9	hereby enacts as follows:
10	Section 1. Section 2601-K of the act of March 10, 1949
11	(P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is
12	amended by adding definitions to read:
13	Section 2601-K. Definitions.
14	The following words and phrases when used in this article
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:

18	"Kinship care." The care of a child by a relative or other
19	kinship caregiver of the child who has an established

1	relationship with the child when the biological or custodial
2	parents of the child cannot care for the child.
3	"Kinship caregiver." An individual who has an established
4	relationship with a child and assumes legal responsibility for
5	the child. The term includes any of the following:
6	(1) A grandparent of the child.
7	(2) An aunt or uncle of the child.
8	(3) A family friend of the child.
9	(4) Any other relative or individual that legally
10	assumes responsibility for the child.

12	Section 2. Sections 2602-K(c) and 2603-K(b)(2) and (3) of
13	the act are amended to read:
14	Section 2602-K. Fostering independence waiver program.

16	(c) EligibilityIn order to receive a fostering
17	independence waiver under this section, an individual must [be a
18	current resident of this Commonwealth and eligible for the
19	Pennsylvania Chafee Education and Training Grant Program under
20	the Foster Care Independence Act of 1999 (Public Law 106-169,
21	113 Stat. 1822) as administered by the Department of Human
22	Services and must have applied for all available Federal and
23	State grants.]:
24	(1) Be a current resident of this Commonwealth.
25	(2) Be either of the following:
26	(i) Eligible for the Pennsylvania Chafee Education
27	and Training Grant Program under the Foster Care
28	Independence Act of 1999 (Public Law 106-169, 113 Stat.
29	1822) as administered by the Department of Human
30	<u>Services.</u>

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1	(ii) Under the care of a kinship caregiver and would
2	have been eligible for the Pennsylvania Chafee Education
3	and Training Grant Program if not under kinship care.

9	(b) Duties of institutions of higher educationEach
10	institution of higher education shall do all of the following:

12	(2) Disseminate the information prepared under
13	subsection (a)(1) to recipients of a Pennsylvania Chafee
14	Education and Training Grant under the Foster Care
15	Independence Act of 1999 (Public Law 106-169, 113 Stat. 1822)
16	who are individuals eligible under section 2602-K(c) <u>and all</u>
17	other individuals who are eligible under section 2602-K(c)
18	and post the information prepared under subsection (a)(1) on
19	the institution's publicly accessible Internet website.
20	(3) To improve retention, report to the department by
21	June 30, 2021, and June 30 each year thereafter all of the
22	following:
23	(i) The number of students receiving a Pennsylvania
24	Chafee Education and Training Grant under the Foster Care
25	Independence Act of 1999.
26	(ii) The number of students who apply for the
27	program.
28	(iii) The number of students participating in the
29	program.
30	(iv) The retention rates of students participating
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in the program.

2 (v) The number of students who are participating in
3 the program and have unmet financial need.

4 (vi) Recommendations on how to improve outreach to
5 students who are or are potentially eligible for the
6 program.

7 (vii) Recommendations on ways in which to improve
8 the delivery of services to students who are eligible
9 under section 2602-K(c).

10 (viii) Impediments to retaining students who are 11 eligible under section 2602-K(c).

12(ix) The number of students in kinship care who are13participating in the program.

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Section 3. Section 2605-K of the act is amended by adding a paragraph to read:

17 Section 2605-K. Report.

18 In order to determine and maximize the effectiveness of this 19 article, the department, in conjunction with the Department of 20 Human Services, shall collect information provided from 21 institutions of higher education under section 2603-K(b)(3) and prepare an anonymized report to be submitted by August 31, 2021, 22 23 and by August 31 of each year thereafter, to the chair and 24 minority chair of the Education Committee of the Senate, the 25 chair and minority chair of the Education Committee of the House 26 of Representatives, the chair and minority chair of the Health and Human Services Committee of the Senate and the chair and 27 minority chair of the Children and Youth Committee of the House 28 29 of Representatives that contains all of the following:
