AN ACT

- Amending Title 25 (Elections) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in voting procedures, providing for assistance for
- 2 Statutes, in voting procedures, providi 3 certain qualified electors.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 25 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 3303. Assistance for certain qualified electors.
- 9 (a) Eliqibility.--A qualified elector who has a physical,
- 10 <u>emotional</u>, <u>intellectual or developmental disability may request</u>
- 11 <u>a ballot by an election official outside the polling place of</u>
- 12 the qualified elector.
- 13 (b) Distance, marking and casting of vote.--A qualified
- 14 <u>elector's vote under subsection (a) shall be cast within 150</u>
- 15 <u>feet of the entrance to the polling place. The qualified elector</u>
- 16 shall mark the ballot in the election official's presence but in
- 17 a secret manner and, obscuring the vote, return the ballot to

- 1 the officer. The election official shall immediately return to
- 2 the polling place and deposit the ballot in the ballot container
- 3 <u>in accordance with the instructions of the county election</u>
- 4 board.
- 5 (c) Voting machine alternative. -- An election district that
- 6 has an electronic voting machine that is easily portable may use
- 7 the voting machine in lieu of a printed ballot for the qualified
- 8 elector requiring assistance under subsection (a). The
- 9 electronic voting machine may be used in lieu of a printed
- 10 ballot if:
- 11 (1) the voting machine remains in the plain view of two
- 12 <u>election officials representing two political parties, or in</u>
- a primary election, two election officials representing the
- 14 party conducting the primary, provided that if the use of two
- officials for this purpose would result in too few officials
- remaining in the polling place to meet legal requirements,
- 17 the voting machine shall remain in plain view of one official
- 18 who shall be either the chief election official or the
- 19 assistant chief election official; and
- 20 (2) the qualified elector casts a ballot in a secret
- 21 <u>manner unless the qualified elector requests assistance under</u>
- 22 this section. After the qualified elector has completed
- voting, the election official or officials shall immediately
- return the voting machine to its assigned location inside the
- 25 polling place.
- 26 (d) Recorded information. -- If a voting machine is used under
- 27 <u>subsection (c), the following information must be recorded by</u>
- 28 the election official:
- 29 <u>(1) The machine number.</u>
- 30 (2) The time that the machine was removed and the time

- 1 that it was returned.
- 2 (3) The number on the machine's public counter before
- 3 the machine was removed and the number on the same counter
- 4 <u>when it was returned.</u>
- 5 (4) The name or names of the officer or officers who
- 6 <u>accompanied the machine shall be recorded on the statement of</u>
- 7 results.
- 8 (e) Assisted voting designation. -- A qualified voter who
- 9 requires assistance to vote by reason of a physical, emotional,
- 10 intellectual or developmental disability or inability to read or
- 11 write may, on request, be assisted in voting. If the voter has a
- 12 vision impairment, the voter may designate an election official
- 13 or any other individual to assist in voting. If the voter is
- 14 unable to read or write or is disabled for any cause other than
- 15 vision impairment, the voter may designate an election official
- 16 or any other individual to assist the voter other than the
- 17 voter's employer or agent of that employer, or officer or agent
- 18 of the voter's union.
- 19 (f) Assisted voting procedure. -- The election official or
- 20 other individual designated under subsection (e) may not enter
- 21 the voting booth with the voter unless:
- 22 (1) The voter signs a statement, on a form provided by
- 23 <u>the county election board, stating that the voter requires</u>
- 24 assistance by reason of a physical, emotional, intellectual
- or developmental disability or inability to read or write. If
- the voter is unable to sign the statement, the voter's own
- 27 <u>mark acknowledged by the voter before an election official</u>
- shall be a sufficient signature, provided no mark shall be
- 29 required of a voter who is blind.
- 30 (2) The election official or other individual signs the

- 1 <u>statement under paragraph (1) that the official is not the</u>
- 2 qualified elector's employer, an agent of that employer or an
- 3 <u>officer or agent of the qualified elector's union, and the</u>
- 4 <u>official will act in accordance with the requirements of this</u>
- 5 section.
- 6 (g) Advice and recording of name and address. -- An election
- 7 official shall advise the qualified elector and individual
- 8 <u>assisting the qualified elector of the requirements of this</u>
- 9 <u>section and record the name of the qualified elector and the</u>
- 10 name and address of the individual assisting the qualified
- 11 <u>elector</u>.
- 12 (h) Instructions in casting vote. -- The election official or
- 13 <u>other individual designated shall assist the qualified elector</u>
- 14 <u>in the preparation of the qualified elector's ballot in</u>
- 15 <u>accordance with the instructions of the qualified elector and</u>
- 16 <u>without soliciting the qualified elector's vote or in any manner</u>
- 17 attempting to influence the vote. The election official may not
- 18 divulge or indicate, by signs or otherwise, how the qualified
- 19 <u>elector voted on any office or question. If a ballot is used,</u>
- 20 the official or other individual designated shall deposit the
- 21 ballot in the ballot container or in the ballot scanner machine
- 22 in accordance with the instructions of the county election
- 23 board.
- 24 <u>(i) Translator.--If the qualified elector requires</u>
- 25 <u>assistance in a language other than English and has not</u>
- 26 designated an individual to assist the qualified elector, an
- 27 election official, before assisting as interpreter, shall
- 28 inquire of the representatives authorized to be present whether
- 29 <u>a volunteer is available who can interpret for the qualified</u>
- 30 <u>elector</u>. One representative interpreter for each party or

- 1 candidate, insofar as available, shall be permitted to observe
- 2 the election official communicate with the qualified elector.
- 3 The qualified elector may designate one of the volunteer party
- 4 or candidate interpreters to provide assistance. An individual
- 5 <u>designated by the qualified elector shall meet all the</u>
- 6 requirements of this section for an individual providing
- 7 assistance.
- 8 (j) Penalties. -- An individual who willfully violates
- 9 subsections (e), (f), (g), (h) or (i) commits a misdemeanor of
- 10 the first degree. The provisions of Chapter 17 (relating to
- 11 penalties) and Article XVIII of the act of June 3, 1937
- 12 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as the Pennsylvania Election Code,
- 13 <u>shall be applicable to this section.</u>
- 14 (k) Audio ballot voting. -- In an election district where an
- 15 electronic voting machine is available that provides an audio
- 16 ballot, the election official shall notify a qualified elector
- 17 requiring assistance under this section that a machine is
- 18 available for the qualified elector to use in privacy. An
- 19 <u>election official shall instruct the qualified elector on the</u>
- 20 use of the voting machine. Nothing in this section may be
- 21 construed to require a qualified elector to use the machine
- 22 unassisted.
- 23 (1) Definitions. -- The following words and phrases when used
- 24 in this section shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 25 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 26 "County election board." The board of elections of a county.
- 27 "Election district." A district, division or precinct
- 28 established under the Pennsylvania Election Code, in which all
- 29 qualified electors are eligible to vote in the same polling
- 30 place.

- 1 <u>"Election official." The election officers required to</u>
- 2 conduct primaries and elections in an election district in
- 3 accordance with the provisions of this section. The term shall
- 4 <u>include the judge of elections and the majority and minority</u>
- 5 <u>inspectors elected or appointed by a county election board and</u>
- 6 the clerk or machine inspector appointed by a county election
- 7 board.
- 8 "Qualified elector." An individual who:
- 9 <u>(1) possesses all of the qualifications for voting</u>
- 10 prescribed by the Constitution of Pennsylvania and the laws
- of this Commonwealth; or
- 12 (2) being otherwise qualified by continued residence in
- the individual's election district, obtains qualifications
- 14 <u>under paragraph (1) before the next ensuing election.</u>
- 15 Section 2. All acts and parts of acts are repealed insofar
- 16 as they are inconsistent with this act.
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
