AN ACT

- 1 Providing for access to long-term care facilities for members of
- the clergy, for additional safety requirements for residents,
- for suspension of access for members of the clergy and for personal protective equipment for members of the clergy.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Religious
- 9 Liberty in Long-Term Care Facilities Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency
- 15 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
- 16 general authority of Governor).
- 17 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.

- 1 "Member of the clergy." A clergyman, priest, rabbi,
- 2 minister, Christian Science practitioner, religious healer or

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- 3 spiritual leader of any regularly established church or other
- 4 religious organization.
- 5 "LOCK-DOWN PHASE." A PERIOD OF TIME A LONG-TERM CARE <--
- 6 FACILITY RESTRICTS VISITATION FROM THE GENERAL PUBLIC TO
- 7 RESIDENTS OF THE FACILITY.
- 8 "Long-term care facility." A facility licensed by the
- 9 department or the Department of Human Services, including, but
- 10 not limited to, a long-term care nursing facility, a skilled
- 11 nursing facility, an assisted living facility, a personal care
- 12 home, an older adult daily living center, OR an independent
- 13 long-term care facility or an intermediate care facility for <--
- 14 individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- "MEMBER OF THE CLERGY." A CLERGYMAN, PRIEST, RABBI,
- 16 MINISTER, CHRISTIAN SCIENCE PRACTITIONER, RELIGIOUS HEALER OR
- 17 SPIRITUAL LEADER OF ANY REGULARLY ESTABLISHED CHURCH OR OTHER
- 18 RELIGIOUS ORGANIZATION.
- 19 "Resident." An adult with established residency in a long-
- 20 term care facility.
- 21 Section 3. Access to long-term care facilities for members of
- the clergy.
- 23 The department, in consultation with the Department of Human
- 24 Services, shall establish protocols to allow a resident or an
- 25 individual with decision-making authority for the resident to
- 26 request visitation by a member of the clergy during a
- 27 declaration of disaster emergency. A member of the clergy shall
- 28 meet the necessary qualifications to enter the long-term care
- 29 facility to provide in-person physical or emotional support to a
- 30 resident of a long-term care facility on a voluntary basis and

- 1 in accordance with the protocols established under this section.
- 2 THE DEPARTMENT MAY UPDATE THE PROTOCOLS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS
- 3 SECTION AT ANY TIME DURING THE DISASTER EMERGENCY. THE
- 4 DEPARTMENT MAY NOT UPDATE THE PROTOCOLS ESTABLISHED UNDER THIS
- 5 SECTION TO EXPAND THE DURATION OF THE LOCK-DOWN PHASE UNDER
- 6 PARAGRAPH (2) FOR A TIME PERIOD EXCEEDING 45 DAYS. The protocols
- 7 shall include all of the following:
- 8 (1) Safety measures for members of the clergy,
- 9 including, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
- 10 enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary
- 11 safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of
- 12 the residents and staff of the long-term care facility.
- 13 (2) A duration, SET BY THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONSULTATION <--

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- 14 WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES not to exceed 30 45
- days, when a long-term care facility may enter a lock-down
- 16 phase DURING WHICH THE LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY MAY EXCLUDE
- 17 MEMBERS OF THE CLERGY for the purpose of establishing safety
- 18 measures for residents and members of the clergy.
- 19 Section 4. Additional safety requirements for residents.
- 20 A long-term care facility may establish additional safety
- 21 requirements to protect the residents if the requirements meet <--
- 22 all of the following criteria:, INCLUDING LIMITATIONS ON THE
- 23 DURATION OF THE VISITS, THE NUMBER OF VISITORS PER WEEK PER
- 24 RESIDENT, THE LOCATION OF VISITS AND THE SPACING OF VISITORS.
- 25 THE REQUIREMENTS UNDER THIS SUBSECTION SHALL MEET ALL OF THE
- 26 FOLLOWING CRITERIA:
- 27 (1) The requirements are directly linked to a
- declaration of disaster emergency.
- 29 (2) The requirements are not so burdensome and onerous
- 30 as to substantially prevent a member of the clergy from being

- 1 able to visit a resident in person.
- 2 Section 5. Suspension of access for members of the clergy.
- 3 A long-term care facility may suspend access to a member of
- 4 the clergy who violates the protocols established under section
- 5 3, and the long-term care facility shall allow the resident, or
- 6 an individual with decision-making authority for the resident,
- 7 to immediately request another member of the clergy.
- 8 Section 6. Personal protective equipment for members of the
- 9 clergy.
- 10 A long-term care facility may require a member of the clergy
- 11 to provide personal protective equipment for himself or herself
- 12 or assume the cost of the personal protective equipment provided
- 13 by the facility to allow the member of the clergy to access the
- 14 long-term care facility. PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT PROVIDED <--
- 15 BY THE LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY MAY NOT REDUCE THE PERSONAL
- 16 PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE TO THE EMPLOYEES AND STAFF OF THE
- 17 LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY.
- 18 Section 7. Applicability.
- 19 This act shall apply for the period commencing 15 days after
- 20 a declaration of disaster emergency and THAT RESULTS IN A LOCK- <--
- 21 DOWN PHASE OF LONG-TERM CARE FACILITIES UNTIL 60 days after the
- 22 termination or expiration of the declaration of disaster
- 23 emergency by executive order, proclamation or operation of law.
- 24 Section 8. Construction.
- Nothing in this act shall be construed to:
- 26 (1) prohibit or restrict long-term care facilities from
- 27 allowing members of the clergy to visit residents in a manner
- deemed appropriate by the long-term care facilities before
- 29 the effective date of section 3; or
- 30 (2) supersede Federal authority regarding long-term care

- 1 facilities or to prevent the department or Department of
- 2 Human Services from taking necessary actions to render the
- 3 Commonwealth eligible for Federal funds or reimbursement
- 4 services provided in long-term care facilities.
- 5 Section 9. Effective date.
- 6 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
