AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9	Amending the act of November 26, 1978 (P.L.1375, No.325), entitled "An act providing for the regulation and safety of dams and reservoirs, water obstructions and encroachments; consolidating and clarifying the programs of the Department of Environmental Resources and Navigation Commission for the Delaware River; establishing penalties and repealing certain acts," further providing for definitions; providing for county programs for removing obstructions and flood-related hazards on streams; and making an editorial change.
10	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
11	hereby enacts as follows:
12	Section 1. The definition of "department" in section 3 of
13	the act of November 26, 1978 (P.L.1375, No.325), known as the
14	Dam Safety and Encroachments Act, is amended and the section is
15	amended by adding definitions to read:
16	Section 3. Definitions.
17	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
18	have, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, the
19	meanings given to them in this section:
20	* * *

1	"Department." The Department of Environmental [Resources]
2	Protection of the Commonwealth [of Pennsylvania].
3	"Drainage area." An area, measured by a horizontal plane and
4	enclosed by a topographical divide, from which direct surface
5	runoff from precipitation normally drains by gravity into a
6	stream above a specified point.
7	* * *
8	"Regional curve." A regression of the relations among
9	drainage areas, selected cross-sectional parameters and
10	streamflows.
11	* * *
12	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
13	Section 17.1. County programs for removing obstructions and
14	flood-related hazards on streams.
15	<u>(a) A county may develop a program to provide two regional</u>
16	curves for the watershed to cover the entire county in
17	accordance with this section. The first regional curve shall be
18	for rural areas, and the second regional curve shall be for
19	portions of streams located in municipalities.
20	(b) A county, in consultation with the county conservation
21	district, shall submit a written notification to the department
22	that describes the program developed under subsection (a). The
23	written notification shall specify the utilization and oversight
24	of the regional curves for the purpose of stream maintenance
25	under the program in accordance with the regulations promulgated
26	under subsection (f). The written notification shall specify the
27	watercourses, water obstructions, appurtenant works and
28	encroachments that the county will maintain, inspect and monitor
29	under the program. The county may not implement the program
30	unless the county conservation district is a signatory to the

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1 written notification.

2	(c) After receiving the written notification under	
3	subsection (b), the department shall conduct at least one annual	
4	follow-up review of the county's program under subsection (a) to	
5	determine the overall effectiveness of the program and the	
6	county's compliance with the specifications of the written	
7	notification and regulations promulgated under subsection (f).	
8	(d) The department shall develop a training program for	
9	county conservation districts, counties, municipal equipment	
10	operators and contractors operating as agents of the counties	
11	for conducting channel maintenance for the purpose of a program	
12	developed under subsection (a). The training program shall	
13	include all of the following:	
14	(1) An overview of stream processes.	
15	(2) An explanation of regional curves and the use of	
16	regional curves in the processes.	
17	(3) An overview of permits issued by the department and	
18	utilized for conducting channel maintenance.	
19	(4) A field exercise in laying out a project.	
20	(5) A field exercise in the completion of a project.	
21	(e) Upon completion of the training program under subsection	
22	(d), a county conservation district may authorize emergency	
23	permits to persons operating within a program developed under	
24	subsection (a) in accordance with the written notification under	
25	subsection (b).	
26	(f) The Environmental Quality Board, in consultation with	
27	the department and county conservation districts, shall	
28	promulgate regulations for the removal of obstructions and	
29	flood-related hazards on streams by counties, municipal	
30	equipment operators and contractors operating as agents of the	
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- 1 counties. In developing the regulations, the Environmental
- 2 Quality Board may consider existing county programs for the same
- 3 <u>or similar purpose.</u>
- 4 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
