## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937
2	P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of
3	unemployment compensation to be administered by the
4	Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly
5	created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions)
6	selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to
7	keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay
8	contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the
9	payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons;
10	providing procedure and administrative details for the
11	determination, payment and collection of such contributions
12 13	and the payment of such compensation; providing for
13 14	cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; creating certain special funds in the custody of the State
14 15	Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," providing for State
16	extension of Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program; and
17	making an appropriation.

18	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
19	hereby enacts as follows:
20	Section 1. The act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937
21	P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, is
22	amended by adding an article to read:
23	ARTICLE XVI-A
24	STATE EXTENSION OF PANDEMIC

1	UNEMPLOYMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
2	Section 1601-A. Definitions.
3	The following words and phrases when used in this article
4	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
5	context clearly indicates otherwise:
6	"CARES Act." The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
7	<u>Security Act (Public Law 116-136, 134 Stat. 281).</u>
8	"COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious
9	disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus
10	2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan,
11	China.
12	"Eligible claimant." A resident of this Commonwealth who
13	would have qualified for benefits under the Pandemic
14	Unemployment Assistance Program as administered by the
15	Commonwealth.
16	"Pandemic Unemployment Assistance Program." The program
17	initially provided for under section 2102 of the CARES Act and
18	extended under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 (Public Law
19	<u>117-2, 135 Stat. 4).</u>
20	"Program." The Pandemic Unemployment Assistance State
21	Program established in section 1602-A.
22	Section 1602-A. Pandemic Unemployment Assistance State Program.
23	(a) Legislative intentIt is the intent of the General
24	Assembly to temporarily continue the Pandemic Unemployment
25	<u>Assistance Program as a State program in order to continue</u>
26	providing relief to Pennsylvanians experiencing unemployment due
27	to the COVID-19 pandemic.
28	(b) EligibilityAn individual shall be considered eligible
29	for the program for any week:
30	(1) The individual is considered a covered individual as

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1	defined in section 2102(a)(3) of the CARES Act (Public Law_
2	116-136, 134 Stat. 281) and provided for in subsection (d).
3	(2) The individual is unemployed, partially unemployed
4	or unable to work due to COVID-19.
5	(3) The individual is not entitled to any other
6	unemployment compensation as that term is defined in section
7	<u>85(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-</u>
8	514, 26 U.S.C. § 85(b)) or waiting period credit.
9	(c) Duration of benefits
10	(1) The program shall be available to an eligible
11	claimant for any week between the week ending September 11,
12	2021, and the week ending January 1, 2022.
13	(2) An eligible claimant under this article shall not be
14	eligible for more than 17 weeks of payments under the
15	program.
16	(d) Federal requirements and policies continued as State
17	programThe department shall administer the program using the
18	same requirements, guidelines and policies issued by the Federal
19	Government that controlled the Pandemic Unemployment Assistance
20	Program that were in effect at the expiration of the Pandemic
21	Unemployment Assistance Program on September 6, 2021.
22	(e) Employer charges
23	(1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act,
24	benefits payable to eligible claimants under this article
25	shall be solely payable from appropriations under section
26	<u>1603-A.</u>
27	(2) Benefits paid under this article shall not be
28	charged against the reserve account of an employer.
29	(3) An employer's experience rating shall not be changed
30	as a result of eligible claimants receiving benefits under

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1	this article.
2	(4) No employer shall be required to reimburse benefits
3	paid under this article.
4	Section 1603-A. Funding.
5	(a) AppropriationThe sum of \$1,200,000,000 is
6	appropriated to the department from the COVID-19 Response
7	Restricted Account from funds received by the Commonwealth under
8	<u>Title IX, Subtitle M, Section 9901 of the American Rescue Plan</u>
9	Act of 2021 (Public Law 117-2, 135 Stat. 4) for the purpose of
10	paying benefits and administering the program.
11	(b) LapsingThe appropriation under subsection (a) shall
12	<u>lapse on February 15, 2022.</u>
13	Section 1604-A. Expiration of program.
14	The following provisions relating to expiration of the
15	program and termination of benefits shall apply to this article:
16	(1) The last week of benefits that may be claimed by
17	eligible claimants under this article shall be the week
18	ending January 1, 2022.
19	(2) Eligible claimants may claim weeks for which they
20	are entitled to receive benefits until January 31, 2022. No
21	benefits under this article shall be paid after that date.
22	(3) If the amount of the appropriation under section
23	1603-A is fully expended, the program shall terminate as of
24	the date of the final expenditure. The department shall
25	submit a notice to the Legislative Reference Bureau
26	indicating the date of final expenditure and termination of
27	the program in accordance with this paragraph.
28	Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

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
