A RESOLUTION

Encouraging the Pennsylvania Continuing Legal Education Board to mandate one ethics continuing legal education credit and the Continuing Judicial Education Board of Judges to mandate one 2 3 continuing judicial education credit on diversity, equity and 4 inclusion for every active lawyer, judge and justice in this 5 Commonwealth. 6 7 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania Continuing Legal Education (PACLE) Board is a permanent program adopted by the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania establishing minimum requirements for continuing 10 legal education for Pennsylvania lawyers; and WHEREAS, The program was established by an order of the 11 12 Supreme Court dated January 7, 1992, and is administered by the 13 PACLE Board; and WHEREAS, The public properly expects that lawyers, in the 14 15 practice of law, will maintain certain standards of professional 16 competence and ethical behavior; and 17 WHEREAS, The requirement for continuing legal education was established to ensure that, throughout their careers, lawyers 18 19 admitted to practice in this Commonwealth remain current regarding the law and maintain the requisite knowledge and skill 20

- 1 necessary to fulfill their professional responsibilities; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Lawyers who became admitted to practice law in
- 3 Pennsylvania on or after July 1, 1992, must complete a program
- 4 of continuing legal education as provided by the rules and
- 5 regulations of the PACLE Board; and
- 6 WHEREAS, An active lawyer is a member in good standing of the
- 7 bar of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania who is not an active or
- 8 senior member of the judiciary; and
- 9 WHEREAS, The Supreme Court also adopted continuing judicial
- 10 education requirements for judges and justices serving the
- 11 Supreme, Commonwealth and Superior courts, as well as the Courts
- 12 of Common Pleas, the Philadelphia Municipal Court and certified
- 13 senior judges of each; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Formalized education programs help judges and
- 15 justices stay abreast of changes in law, procedure, behavioral
- 16 science, technological advancement and legal circumstances
- 17 unique to Pennsylvania; and
- 18 WHEREAS, A Supreme Court order outlining judicial education
- 19 requirements established the Pennsylvania Continuing Judicial
- 20 Education Board of Judges (PACJEB) comprised of judges from
- 21 courts impacted by the new policy, among others, and reflecting
- 22 the diversity of Pennsylvania's judiciary, including court size
- 23 and divisional assignment; and
- 24 WHEREAS, The PACLE Board has acknowledged the critical
- 25 importance of diversity in the legal profession and justice
- 26 system; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The educational process is fundamentally important
- 28 to advancing diversity and eliminating bias; therefore be it
- 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives encourage the
- 30 Pennsylvania Continuing Legal Education Board to mandate one

- 1 ethics continuing legal education credit and the Pennsylvania
- 2 Continuing Judicial Education Board of Judges to mandate one
- 3 continuing judicial education credit on diversity, equity and
- 4 inclusion for every active lawyer, judge and justice in this
- 5 Commonwealth.
