AN ACT

- Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and 2 consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of 3 insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and 4 protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds 5 associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and supervision of insurance carried by such companies, 8 associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by 9 the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and 10 repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing 11 12 for coverage for nonopioid pain management care. 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a 16 17 section to read: 18 Section 635.8. Coverage for Nonopioid Pain Management 19 Care. -- (a) A health insurance policy offered, issued or renewed
- 21 <u>nonopioid pain management care. Coverage for evidence-based</u>

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in this Commonwealth shall include coverage for evidence-based

- 1 nonopioid pain management care shall include, but not be limited
- 2 to, the following treatments:
- 3 (1) Acupuncture.
- 4 <u>(2) Chiropractic care.</u>
- 5 (3) Massage therapy.
- 6 (4) Occupational therapy.
- 7 <u>(5) Osteopathic manipulative treatment.</u>
- 8 (6) Physical therapy.
- 9 (b) Evidence-based nonopioid pain management care shall be
- 10 considered a rehabilitation and habilitation service under the
- 11 Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (Public Law 111-148,
- 12 124 Stat. 119) and corresponding regulations.
- 13 (c) The coverage required under this section shall not be
- 14 subject to annual or lifetime dollar limits on visits for
- 15 <u>treatment of pain.</u>
- 16 (d) The coverage required under this section shall be
- 17 subject to deductibles, coinsurance and copayment requirements
- 18 imposed by an insurer subject to this section for similar
- 19 coverages under the same health insurance policy.
- 20 (e) The amount of health care provider reimbursement by an
- 21 insurer for coverage required under this section shall be no
- 22 <u>less than seventy-five percent of the billing code rate.</u>
- 23 (f) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 24 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:
- 25 "Billing code rate" means the cost of a service or procedure
- 26 provided by a health care provider that is assigned a numerical
- 27 code in order for an insurer to reimburse the health care
- 28 provider for that service or procedure.
- 29 "Evidence-based" means the conscientious, explicit and
- 30 judicious use of current best evidence in making decisions about

- 1 the care of individual patients.
- 2 "Health insurance policy" means a policy, subscriber
- 3 contract, certificate or plan issued by an insurer that provides
- 4 medical or health care coverage. The term does not include the
- 5 <u>following policies:</u>
- 6 (1) Accident only.
- 7 (2) Credit only.
- 8 (3) Long-term care or disability income.
- 9 <u>(4) Specified disease.</u>
- 10 (5) Medicare supplement.
- 11 (6) TRICARE, including Civilian Health and Medical Program
- 12 <u>of the Uniformed Services (CHAMPUS) supplement.</u>
- 13 <u>(7) Fixed indemnity.</u>
- 14 (8) Dental only.
- 15 (9) Vision only.
- 16 <u>(10) Workers' compensation.</u>
- 17 (11) Automobile medical payment under 75 Pa.C.S. (relating
- 18 to vehicles).
- 19 "Nonopioid pain management care" means nonpharmacologic and
- 20 pharmacologic modalities or medications as an alternative to
- 21 opioid medications for the treatment of mild to moderate acute
- 22 and chronic pain.
- 23 Section 2. The addition of section 635.8 of the act shall
- 24 apply to health insurance policies offered, issued or renewed on
- 25 or after the effective date of this section.
- 26 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
