A RESOLUTION

- Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a study of crimes committed on public secondary school grounds throughout this Commonwealth.
- 4 WHEREAS, Schools in this Commonwealth should be a safe haven
- 5 for teaching and learning, free of crime and violence; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Any instance of crime or violence at school affects
- 7 the individuals involved and may also disrupt the educational
- 8 process; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Reporting school crime and safety is necessary to
- 10 ensuring the safety of our students; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Public school districts, intermediate units, area
- 12 career and technical schools and charter schools are required to
- 13 file annual school violence statistics and reports with the
- 14 Department of Education's Office for Safe Schools no later than
- 15 July 31 of each year; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Accurately reported school violence data is used for
- 17 identification of criminal patterns and early identification of
- 18 trends and related red flags in schools so that school and

- 1 safety officials can take appropriate action; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Is it critical that these reports and discussions
- 3 are accurate to ensure the public confidence of a public school
- 4 district, intermediate unit, area career and technical school
- 5 and charter school; therefore be it
- 6 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 7 State Government Commission to conduct a study of crimes
- 8 committed on public secondary school grounds throughout this
- 9 Commonwealth and issue a report of its findings and
- 10 recommendations to the House of Representatives; and be it
- 11 further
- 12 RESOLVED, That, at a minimum, the report shall include:
- 13 (1) information on the current state of school crime and
- safety across this Commonwealth to ensure safety of our
- 15 students;
- 16 (2) topics such as victimization, teacher injury,
- 17 bullying and electronic bullying, school conditions, fights,
- 18 weapons, availability and student use of drugs and alcohol
- and student perceptions of personal safety at school;
- 20 (3) data on crimes that occur away from school offered
- as a point of comparison where available;
- 22 (4) information on the best course of action for
- reporting school violence statistics and methods of reporting
- 24 that are not effective; and
- 25 (5) best practices in utilizing school safety data to
- 26 make data-driven decisions;
- 27 and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, as part
- 29 of its study, establish an advisory committee within three
- 30 months of the adoption of this resolution consisting of all of

- 1 the following members:
- 2 (1) The Secretary of Corrections or a designee.
- 3 (2) The Secretary of Education or a designee.
- 4 (3) The Secretary of Human Services or a designee.
- 5 (4) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania Commission on 6 Crime and Delinquency or a designee.
- 7 (5) A representative from the Pennsylvania Association 8 of School Administrators.
- 9 (6) A representative from the Pennsylvania Education Law 10 Center.
- 11 (7) A representative from the Pennsylvania Juvenile Law
 12 Center.
- 13 (8) A representative from the Pennsylvania School Board
 14 Association.
- 15 (9) Representatives from other departments or agencies
 16 of the Commonwealth or other entities that the Joint State
 17 Government Commission deems appropriate in conducting the
 18 study;
- 19 and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, in
- 21 collaboration with the advisory committee, submit a report of
- 22 the Joint State Government Commission's findings, along with any
- 23 statutory or regulatory recommendations, to the General Assembly
- 24 within 18 months of the adoption of this resolution.
