## AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in other offenses, providing for the
- offense of failure to report death.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 7518. Failure to report death.
- 9 (a) Offense defined. -- Except as provided in subsection (b),
- 10 a person is quilty of a summary offense if, upon witnessing the
- 11 <u>death of an individual or discovering the body of an individual</u>
- 12 <u>the person knows or reasonably believes is dead, the</u> person
- 13 <u>fails to, in the most expeditious manner possible, notify a 911</u>
- 14 system, physician or other medical professional, law enforcement
- 15 <u>agency or funeral home.</u>
- 16 (b) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply to the
- 17 <u>following:</u>
- 18 (1) A person who knows or reasonably believes that a 911

- 1 system, physician or other medical professional, law
- 2 <u>enforcement agency or funeral home has been notified of the</u>
- 3 <u>death of the individual or discovery of the body of the</u>
- 4 <u>individual.</u>
- 5 (2) A child under 14 years of age.
- 6 (3) An individual with an intellectual disability acting
- 7 <u>under the direction of their parent, an individual residing</u>
- 8 <u>in the same household or an individual responsible for their</u>
- 9 <u>welfare.</u>
- 10 (c) Definition. -- As used in this section, the term "funeral
- 12 section 2(6) of the act of January 14, 1952 (1951 P.L.1898,
- 13 No.522), known as the Funeral Director Law.
- 14 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
