AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 51 (Military Affairs) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in National Guard Youth Challenge
- 3 Program, further providing for definitions and for
- administration, establishing the Keystone State Challenge
- 5 Academy Account and further providing for report and for
- 6 audit required.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. Section 9801 of Title 51 of the Pennsylvania
- 10 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read:
- 11 § 9801. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 13 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 14 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 15 "Account." The Keystone State Challenge Academy Account
- 16 <u>established under section 9807 (relating to Keystone State</u>
- 17 Challenge Academy Account).

- 1 Section 2. Sections 9806, 9807, 9810 and 9811 of Title 51
- 2 are amended to read:
- 3 § 9806. Administration.
- 4 (a) Staffing.--Subject to 32 U.S.C. § 509 (relating to
- 5 National Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for
- 6 civilian youth) and its implementing regulations and applicable
- 7 agreements, the program shall be staffed by the administrative,
- 8 professional, technical and clerical employees necessary for the
- 9 operation of the program.
- 10 (b) Statement of policy. -- The department shall adopt a
- 11 statement of policy for the maintenance and use of the account
- 12 within 60 days of the effective date of this subsection. The
- 13 policy shall be transmitted as a notice to the Legislative
- 14 Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin
- 15 but shall not be subject to review under section 205 of the act
- 16 of July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
- 17 Commonwealth Documents Law, sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the
- 18 act of October 15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the
- 19 Commonwealth Attorneys Act, or the act of June 25, 1982
- 20 (P.L.633, No.181), known as the Regulatory Review Act.
- 21 (C) RULES AND REGULATIONS. -- THE DEPARTMENT MAY ADOPT AND
- 22 PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE
- 23 PROVISIONS OF THIS CHAPTER.
- 24 § 9807. [Funding.] Keystone State Challenge Academy Account.
- 25 (a) Establishment. -- The Keystone State Challenge Academy
- 26 Account is established as a nonlapsing restricted receipts
- 27 account in the General Fund.
- 28 (b) Appropriation. -- All money deposited into the account and
- 29 the interest the account accrues are appropriated to the
- 30 department on a continuing basis to be used for the purposes

- 1 provided under this chapter. Money in the account shall not
- 2 lapse.
- 3 (c) Use of account. -- The account may only be used for the
- 4 purposes provided for under this chapter and no money in the
- 5 account may be transferred or diverted to any other purpose by
- 6 administrative action.
- 7 (d) Sources of money. -- Money available to the account shall
- 8 include appropriations and transfers from the General Fund,
- 9 special funds, Federal funds and other sources of revenue made
- 10 available to the account.
- 11 (e) Allocation. -- Money from the account shall be allocated
- 12 for the purposes provided for under this chapter no later than
- 13 October 31, 2021, and each October 31 thereafter.
- 14 (f) Funding. -- The department shall apply for funding, as
- 15 provided for under 32 U.S.C. § 509(d) (relating to National
- 16 Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for civilian
- 17 youth). Under 32 U.S.C. § 509(j), the department may supplement
- 18 such funding with other resources, including gifts, made
- 19 available to the department and may also accept, use and dispose
- 20 of gifts or donations of money, other property or services for
- 21 the program.
- 22 § 9810. Report.
- [The department shall submit annually to] By September 30,_
- 24 2021, and each September 30 thereafter, the department shall
- 25 <u>submit to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the</u>
- 26 Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and
- 27 minority chairperson of the Education Committee of the Senate,
- 28 the chairperson and minority chairperson of the Veterans Affairs
- 29 and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the Senate, the
- 30 chairperson and minority chairperson of the Appropriations

- 1 <u>Committee of the House of Representatives</u>, the chairperson and
- 2 minority chairperson of the Education Committee of the House of
- 3 Representatives and the chairperson and minority chairperson of
- 4 the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
- 5 House of Representatives a written report concerning the
- 6 program. The report shall include, but not be limited to, all of
- 7 the following:
- 8 (1) The number of individuals who applied to the program
- 9 in the previous fiscal year.
- 10 (2) The number of individuals who participated in the
- 11 program in the previous fiscal year.
- 12 (3) The number and percentage of program participants in
- the previous fiscal year who achieved each of the following:
- 14 (i) Earned a high school diploma or its equivalent.
- 15 (ii) Enrolled in a course of study at an institution
- of higher education.
- 17 (iii) Accepted a position of full-time, paid
- 18 employment.
- 19 (iv) Accepted a position of part-time, paid
- employment.
- 21 (v) Entered the armed forces of the United States,
- including a reserve component or the National Guard.
- 23 (4) The demographic makeup of the applicants to, and
- participants in, the program, including, but not limited to,
- 25 the following:
- 26 (i) Race.
- 27 (ii) Age.
- 28 (iii) Gender.
- 29 <u>(4.1) Details on the revenues and expenditures of the</u>
- 30 account in the prior fiscal year and the identification and

- description of activities, programs and projects which
- 2 received money from the account.
- 3 (5) Any information the department provides to the
- 4 Secretary of Defense under 32 U.S.C. § 509(k) (relating to
- 5 National Guard Youth Challenge Program of opportunities for
- 6 civilian youth).
- 7 § 9811. Audit required.
- 8 The department shall undergo an annual audit of the program.
- 9 The audit shall be conducted as part of the Commonwealth's
- 10 <u>Single Audit</u> by a qualified [independent] certified public
- 11 accountant under generally accepted audit standards of the
- 12 Governmental Accounting Standards Board. The audit shall be
- 13 submitted to the following:
- 14 (1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 15 [Education] <u>Appropriations</u> Committee of the Senate.
- 16 (1.1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 17 Education Committee of the Senate.
- 18 (2) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 19 Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
- 20 Senate.
- 21 (2.1) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 22 Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 23 (3) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 24 Education Committee of the House of Representatives.
- 25 (4) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
- 26 Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness Committee of the
- 27 House of Representatives.
- 28 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
