A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 2	Establishing the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of
4	Veterans Affairs, the projected veteran population nationwide is
5	18,000,000, with women making up an estimated 8% of that
6	population; and
7	WHEREAS, The United States Census Bureau estimates the
8	percentage of female veterans between 2010 and 2040 will
9	increase from 9% in 2010 to 17% in 2040; and
10	WHEREAS, According to the United States Department of
11	Veterans Affairs, as of September 2018, this Commonwealth was
12	home to approximately 836,000 veterans, including 615,000
13	wartime veterans from World War II through the Gulf War; and
14	WHEREAS, Females comprise approximately 46,000 of the wartime
15	veterans; and
16	WHEREAS, The number of women veterans will increase with the

end of Operation Iraqi Freedom and Operation Enduring Freedom;
 and

3 WHEREAS, Women veterans often face unique challenges in 4 transitioning from active duty to civilian life; and 5 WHEREAS, The challenging needs facing women veterans can 6 often be overlooked when providing services to a large veteran 7 population; and

8 WHEREAS, Ensuring the availability of specialized services 9 for physical and mental health, including treatment of post-10 traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, military 11 sexual trauma and alcohol and substance abuse, tailored to the 12 specific needs of women veterans is essential to ensure that our 13 returning veterans receive proper care; and

14 WHEREAS, Establishing a task force to study the issues facing 15 women veterans and to make recommendations to the Governor and 16 the General Assembly will provide much-needed information and 17 insight from those who address the issues on a daily basis; 18 therefore be it

19 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly 20 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania establish the Task Force on 21 Women Veterans' Health Care; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care consist of 17 members who shall be appointed as follows within 24 25 days after the adoption of this resolution by both chambers:

(1) Two members of the Senate, one appointed by the
President pro tempore and one appointed by the Minority
Leader of the Senate.

(2) Two members of the House of Representatives, one
appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and
one appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of

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1 Representatives.

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2 (3) Thirteen members appointed by the Governor as3 follows:

4 (i) the Deputy Adjutant General for Veterans Affairs
5 of the Pennsylvania National Guard;

6 (ii) the Secretary of Health;

(iii) the Secretary of Human Services;

8 (iv) the Secretary of Drug and Alcohol Programs;

9 (v) four women veterans who are residents of this
10 Commonwealth;

(vi) a representative from the health care provider community in this Commonwealth who has experience in providing health care to returning women veterans;

14 (vii) a representative from the Commonwealth's 15 mental health care provider community with experience in 16 providing mental health care treatment to returning women 17 veterans;

18 (viii) a representative from the Commonwealth's 19 substance abuse and addiction treatment provider 20 community with experience in providing substance abuse 21 and addiction treatment to returning women veterans;

(ix) a representative from a Commonwealth advocacy
group that represents the interests of sexual assault
victims with experience in providing services to women
veterans who have suffered military sexual trauma,
including harassment or abuse;

27 (x) a representative from a county veteran's court;28 and

29 (xi) the chairman of the State Veterans' Commission;30 and be it further

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RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care
 study the health care needs of women veterans, including:

3 (1) quality of and access to mental health services,
4 including services and treatment for post-traumatic stress
5 disorder and traumatic brain injury;

6

(2) in-patient treatment availability;

7 (3) adequacy and availability of appropriate women
8 veterans' health care within the Federal health care system
9 and this Commonwealth; and

10 (4) adequacy, quality of and access to services 11 providing for the identification and treatment of military 12 sexual trauma, including sexual harassment or abuse; 13 and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care identify other needs relating to the provisions of women veterans' health care services and make recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor to address those needs; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care 20 consult with Federal, State and local entities in completing the 21 study, including:

22 (1) The Pennsylvania Congressional Delegation.

23 (2) The United States Department of Veterans Affairs.

24 (3) The County Commissioners Association of

25 Pennsylvania.

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26 (4) The Pennsylvania Municipal League.

(5) The Pennsylvania Medical Society.

(6) The Hospital and Healthsystem Association ofPennsylvania.

1 associations that advocate for women veterans; 2 and be it further RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care 3 elect one of its members to serve as chairperson; and be it 4 5 further RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care 6 7 conduct its business as follows: 8 (1)The physical presence of nine members constitutes a 9 quorum of the task force. 10 (2) Action of the task force shall be authorized or 11 ratified by a majority vote of its members. 12 A member not physically present may participate by (3) 13 teleconference or video conference. 14 The following shall apply: (4) 15 (i) The task force shall meet as necessary, but no 16 fewer than five times prior to September 30, 2022. 17 Additional meetings may be called by the chairperson as 18 necessary. 19 The chairperson shall schedule a meeting upon (ii) 20 written request of eight members of the task force. 21 The first meeting shall be convened within 45 (iii) 22 days of the adoption of this resolution by both chambers 23 at a time and place established by the Governor. 24 The task force shall hold public hearings as (iv) 25 necessary to obtain the information required to conduct 26 its review. 27 (v) Members may not receive compensation but shall 28 be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses 29 incurred in service of the task force; and be it further 30

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RESOLVED, That the Department of Health and the Department of
 Military and Veterans Affairs provide staff support to the task
 force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, upon request of the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care, a State agency assist the task force in the completion of its duties, including, to the extent permitted by law relating to confidentiality, furnishing information and advice to members of the task force necessary to perform their duties; and be it further

10 RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care 11 have the following powers:

12 (1) To examine and analyze the current delivery of
13 health care services to women veterans at the Federal and
14 State level.

15 (2) To review and analyze law, procedures, practices and 16 rules relating to delivery of health care services to women 17 veterans.

18 (3) To hold public hearings for the taking of testimony19 and the requesting of documents.

20 (4) To administer oaths and affirmations to witnesses
21 appearing before the task force at the request of the
22 chairperson;

23 and be it further

24 RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care
25 have the following duties:

26 (1) To accept and review written comments from27 individuals and organizations.

(2) To make, by September 30, 2022, a final report to
the Governor, the Senate and the House of Representatives.
(3) To include in the report under paragraph (2)

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1 recommendations to:

2 (i) improve the delivery of health care services to
3 women veterans; and

4 (ii) implement necessary changes in State statutes
5 and practices, policies and procedures relating to the
6 delivery of health care services to women veterans.

(4) To make reports as follows:

8 (i) The task force may file status reports and 9 updates with the Governor, the Senate and the House of 10 Representatives as it deems appropriate.

(ii) A report under this paragraph shall be adoptedat a public meeting.

(iii) A report under this paragraph shall be a
public record under the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6,
No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law;

16 and be it further

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17 RESOLVED, That the Task Force on Women Veterans' Health Care 18 expire October 31, 2022; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be transmitted to 20 the President of the United States, the Secretary of Veterans 21 Affairs, presiding officers of each house of Congress and each 22 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.

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
