1 2 3	Amending Title 45 (Legal Notices) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in legal advertising, providing for methods for advertising.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 45 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
8	<u>§ 311. Methods for advertising.</u>
9	(a) General ruleNotwithstanding the provisions of this
10	title or any law or regulation to the contrary, whenever an
11	advertisement or notice is required by law, rule or regulation,
12	a local government unit shall satisfy the requirement by using
13	one of the following methods:
14	(1) a newspaper of general circulation as defined in
15	section 101 (relating to definitions), printed in the county
16	in which the local government unit is located;
17	(2) a newspaper printed in the local government unit, if

1 such newspaper exists; 2 (3) a newspaper circulating generally in the local 3 government unit; (4) a legal newspaper designated by the rules of court 4 5 of the county in which the local government unit is located for the publication of legal notices and advertisements; 6 (5) the local government unit's publicly accessible 7 Internet website using hypertext markup language (HTML) 8 9 format or an equivalent language format; 10 (6) the publicly accessible Internet website of a newspaper listed in paragraph (1), (2), (3) or (4), using 11 12 HTML format or an equivalent language format; or 13 (7) a locally circulated printed publication that is at 14 least four pages long, is issued on at least a weekly basis 15 and is distributed by audited carriers to all known addresses 16 within the local government unit. 17 (b) Legal journal requirement.--Use by a local government 18 unit of a method specified in subsection (a) to satisfy the 19 requirement to publish an advertisement or notice required by 20 law, rule or regulation does not relieve the local government unit of the duty to publish in a legal journal if otherwise 21 required to by section 308 (relating to additional publication 22 23 in legal journals) or other provision of law. 24 (c) Requirements for advertisements.--Use by a local government unit of a method specified in subsection (a)(2) 25 26 through (7) to satisfy the requirement to publish an advertisement or notice required by law, rule or regulation 27 shall also require a local government unit to do the following: 28 29 (1) Post a copy of each advertisement or notice 30 prominently at the principal office of the local government

1 unit or at the public building in which the local government unit meets. In circumstances where advertisements or notices 2 3 are unable to be posted at the principal office of the local 4 government unit or at the public building in which the local government unit meets, the county in which the local 5 government unit is located shall provide space for the 6 postings where the local government unit is responsible for 7 posting its advertisements or notices. 8 9 (2) Adopt a resolution declaring the local government <u>unit's intent to use one or more of the methods in subsection</u> 10 (a) (2) through (7) to satisfy the requirement to publish an 11 advertisement or notice required by law, rule or regulation 12 prior to utilizing one of those methods. Should the methods 13 14 of advertising be revised or updated, the local government unit shall declare its intent by a new resolution and 15 specifically identify the new methods of advertising. 16 17 Following adoption of a resolution under this paragraph, and 18 prior to publishing an advertisement or notice using the 19 methods specified in subsection (a)(2) through (7), the local 20 government unit shall publish notice in one or more newspapers of general circulation within the jurisdiction of 21 22 the local government unit, announcing that advertisements and 23 notices will be made public using the alternative methods 24 selected by the local government unit. 25 (3) Retain a copy of the advertisement or notice for no 26 less than three years. 27 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
