- 12 <u>This chapter relates to individuals with a criminal</u>
- 13 conviction obtaining a professional or occupational license.
- 14 <u>§ 4102. Definitions.</u>
- 15 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 18 "Certification." Nontransferable certification provided by a
- 19 licensing or certifying body to an applicant who is not
- 20 disqualified under section 4105 (relating to disqualifications).
- 21 "Lawful occupation." A course of conduct, pursuit or
- 22 profession that includes the sale of goods or services that are
- 23 not themselves illegal to sell regardless of whether the
- 24 individual selling the goods or services is subject to an
- 25 <u>occupational regulation</u>.
- 26 "Licensing or certifying body." The issuing body to whom an
- 27 individual has applied for a license or certification to conduct
- 28 or perform a lawful occupation or profession for which the
- 29 license or certification is required in this Commonwealth.
- 30 <u>"Occupational license." A nontransferable license issued by</u>

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1	a licensing or certifying body authorizing an individual who is
2	not disqualified under section 4105 to undertake a lawful
3	occupation for compensation.
4	"Specialty occupational license for medical reimbursement."
5	<u>A nontransferable license issued by a licensing or certifying</u>
6	body authorizing an individual who is not disqualified under
7	section 4105 to qualify for payment or reimbursement from an
8	agency operating in this Commonwealth for the nonexclusive
9	provision of medical services.
10	<u>§ 4103. Fundamental right.</u>
11	The right of an individual to pursue a lawful occupation is a
12	fundamental right, which shall include the following:
13	(1) The right of an individual with a criminal record to
14	petition the State to obtain a certification, occupational
15	license or specialty occupational license for medical
16	reimbursement.
17	(2) The right against the Commonwealth using an
18	individual's criminal record as an automatic bar to obtaining
19	<u>a State license or certification.</u>
20	<u>§ 4104. Petition.</u>
21	(a) General ruleAn individual with a criminal record may
22	petition a licensing or certifying body at any time, including
23	prior to obtaining required education or training, for a
24	determination of whether the individual's criminal record will
25	disqualify the individual from obtaining State recognition.
26	(b) Required informationThe individual shall include in
27	the petition under subsection (a) the individual's criminal
28	record. The individual may include additional information about
29	the individual's current circumstances, including the amount of
30	time since the offense, evidence of rehabilitation, testimonials

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1 and employment aspirations.

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2	(c) DeterminationThe following shall apply:
3	(1) Notwithstanding any other statute or rule, the
4	licensing or certifying body that received the individual's
5	petition under subsection (a) is authorized to determine
6	whether the individual's criminal record disqualifies the
7	individual from obtaining the requested license or
8	certification.
9	(2) The licensing or certifying body that received the
10	petition under paragraph (1) shall use the disqualifications
11	under section 4105 (relating to disqualifications) to
12	determine whether the individual is eligible for the license
13	or certification.
14	<u>§ 4105. Disqualifications.</u>
15	The licensing or certifying body shall approve an individual
16	unless the licensing or certifying body finds all of the
17	following:
18	(1) The individual's criminal record includes a
19	conviction for a felony or violent misdemeanor.
20	(2) The type of felony or violent misdemeanor for which
21	the individual was convicted is expressly codified as a
22	disqualifying offense in the relevant licensing or
23	certification statute.
24	(3) The licensing or certifying body concludes the State
25	has an important interest in protecting public safety that is
26	superior to the individual's right. The licensing or
27	certifying body may make this conclusion only if it
28	determines, by clear and convincing evidence at the time of
29	the petition, that:
30	(i) the specific offense for which the individual

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1	was convicted is substantially related to the State's
2	interest;
3	(ii) the individual, based on the nature of the
4	specific offense for which the individual was convicted
5	and the individual's current circumstances, is more
6	likely to reoffend by virtue of having the license than
7	if the individual did not have the license or
8	certification; and
9	<u>(iii) a subsequent offense will cause greater harm</u>
10	than the reoffense would if the individual did not have
11	the license or certification.
12	<u>§ 4106. Issuance of determination.</u>
13	The licensing or certifying body shall issue its
14	determination under this chapter within 90 days of receiving the
15	petition under section 4104 (relating to petition). The
16	determination shall be in writing and include a finding of facts
17	and a conclusion of law.
18	<u>§ 4107. Adverse determination.</u>
19	(a) RemedyIf the licensing or certifying body determines
20	the government's interest is superior to the individual's right,
21	the licensing or certifying body may advise the individual of
22	actions the individual may take to remedy the disqualification.
23	(b) Revised petitionThe individual may submit a revised
24	petition reflecting the completion of the remedies under
25	subsection (a) at any time after 90 days following the licensing
26	or certifying body's judgment.
27	(c) AppealAn individual may appeal a licensing or
28	certifying body's adverse determination under section 4106
29	(relating to issuance of determination) as provided by the
30	licensing or certifying body's rules and regulations regarding

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1 <u>appeals of determinations.</u>

2	(d) Time limitationThe individual may submit a new
3	petition to the licensing or certifying body at any time after
4	two years following a final judgment of the initial petition.
5	<u>§ 4108. Individual certification.</u>
6	(a) General ruleAn individual who has received
7	certification may use the term certified as a designated title.
8	(b) NoncertifiedAn individual who did not receive
9	certification may also perform the lawful occupation for
10	compensation but may not use the title certified.
11	<u>§ 4109. Rescind determination.</u>
12	The licensing or certifying body may rescind a determination
13	at any time if the individual is convicted of an additional
14	offense that the licensing or certifying body determines meets
15	the elements under section 4105 (relating to disqualifications).
16	<u>§ 4110. Prohibition.</u>
17	In an occupation for which a license is required, it is
18	<u>illegal for an individual who does not possess a valid</u>
19	occupational license to perform the occupation for compensation.
20	<u>§ 4111. Specialty occupational license for medical</u>
21	reimbursement.
22	(a) Recognition of credentialA private company may
23	recognize the specialty occupational license for medical
24	reimbursement.
25	(b) Provision of servicesNotwithstanding the specialty
26	occupational license for medical reimbursement, it shall be
27	legal for an individual who does not possess a license:
28	(1) that is regulated under a separate occupational
29	regulation to provide similar services as defined in that
30	statute for compensation and reimbursement; or

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1	(2) to provide the identified medical services for
2	compensation but the nonlicensed individual shall not qualify
3	for payment or reimbursement from a government agency.
4	<u>§ 4112. Fee.</u>
5	The licensing or certifying body may charge a fee to recoup
6	costs, not to exceed \$100 for each petition.
7	<u>§ 4113. Report.</u>
8	(a) General ruleThe Department of State shall compile an
9	annual report containing the following information:
10	(1) The number of applicants petitioning each licensing
11	or certifying body.
12	(2) The number of each licensing or certifying body's
13	approvals and denials.
14	(3) The type of offenses for which each licensing or
15	certifying body approved or denied a petition.
16	(4) Other data the Department of State determines is
17	necessary.
18	(b) Required informationEach licensing or certifying body
19	shall provide the information described under subsection (a) to
20	the Department of State at the department's request.
21	(c) Disclosure of reportThe Department of State shall
22	publish each report on the department's publicly accessible

29	<u>§ 4301. Definitions.</u>
30	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
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1	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
2	context clearly indicates otherwise:
3	"Licensing or certifying body." The issuing body to whom an
4	individual has applied for a license or certification to conduct
5	or perform a lawful occupation or profession for which the
6	license or certification is required in this Commonwealth.
7	"Occupational license." A nontransferable license issued by
8	a licensing or certifying body authorizing an individual who is
9	not disqualified under section 4105 (relating to
10	disqualifications) to undertake a lawful occupation for
11	compensation.
12	§ 4302. Fee waived.
13	<u>An individual who obtains an occupational license from a</u>
14	licensing or certifying body shall not be required to pay the
15	associated fee if the individual's household income is less than
16	200% of the Federal poverty line, as defined under section
17	<u>673(2) of Subtitle B of the Community Services Block Grant Act</u>
18	(Public Law 97-35, 95 Stat. 511), as adjusted from time to time.
19	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
