AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An 1 act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for military-connected students. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an article to read: 11 12 ARTICLE XIII-F 13 MILITARY-CONNECTED STUDENTS Section 1301-F. Definitions. 14 15 The following words and phrases when used in this article 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 17 context clearly indicates otherwise: 18 "Department." The Department of Education of the 19 Commonwealth.

1	"Military-connected student." A student who is the dependent
2	of either an individual in the active military service of the
3	<u>United States or in a full-time status during active service</u>
4	with a force of the Pennsylvania National Guard.
5	"School." A school in a school district, charter school,
6	regional charter school, cyber charter school, intermediate unit
7	or career and technical school in this Commonwealth.
8	Section 1302-F. Purple-Star Schools.
9	(a) Designation The department shall designate a school
10	as a Purple-Star School if the school applies and qualifies for
11	the designation under this article. To qualify as a Purple-Star
12	School, a school must:
13	(1) Designate a staff member as a military liaison,
14	whose duties include:
15	(i) identifying military-connected students enrolled
16	at the school;
17	(ii) serving as the point of contact between the
18	school and military-connected students and their
19	<pre>families;</pre>
20	(iii) determining appropriate student services
21	available to military-connected students; and
22	(iv) assisting in coordinating programs relevant to
23	military-connected students.
24	(2) Maintain on the school district's publicly
25	accessible Internet website resources for military-connected
26	students and their families, including information regarding:
27	(i) relocation to, enrollment at, registration at
28	and transferring records to the school;
29	(ii) academic planning, course sequences and
30	advanced classes available at the school; and

1	(iii) counseling and other support services
2	available for military-connected students enrolled in the
3	school.
4	(3) Maintain a transition program led by students, if
5	appropriate, which assists military-connected students in
6	transitioning into the school.
7	(4) Offer professional development for staff members on
8	issues related to military-connected students.
9	(5) Offer at least one of the following initiatives:
10	(i) a resolution showing support for military-
11	connected students and their families;
12	(ii) recognition of the Month of the Military Child
13	or Military Family Month with relevant events hosted by
14	the school; or
15	(iii) a partnership with a local military
16	installation that provides opportunities for active duty
17	military members to volunteer at the school, speak at an
18	assembly or host a field trip.
19	(b) Regulations The department shall promulgate rules and
20	regulations as necessary to administer this section.
21	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
