- 1 Providing for payment of delinquent Children's Health Insurance 2 Program premium balances.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Short title.
- 6 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Payment of
- 7 Delinquent Children's Health Insurance Program Premium Balances
- 8 Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Children's Health Insurance Program." The program for
- 14 comprehensive health care for uninsured children under Article
- 15 XXIII-A of the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known as
- 16 The Insurance Company Law of 1921.
- "Contractor." As defined in section 2301-A of The Insurance

- 1 Company Law of 1921.
- 2 "Department." The Department of Human Services of the
- 3 Commonwealth.
- 4 "Enrollee." An enrollee under Article XXIII-A of The
- 5 Insurance Company Law of 1921.
- 6 Section 3. Payment of delinquent premium balances.
- 7 (a) Request.--Notwithstanding section 111-C of the act of <--
- 8 April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), known as The Fiscal Code, a A <--
- 9 contractor may submit a written request to the department for
- 10 payment of delinquent Children's Health Insurance Program
- 11 premium balances of enrollees from Federal money received by the <--
- 12 Commonwealth through the Coronavirus State Fiscal Recovery Fund-
- 13 during any of the following periods:
- 14 (1) From March 1, 2020, to June 30, 2020.
- 15 (2) From July 1, 2020, to June 30, 2021.
- 16 (3) From July 1, 2021, to December 31, 2021.
- 17 (b) Forms.--The WITHIN 30 DAYS OF THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS <--
- 18 SECTION, THE department shall develop a form to be used by a
- 19 contractor requesting payment under this section. The following
- 20 apply:
- 21 (1) The form must require sufficient information for the
- department to verify the amount of the requested payment.
- 23 (2) If necessary, the department may require supporting

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- 24 documentation from the contractor.
- 25 (3) THE FORM MUST INCLUDE AN ATTESTATION THAT THE
- 26 CONTRACTOR RECEIVING PAYMENT UNDER THIS SECTION HAS NOT
- 27 RECEIVED AND WILL NOT SEEK PAYMENT OF DELINQUENT CHILDREN'S
- 28 HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM PREMIUM BALANCES FROM ENROLLEES FOR
- THE PERIODS UNDER SUBSECTION (A).
- 30 (c) Submittal. -- To be eligible to receive payment of

- 1 delinquent premium balances under this section, the contractor
- 2 must complete the form under subsection (b) and submit the form
- 3 to the department within 90 60 days of the effective date of

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- 4 this section in addition to any other supporting documentation
- 5 requested by the department for the purpose of verifying the
- 6 amount of the requested payment.
- 7 (d) Payment.--To the extent that money is available, the
- 8 department shall make payment to the contractor for the amount
- 9 of delinquent premium balances verified by the department in
- 10 accordance with this section.
- 11 (e) Certification and appropriation. --
- 12 (1) Within $\frac{120}{120}$ 90 days of the effective date of this
- 13 section, the department shall calculate the aggregate amount
- of contractor payment requests verified as accurate and
- 15 appropriate.
- 16 (2) The Secretary of the Budget shall certify to the
- General Assembly the calculation under paragraph (1).
- 18 (3) Money certified under paragraph (2) is appropriated <--
- to the department from the COVID-19 Response Restricted
- 20 Account THE DEPARTMENT SHALL USE MONEY APPROPRIATED FOR THE <--
- 21 CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM TO MAKE PAYMENTS IN THE
- 22 AMOUNT CERTIFIED UNDER PARAGRAPH (2) for the payment of
- 23 delinquent premium balances in accordance with this act.
- 24 Section 4. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 30 days IMMEDIATELY.
