AN ACT

Amending the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), 1 entitled "An act providing for victims' rights; imposing 2 penalties; establishing remedies; establishing the Office of 3 Victim Advocate, the Bureau of Victims' Services, the Victims' Services Advisory Committee, the State Offender Supervision Fund and other funds; and making repeals," in 5 preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions; 7 and, in compensation, further providing for persons eligible 8 for compensation. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 10 11 hereby enacts as follows: 12 Section 1. The definition of "out-of-pocket loss" in section 13 103 of the act of November 24, 1998 (P.L.882, No.111), known as the Crime Victims Act, is amended to read: 14 Section 103. Definitions. 15 16 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 17 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 18 context clearly indicates otherwise: 19 20 "Out-of-pocket loss." The term includes the following losses

21 which shall be reimbursed at a rate set by the Office of

- 1 Victims' Services:
- 2 (1) expenses for unreimbursed and unreimbursable
- 3 expenses or indebtedness incurred for medical care,
- 4 nonmedical remedial care and treatment as approved by the
- 5 Office of Victims' Services or other services;
- 6 (2) expenses for counseling, prosthetic devices,
- 7 wheelchairs, canes, walkers, hearing aids, eyeglasses or
- 8 other corrective lenses or dental devices reasonably
- 9 necessary as a result of the crime upon which the claim is
- 10 based and for which the claimant either has paid or is
- 11 liable;
- 12 (3) expenses related to the reasonable and necessary
- 13 costs of cleaning the crime scene of a private residence.
- "Cleaning" means to remove or attempt to remove stains or
- 15 blood caused by the crime or other dirt or debris caused by
- the processing of the crime scene;
- 17 (4) expenses resulting from the temporary or permanent
- 18 relocation of a direct victim and individuals residing in the
- 19 household of the direct victim due to the incident forming
- 20 the basis of the victim's claim when there is an immediate
- 21 need to protect the safety and health of the victim and
- individuals residing in the household, as verified by a
- 23 medical provider, human services provider or law enforcement;
- 24 (5) expenses for physical examinations and materials
- 25 used to obtain evidence; or
- 26 (6) other reasonable expenses which are deemed necessary
- as a direct result of the criminal incident.
- 28 Except as otherwise provided, the term does not include
- 29 [property damage or] pain and suffering.

- 9 <u>(i) Real property.</u>
- 10 <u>(ii)</u> Rental property.

- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
