Amending Titles 18 (Crimes and Offenses) and 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in falsification and 2 intimidation, further providing for the offense of 3 impersonating a public servant; and, in other required 4 equipment, further providing for visual and audible signals 5 on emergency vehicles. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. Section 4912 of Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended to read: 10 11 § 4912. Impersonating a public servant. 12 (a) Offenses defined. -- A person commits [a misdemeanor of 13 the second degree if he falsely] the offense of impersonating a public servant if: 14 15 (1) The person pretends to hold a position in the public 16 service with intent to induce another to submit to such 17 pretended official authority or otherwise to act in reliance 18 upon that pretense [to his prejudice]. (2) The person pretends to be a law enforcement officer 19

with intent to induce another to submit to such pretended

- 3 (b) Grading.--
- 4 (1) An offense under subsection (a) (1) is a misdemeanor
- 5 <u>of the second degree.</u>
- 6 (2) An offense under subsection (a) (2) is a felony of
- 7 <u>the third degree</u>.
- 8 (c) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "law_
- 9 enforcement officer" means any of the following:
- 10 (1) A member of the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 11 (2) A liquor enforcement officer of the Pennsylvania
- 12 <u>State Police.</u>
- 13 (3) An enforcement officer or investigator employed by
- the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.
- 15 <u>(4) A parole agent, enforcement officer or investigator</u>
- of the Pennsylvania Board of Probation and Parole.
- 17 (5) A Capitol Police officer.
- 18 (6) A Department of Conservation and Natural Resources
- 19 <u>ranger.</u>
- 20 (7) A drug enforcement agent of the Office of Attorney
- 21 General whose principal duty is the enforcement of the drug
- 22 laws of this Commonwealth and a special agent of the Office
- 23 of Attorney General whose principal duty is the enforcement
- of the criminal laws of this Commonwealth.
- 25 (8) A member of a port authority or other authority
- 26 police department.
- 27 (9) A police officer of a county, region, city, borough,
- town or township.
- 29 (10) A sheriff or deputy sheriff.
- 30 (11) A Pennsylvania Waterways Conservation Officer.

- 1 (12) A Pennsylvania Wildlife Conservation Officer.
- 2 (13) A member of a campus police force with the power to
- 3 arrest under section 2416 of the act of April 9, 1929
- 4 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.

- 6 <u>meaning given in section 302 of the act of November 29, 2004</u>
- 7 (P.L.1383, No.180), known as the Uniform Crime Reporting Act.
- 8 (14) A member of the Fort Indiantown Gap Police Force.
- 9 (15) A corrections officer employed at a State or county
- 10 correctional institution to provide any security or custodial
- 11 service for inmates.
- 12 <u>(16) A constable or deputy constable.</u>
- 13 Section 2. Section 4571 of Title 75 is amended by adding
- 14 subsections to read:
- 15 § 4571. Visual and audible signals on emergency vehicles.
- 16 * * *
- 17 (d.1) Sale of emergency vehicle.--
- 18 (1) A seller of an emergency vehicle equipped with
- 19 <u>revolving or flashing lights or audible warning systems</u>
- identical or similar to those specified in subsections (a)
- 21 and (b) shall remove all externally mounted emergency lights
- 22 or permanently disable all other nonremovable emergency
- 23 lights or systems upon the sale of the vehicle to a buyer who
- is not authorized by law or regulation to operate an
- 25 emergency vehicle with visual or audible systems.
- 26 (2) A person who sells a vehicle equipped with visual or
- 27 <u>audible warning systems in violation of this subsection</u>
- commits a summary offense and shall, upon conviction, be
- 29 sentenced to pay a fine of not less than \$500 nor more than
- 30 \$1,000.

1 (3) A person who sells a vehicle equipped with visual or

- knows or should have known of the buyer's intent to use the
- 4 <u>vehicle in violation of 18 Pa.C.S. § 4912(a)(2) (relating to</u>
- 5 <u>impersonating a public servant) commits a misdemeanor of the</u>
- 6 <u>third degree</u>.
- 7 (d.2) Exceptions. -- Subsections (d) and (d.1) shall not apply
- 8 to any of the following:
- 9 <u>(1) The sale or use of police, fire or other emergency</u>
- 10 <u>vehicles for which antique, classic, vintage or collectible</u>
- registration plates have been issued under section 1340
- 12 <u>(relating to antique, classic and collectible plates) and</u>
- 13 <u>which are driven or transported without operation of visual</u>
- or audible warning systems.
- 15 <u>(2) The sale or use of police, fire or other emergency</u>
- vehicles for which manufacturer or dealer registration plates
- 17 have been issued under section 1335 (relating to registration
- 18 plates for manufacturers and dealers) and which are driven or
- 19 transported without operation of visual or audible warning
- 20 systems for the purpose of sale, service, demonstration or
- 21 exhibition.
- 22 (3) The sale or use of a police, fire or other emergency
- 23 vehicle by a representative of a manufacturer of aftermarket
- 24 emergency vehicle equipment or an upfitter whose primary
- income is derived from the sale, service or installation of
- 26 emergency vehicle equipment when the vehicle is driven or
- 27 <u>transported without operation of visual or audible warning</u>
- 28 systems for the purpose of sale, service, demonstration or
- 29 exhibition. The vehicle shall be clearly marked as a
- 30 demonstration vehicle.

- 2 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
