent and
14	distinctive signage at all times while the driver is providing
15	transportation network service. The distinctive signage shall be
16	sufficiently large and color contrasted as to be readable from
17	the front and rear of the vehicle during daylight hours at a
18	distance of at least 50 feet and to identify a particular
19	vehicle associated with a particular transportation network
20	company. The distinctive signage shall also be illuminated,

reflective or otherwise clearly readable and visible during\_ 1 nighttime hours as to identify a particular vehicle associated 2 3 with a particular transportation network company prior to a passenger entering a vehicle. Acceptable forms of distinctive 4 signage shall include, but are not limited to, symbols or signs 5 on vehicle windshields, doors, roofs or grilles. Magnetic or 6 7 other removable distinctive signage is acceptable. A 8 transportation network company shall file an illustration of their distinctive signage with the authority. The authority may 9 10 not require signage that is different than that approved by the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. If the Pennsylvania 11 12 Public Utility Commission does not approve a form of distinctive 13 signage, the authority may make the designation.

15 Section 2. Sections 2604.1(b)(14) and 2605(b)(8) of Title 66 16 are amended to read:

17 § 2604.1. Licensure requirements.

19 (b) Requirements.--An applicant seeking a license under this 20 section must do all of the following as a condition of receipt 21 and maintenance of a license:

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23 (14) Provide to transportation network company drivers a 24 placard or decal for the vehicle that has been approved by 25 the commission. The decal shall be displayed at [any time] 26 all times while the driver is logged on to the digital 27 network or is providing a prearranged ride under this chapter. The placard or decal shall identify a particular\_ 28 29 vehicle associated with a particular transportation network 30 company and be:

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1	(i) Sufficiently large and color contrasted to be
2	readable during daylight hours at a distance of at least
3	<u>50 feet.</u>
4	(ii) Illuminated, reflective or otherwise clearly
5	readable and visible during nighttime hours prior to a
6	passenger entering a vehicle.

9	(b) Requirements for transportation network company
10	driversA transportation network company driver must:
11	* * *
12	(8) Display a commission-approved removable placard or
13	decal provided by the transportation network company on the
14	[automobile at any time] vehicles at all times while the
15	driver is logged on to the digital network or is offering or
16	providing a prearranged ride under this chapter. Placards,
17	decals or other markings must be clearly distinguishable to
18	identify that a particular vehicle is associated with a
19	particular transportation network company [and]_ be
20	sufficiently large and color contrasted to be readable during
21	daylight hours at a distance of at least 50 feet[.] <u>and be</u>
22	illuminated, reflective or otherwise clearly readable and
23	visible during nighttime hours prior to a passenger entering
24	<u>a vehicle.</u>

26	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
