## AN ACT

- Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and 2 3 duties as to licensing, providing for reports to coroners. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Article X of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, 8 No.21), known as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a 9 subarticle to read: 10 (e) Reports to Coroners 11 Section 1091. Reporting Required. -- Notwithstanding section 12 1218-B of the act of August 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as 13 "The County Code," an assisted living residence or personal care
- 15 residence or personal care home which occurs in the building or

home shall report each death of a patient of the assisted living

- 16 on the grounds of the assisted living residence or personal care
- 17 home to the coroner of the county in which the assisted living
- 18 residence or personal care home is located regardless of the
- 19 presumed cause of death. The following shall apply:

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- 1 (1) The report shall be made as soon as practicable after
- 2 the discovery of the death of the patient.
- 3 (2) The body of the patient shall not be moved from the
- 4 <u>location where it was discovered or released to a funeral home</u>
- 5 or crematorium prior to the authorization of the coroner.
- 6 <u>Section 1092. Request for Information.--The coroner under</u>
- 7 <u>section 1091 may request that the assisted living residence or</u>
- 8 personal care home provide information on the deceased patient,
- 9 including, but not limited to, the following:
- 10 (1) The presumed cause of death of the patient as stated by
- 11 the treating physician.
- 12 (2) All medical records of the patient.
- 13 (3) All incident reports involving the patient.
- 14 (4) Any known trauma experienced by the patient, regardless
- 15 of whether the trauma occurred before admittance into the
- 16 <u>assisted living residence or personal care home.</u>
- 17 Section 1093. Investigation. -- Upon receiving the information
- 18 under section 1091, if the coroner believes that anything seems
- 19 <u>unusual about the circumstances surrounding the death of the</u>
- 20 patient, the coroner may examine the body of the patient, review
- 21 the medical records of the patient or conduct a full
- 22 investigation as provided in Article XII-B of the act of August
- 23 9, 1955 (P.L.323, No.130), known as "The County Code."
- 24 Additionally, the coroner may request reports filed with any
- 25 government agency concerning incidents or complaints involving
- 26 the deceased patient, including the name of any individual who
- 27 <u>filed the complaint or report.</u>
- 28 Section 1094. Contact. -- An assisted living facility or
- 29 personal care home shall collect and maintain the name and
- 30 contact information for each patient's next of kin, which shall

- 1 <u>be updated annually, and shall make that information available</u>
- 2 <u>upon request of the coroner.</u>
- 3 <u>Section 1095. Procedures.--An assisted living residence or</u>
- 4 personal care home may develop procedures for the reporting of
- 5 <u>deaths which are not inconsistent with this subarticle.</u>
- 6 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
