AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled
2	"An act relating to the finances of the State government;
3	providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for
4	ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint
5	Underwriting Association, for entertainment business
6	financial management firms, for private dam financial
7	assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for
8	the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes,
9	bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the
10	collection and recovery of fees and other money or property
11	due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
12	including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale,
13	the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds
14	and securities belonging to or in the possession of the
15	Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the
16	Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the
17	courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the
18	Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and
19	all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
20	moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
21	and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
22	authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
23	to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
24	section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
25	Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
26	certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
27	department, board, commission, and officer of the State
28	government, every political subdivision of the State, and
29	certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
30	association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
31	collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws

imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or 1 other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof, 2 every State depository and every debtor or creditor of the Commonwealth," in additional special funds and restricted 3 4 accounts, providing for COVID-19 response transfers for 5 6 assistance to the Commonwealth's volunteer service 7 organizations; and making an appropriation. 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 10 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, is amended by adding a section to read: 11 12 Section 1739-A.1. COVID-19 response transfers for assistance to the Commonwealth's emergency service organizations. 13 (a) Transfers. -- Notwithstanding any other provision of law 14 15 to the contrary, the Secretary of the Budget may transfer the sum of \$30,000,000 from funds received under the American Rescue 16 17 Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law 117-2, 135 Stat. 4) to assist the operations of the Commonwealth's emergency service 18 organizations. 19 (b) Deposit.--The funds transferred under subsection (a) 20 shall be deposited by the Secretary of the Budget into a 21 22 restricted account within the General Fund of the State Treasury_ 23 as necessary and is hereby appropriated to the Office of the State Fire Commissioner for the purpose of making grants under_ 24 25 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78 (relating to grants to fire companies and emergency medical services companies). The sum of \$22,000,000 26 27 shall be expended for the purpose of making grants to eligible 28 fire companies under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78 Subch. B (relating to Fire Company Grant Program). The sum of \$3,000,000 shall be 29 expended for the purpose of making grants to eligible emergency 30 31 services companies under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78 Subch. C (relating to 32 Emergency Medical Services Grant Program). 33 (c) Deficit.--The Secretary of the Budget may not make a

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1	transfer of funds if the transfer would result in a deficit in
2	any of the funds.
3	(d) (Reserved).
4	(e) Distribution of fundsThe State Fire Commissioner
5	shall distribute the funds to emergency service organizations
6	that received a grant under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78 Subch. C.1
7	(relating to COVID-19 crisis fire company and emergency medical
8	services grant program), but in accordance with the provisions
9	of 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78. To receive a grant under this subsection,
10	emergency service organizations must make application and
11	provide agreements as required under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78.
12	(f) ReportNo later than April 30, 2022, the Secretary of
13	the Budget, in consultation with the Office of State Fire
14	Commissioner, shall provide a report detailing all spending
15	related to the COVID-19 response the Commonwealth has made under
16	this section, including the name of each recipient of funds and
17	the dollar amount issued. The Secretary of the Budget shall
18	provide the report to the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of
19	the Senate, the Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the House
20	of Representatives, the chairperson and minority chairperson of
21	the Appropriations Committee of the Senate, the chairperson and
22	minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
23	House of Representatives, the chairperson and minority
24	chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness
25	Committee of the Senate and the chairperson and minority
26	chairperson of the Veterans Affairs and Emergency Preparedness
27	Committee of the House of Representatives.
28	(g) ExpirationThe authority to transfer funds under
29	subsection (a) shall expire on September 30, 2021.
30	(h) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following

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1	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
2	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
3	"COVID-19." The novel coronavirus as identified in the
4	Governor's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued on March 6,
5	<u>2020.</u>
6	"Eligible emergency service organization." An EMS company or
7	fire company as defined in 35 Pa.C.S. § 7802 (relating to
8	definitions) and which received a grant under 35 Pa.C.S. Ch. 78
9	Subch. C.1 (relating to COVID-19 Crisis Fire Company and
10	Emergency Medical Services Grant Program).
11	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
