AN ACT

- 1 Amending Titles 35 (Health and Safety) and 62 (Procurement) of
- the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in Commonwealth services, further providing for laws suspended during
- 4 emergency assignments; in general provisions, further
- 5 providing for public access to procurement records; and, in
- source selection and contract formation, further providing
- for emergency procurement.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. Section 7308(a) of Title 35 of the Pennsylvania
- 11 Consolidated Statutes is amended to read:
- 12 § 7308. Laws suspended during emergency assignments.
- 13 (a) Commonwealth agencies. -- In the case of a declaration of
- 14 a state of emergency by the Governor, Commonwealth agencies may
- 15 implement their emergency assignments without regard to
- 16 procedures required by other laws (except mandatory
- 17 constitutional requirements <u>and the requirements under 62</u>
- 18 Pa.C.S. (relating to procurement) pertaining to the performance
- 19 of public work, entering into contracts, incurring of
- 20 obligations, employment of temporary workers, rental of

- 1 equipment, purchase of supplies and materials and expenditures
- 2 of public funds.

- 4 Section 2. Sections 106.1(b)(6), (7) and (8) and 516 of
- 5 Title 62 are amended to read:
- 6 § 106.1. Public access to procurement records.
- 7 * * *
- 8 (b) Public posting and availability of procurement
- 9 information. -- The purchasing agency shall post the following
- 10 procurement documents on the department's or, in the case of an
- 11 independent agency, its own publicly accessible Internet website
- 12 or otherwise make available in the manner indicated below:
- 13 * * *
- 14 (6) The written determinations required by section [516]
- $\frac{516(g)}{516(F)}$ (relating to emergency procurement) shall be

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- 16 posted in advance, if feasible, but no later than seven
- 17 calendar days after authorization by the department or
- independent purchasing agency.
- 19 (7) A contract resulting from a procurement under this
- part or, in the case of section 516(f) 516(E), an invoice,
- 21 shall be posted as soon as practicable upon its full
- 22 execution by the Commonwealth.
- 23 (8) Requests under section 515 or 516 to extend a
- 24 contract for which no further options, renewals or extensions
- are available in the contract shall be posted for seven
- 26 calendar days for public comment prior to approval of the
- 27 request by the department or independent purchasing agency.
- Upon approval of a request by the department or an
- 29 independent purchasing agency, the signed and written
- determination required under section 515(b) or [516] $\frac{516(g)}{}$ <--

- 516(F) shall be posted.

- 3 § 516. Emergency procurement.
- 4 [The head of a purchasing agency may make or authorize others

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- 5 to make an emergency procurement when there exists a threat to
- 6 public health, welfare or safety or circumstances outside the
- 7 control of the agency create an urgency of need which does not
- 8 permit the delay involved in using more formal competitive
- 9 methods. Whenever practical, in the case of a procurement of a
- 10 supply, at least two quotes shall be solicited. A written
- 11 determination of the basis for the emergency and for the
- 12 selection of the particular contractor shall be included in the
- 13 procurement file. No written contract may be required. The
- 14 supplier of the supply, service or construction may be paid
- 15 based on the emergency approval and approved invoice.]
- 16 (a) Authorization. -- The head of a purchasing agency may make
- 17 an emergency procurement for supply, service or construction
- 18 under this section.
- 19 (b) Requests by Commonwealth agencies. -- For an emergency
- 20 procurement in which the department acts as the agent for a
- 21 Commonwealth agency, the Secretary of General Services may only
- 22 make an emergency procurement upon the written request of the
- 23 head of the Commonwealth agency.
- 24 (c) Approval by committee. If an emergency procurement is <--
- 25 valued at more than \$1,000,000, the head of a purchasing agency
- 26 may only make an emergency procurement upon approval by the
- 27 <u>Emergency Procurement Approval Committee established under</u>
- 28 subsection (h). Upon receipt of a request for an emergency
- 29 procurement from the head of a purchasing agency, including a
- 30 copy of all written determinations under subsection (g) and any

- 1 other information requested by the committee, the committee
- 2 shall approve the request if the request meets the requirements
- 3 under this section.
- 4 (C) Emergencies.--The head of a purchasing agency may <--
- 5 only make an emergency procurement when all of the following
- 6 <u>occur:</u>
- 7 (1) There exists a threat to public health, welfare or
- 8 safety.
- 9 (2) There exist circumstances outside the control of the
- 10 <u>purchasing agency.</u>
- 11 (3) The circumstances under paragraph (2) create an
- 12 <u>urgency of need which does not permit the delay involved in</u>
- 13 <u>using an alternate and otherwise applicable competitive</u>
- 14 <u>method</u>.
- (e) (D) Quotes.--The head of a purchasing agency shall <--
- 16 solicit no fewer than two quotes for an emergency procurement,
- 17 unless the head of the purchasing agency determines, in writing,
- 18 that the circumstances of the emergency specified under
- 19 subsection (d) (C) make the solicitation of no fewer than two
- 20 quotes impractical.
- 21 (f) (E) Invoices.--The head of a purchasing agency may <--
- 22 authorize the payment of the consideration for the supply,
- 23 service or construction for an emergency procurement based on an
- 24 approved invoice if the head of the purchasing agency
- 25 determines, in writing, that the circumstances of the emergency
- 26 under subsection (d) (C) make the use of a contract impractical. <--
- 27 (F) Written determinations. -- In making an emergency <--
- 28 procurement, the head of a purchasing agency shall make the
- 29 <u>following written determinations and shall include the written</u>
- 30 determinations in the procurement file:

1	(1) The basis for the emergency under subsection (d)	<
2	(C). A declaration of disaster emergency under 35 Pa.C.S. §	<
3	7301(c) (relating to general authority of Governor) may not	
4	serve as the written determination of the basis for the	
5	emergency.	
6	(2) How the emergency identified under paragraph (1)	
7	creates an urgency of need which does not permit the delay	
8	involved in using an alternate and otherwise applicable	
9	competitive method.	
10	(3) The basis for the selection of the contractor.	
11	(4) If applicable, a written determination under	
12	subsection (e) (D).	<
13	(5) If applicable, a written determination under	
14	subsection (f) (E).	<
15	(h) Emergency Procurement Approval Committee.	<
16	(1) The Emergency Procurement Approval Committee is	
17	established within the department. The committee shall be	
18	<pre>comprised of the following members:</pre>	
19	(i) One individual appointed by the Governor.	
20	(ii) One individual appointed by the President pro-	
21	tempore of the Senate.	
22	(iii) One individual appointed by the Majority	
23	<u>Leader of the Senate.</u>	
24	(iv) One individual appointed by the Minority Leader	=
25	of the Senate.	
26	(v) One individual appointed by the Speaker of the	
27	House.	
28	(vi) One individual appointed by the Majority Leader	=
29	of the House of Representatives.	
30	(vii) One individual appointed by the Minority	

1	Leader of the House of Representatives.
2	(2) Members of the committee shall serve at the pleasure
3	of the appointing authority under paragraph (1).
4	(3) The member appointed under paragraph (1) (i) shall
5	serve as chair.
6	(4) A meeting of the committee shall be called by the
7	chair or upon the request of at least two members of the
8	<u>committee.</u>
9	(5) The consent of at least four members of the
10	committee shall be required for an approval under subsection
11	(c). If the committee does not vote to approve a request
12	within 48 hours of the committee receiving a copy of all
13	written determinations under subsection (g), the request
14	shall be deemed disapproved.
15	Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
