AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in professional employees, repealing and adding provisions relating to minimum salaries for 5 6 teachers. 7 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 1142.1 of the act of March 10, 1949 10 11 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is 12 repealed: 13 [Section 1142.1. Minimum Salaries for Teachers.--(a) Notwithstanding the provisions of section 1142, the minimum 14 15 salary paid to full-time teachers for the school term 1988-1989 16 and each school term thereafter, shall be eighteen thousand five 17 hundred dollars (\$18,500) as provided in this section. This section shall not require, and shall not be 18 (b) 19 construed to require, the modification, renegotiation or

- 2 effective date of this section between a public employer and a
- 3 public employe or employe organization pursuant to the act of
- 4 July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the "Public Employe
- 5 Relations Act," nor shall the salary or any other terms of any
- 6 such contract or agreement be superseded or modified by this
- 7 section: Provided, that the board of school directors of a
- 8 school district may at any time during the term of such contract
- 9 or agreement implement the minimum salary provisions of this
- 10 section for the entire school term in the manner provided in
- 11 section 1151. Whenever a board of school directors of a school
- 12 district exercises the power granted by this subsection to
- 13 implement the minimum salary provisions of this section, it
- 14 shall implement them by making a supplemental salary payment to
- 15 each full-time teacher who qualifies for such payment in an
- 16 amount equal to the difference between eighteen thousand five
- 17 hundred dollars (\$18,500) and the salary to which such teacher
- 18 is entitled under the terms of the applicable contract or
- 19 agreement and shall be entitled to receive the special payment
- 20 provided by section 2594.
- 21 (c) The board of school directors of a school district shall
- 22 pay to full-time teachers a salary which equals at least
- eighteen thousand five hundred dollars (\$18,500) for the school
- 24 term beginning after the expiration of the term of any contract
- 25 or agreement in effect on the effective date of this section
- 26 between a public employer and a public employe or employe
- 27 organization pursuant to the "Public Employe Relations Act," and
- 28 for each school term thereafter.
- (d) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall
- 30 have the following meanings:

- "Board of school directors" shall mean board of school
- 2 directors, intermediate unit board of directors and area career
- 3 and technical board.
- "School district" shall mean school district, intermediate
- 5 unit and area career and technical school.
- "Teacher" shall mean classroom teachers and all others
- 7 included within the definition of "teacher" in section 1141,
- 8 including speech correctionists and instructional department
- 9 chairmen employed by a school district.]
- 10 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 11 <u>Section 1142.2. Minimum Salaries for Teachers.--(a)</u>
- 12 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the minimum salary
- 13 paid to full-time teachers for the school term 2021-2022 and
- 14 <u>each school term thereafter, shall be forty-five thousand</u>
- 15 <u>dollars (\$45,000)</u> as provided in this section.
- 16 (b) This section shall not require, and shall not be
- 17 construed to require, the modification, renegotiation or
- 18 reopening of any contract or agreement in effect on the
- 19 <u>effective date of this section between a public employer and a</u>
- 20 public employe or employe organization pursuant to the act of
- 21 <u>July 23, 1970 (P.L.563, No.195), known as the "Public Employe</u>
- 22 Relations Act," nor shall the salary or any other terms of any
- 23 <u>such contract or agreement be superseded or modified by this</u>
- 24 section, subject to subsection (c).
- 25 (c) Whenever a school district, area career and technical
- 26 school or intermediate unit exercises the power granted by this
- 27 subsection to implement the minimum salary provisions of this
- 28 <u>section</u>, it shall implement them by making a supplemental salary
- 29 payment to each full-time teacher who qualifies for such payment
- 30 <u>in an amount equal to the difference between forty-five thousand</u>

- 1 dollars (\$45,000) and the salary to which the teacher is
- 2 entitled under the terms of the applicable contract or
- 3 agreement.
- 4 (d) The school district, area career and technical school or
- 5 <u>intermediate unit shall pay to full-time teachers a salary which</u>
- 6 equals at least forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000) for the
- 7 school term beginning after the expiration of the term of any
- 8 contract or agreement in effect on the effective date of this
- 9 <u>section between a public employer and a public employe or</u>
- 10 employe organization pursuant to the "Public Employe Relations
- 11 Act," and for each school term thereafter.
- (e) For purposes of this section, the following terms shall
- 13 <u>have the following meanings:</u>
- 14 <u>"Teacher" shall mean a person who holds an instructional</u>
- 15 <u>certificate and is a full-time employe of a school district,</u>
- 16 <u>area career and technical school or intermediate unit.</u>
- 17 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021, or
- 18 immediately, whichever is later.
