2 3 4	Consolidated Statutes, in miscellaneous provisions relating to inmate confinement, providing for trauma-informed care and training.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
8	Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
9	§ 5908. Trauma-informed care and training.
10	(a) Trauma-informed care requirements
11	(1) The department shall provide all incarcerated
12	individuals and detainees quality trauma-informed care as
13	specified by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services
14	Administration of the United States Department of Health and
15	<u>Human Services.</u>
16	(2) Trauma-informed care for an individual shall begin
17	immediately upon the individual's intake and assessment at a
18	correctional institution.

- 1 (b) Correctional staff training. -- Correctional staff shall
- 2 have no fewer than 16 hours of professional education related to
- 3 trauma-informed care, which shall include the following:
- 4 <u>(1) An overview of trauma-informed care.</u>
- 5 (2) The basic skills of trauma-informed care.
- 6 (3) Recognizing vicarious and secondary trauma for
- 7 <u>caregivers and custodians.</u>
- 8 <u>(4) Cultural sensitivity.</u>
- 9 <u>(5) Identifying the signs, symptoms and effects of</u>
- 10 trauma.
- 11 (6) Interacting with an individual who has experienced
- 12 <u>trauma.</u>
- 13 (7) Mitigating the symptoms and effects of trauma.
- 14 (8) Referring an individual with trauma to an
- 15 <u>appropriate health care professional.</u>
- 16 (c) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 17 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 18 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 19 "Correctional staff." An individual who works with
- 20 incarcerated individuals on a regular basis. The term includes,
- 21 <u>but is not limited to, any of the following:</u>
- 22 (1) Medical staff.
- 23 (2) A correctional officer.
- 24 <u>(3)</u> A mentor.
- 25 (4) An educational instructor.
- 26 "Trauma." Any disturbing experience that results in
- 27 <u>significant fear, helplessness, dissociation, confusion or other</u>
- 28 disruptive feelings intense enough to have a long-lasting
- 29 negative effect on an individual's attitudes, behavior and other
- 30 aspects of functioning.

- 1 <u>"Trauma-informed care."</u> An organizational structure and
- 2 treatment framework that involves understanding, recognizing and
- 3 responding to the effects of all types of trauma.
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
