AN ACT

1 2 3	Providing for retaining health care innovations during the COVID-19 pandemic and imposing duties on the Joint State Government Commission.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Short title.
7	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Retaining
8	Health Care Innovations Act.
9	Section 2. Purposes.
10	This act provides legal authority for administrative
11	flexibilities to continue despite the termination or expiration
12	of the COVID-19 disaster declaration and requires the
13	development of recommendations to retain innovations adopted
14	during the COVID-19 pandemic.
15	Section 3. Definitions.
16	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
17	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
18	context clearly indicates otherwise:

1 "Administrative flexibilities." As follows:

(1) Executive orders, proclamations or regulations
issued, amended or rescinded under the COVID-19 disaster
declaration as authorized by 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(b) (relating
to general authority of Governor).

6 The term includes changes to policies, procedures (2)7 and practices adopted by State administrative agencies to 8 assist health care facilities, Federally qualified health 9 centers, rural health clinics, health care practitioners and health care providers in responding to the COVID-19 pandemic. 10 "Commission." The Joint State Government Commission. 11 12 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious 13 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 14 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan, 15 China.

16 "COVID-19 disaster declaration." The proclamation of 17 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020, 18 published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and renewed on 19 August 29, 2020, and any renewal of the state of disaster 20 emergency, to address COVID-19, in accordance with 35 Pa.C.S. § 21 7301(c).

"Extension period." The one-year period from the date of the termination or expiration of the COVID-19 disaster declaration during which administrative flexibilities provided to health care facilities and health care practitioners remain in force. "Federally qualified health center." A health center as defined in section 1861(aa)(4) of the Social Security Act (49 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1395X(aa)(4)).

29 "Health care facility." A facility that is licensed to 30 provide health care services under Article X of the act of June

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13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the Human Services Code, or
 the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known as the Health
 Care Facilities Act.

4 "Health care practitioner." As defined in section 103 of the5 Health Care Facilities Act.

6 "Health care provider." As defined in section 103 of the7 Health Care Facilities Act.

8 "Rural health clinic." As defined in section 1861(aa)(2) of
9 the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. § 1395X(aa)(2)).

10 Section 4. Administrative flexibilities.

(a) Authorization.--Administrative flexibilities provided to a health care facility, federally qualified health center, rural health clinic, health care practitioner or a health care provider and adopted under the authority of the COVID-19 disaster declaration shall be extended through the extension period, or until the Joint State Government Commission issues a report in accordance with section 6, whichever is later.

(b) Emergency operations plan.--A health care facility may take advantage of administrative flexibilities during the extension period even if the emergency operations plan of the health care facility is closed.

22 Section 5. Advisory committee.

In developing the report under section 6, the commission shall establish an advisory committee comprised of, but not limited to, the following individuals:

Section 6. Report. 18 19 (a) Duty of commission. -- The commission shall perform an analysis of the administrative flexibilities described in 20 21 section 4 and issue a report to the General Assembly. 22 (b) Contents of report. -- The report under this section 23 shall, at a minimum: 24 Describe the administrative flexibilities granted (1)25 under the COVID-19 disaster declaration. 26 Describe the impact of each administrative (2) 27 flexibility on patient access and quality of care. 28 (3) Describe the financial impact of each administrative 29 flexibility on both the Commonwealth and the health care 30 facilities, health care practitioners and health care 20210HB1011PN1042 - 5 -

1 providers affected by the waivers.

2 (4) Include recommendations to the General Assembly on
3 whether the administrative flexibilities should be
4 maintained.

5 Section 7. Limitations.

Nothing in this act shall require the Commonwealth to
maintain administrative flexibilities that would violate Federal
law or disqualify the Commonwealth from receiving Federal
matching funds for Medicaid services.

10 Section 8. Construction.

11 Nothing in this act shall be construed to prohibit a State 12 administrative agency from ending any waiver or suspension of 13 regulations deemed to be no longer necessary during the period 14 of the COVID-19 disaster declaration. Nothing in this act shall 15 be construed to permanently amend or expand health care 16 practitioner or health care provider licensing, supervisory 17 requirements or scope of practice.

18 Section 9. Applicability.

(a) Publication.--A State administrative agency shall submit
a public notice to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin 60 days before the
expiration or termination date of an administrative flexibility.

23 (b) Notice. -- The provisions of this act shall not apply to 24 administrative flexibilities no longer in effect on the date the 25 COVID-19 disaster declaration expires or is terminated by 26 executive order, proclamation or operation of law. If a State administrative agency has submitted a public notice to the 27 28 Legislation Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania 29 Bulletin that provides for the expiration or termination date of an administrative flexibility under subsection (a) before the 30

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expiration or termination of the COVID-19 disaster declaration,
 the administrative flexibility shall be deemed expired or
 terminated for purposes of this act before the end of the COVID 19 disaster declaration.
 Section 10. Effective date.

6 This act shall take effect immediately.
