## AN ACT

13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. Section 1709-B(a) of the act of March 4, 1971
16	(P.L.6, No.2), known as the Tax Reform Code of 1971, is amended
17	to read:
18	Section 1709-B. Limitation on Credits(a) The total
19	amount of credits approved by the department shall not exceed
20	[fifty-five million dollars (\$55,000,000)] <u>one hundred million</u>
21	dollars (\$100,000,000) in any fiscal year. Of that amount,
22	[eleven million dollars (\$11,000,000)] <u>twenty million dollars</u>
23	(\$20,000,000) shall be allocated exclusively for small

1	businesses. However, if the total amounts allocated to either
2	the group of applicants exclusive of small businesses or the
3	group of small business applicants is not approved in any fiscal
4	year, the unused portion will become available for use by the
5	other group of qualifying taxpayers.

4	"Qualified business venture." A business that is all of the
5	<u>following:</u>
6	(1) Headquartered or that will establish its
7	headquarters in this Commonwealth prior to the time the
8	taxpayer is eligible to apply for the tax credit.
9	(2) Maintains its headquarters in this Commonwealth for
10	at least five years after the taxpayer applied for the tax
11	<u>credit.</u>
12	(3) Where at least 51% of its employees are employed in
13	this Commonwealth at the time the taxpayer applies for the
14	<u>tax credit.</u>
15	(4) Has fewer than 100 employees at the time the

20	(6) Has not received more than \$2,000,000, in the

23	"Qualified investment." A payment of money or its equivalent
24	for a private equity interest in a qualified business venture.
25	"Qualified tax liability." The liability for taxes imposed
26	under Article III, IV or VI. The term shall include the
27	liability for taxes imposed under Article III on an owner of a
28	pass-through entity.
29	"Secretary." The Secretary of Community and Economic
30	Development of the Commonwealth.

1	"Tax credit." The Angel Investment Tax Credit authorized
2	under this article.
3	"Taxpayer." A person subject to tax under Article III, IV or
4	VI. The term shall include the shareholder, owner or member of a
5	pass-through entity that receives an Angel Investment Tax
6	<u>Credit.</u>
7	<u>Section 1703-M. Establishment.</u>
8	There is established a tax credit program to be known as the
9	Angel Investment Tax Credit. The program shall:
10	(1) Create a business environment that attracts and
11	encourages early-stage financing for businesses with the
12	potential for high growth.
13	(2) Increase capital investment.
14	(3) Encourage job creation.
15	Section 1704-M. Qualified business plans.
16	In order for a business plan to be qualified, the business
17	plan shall:
18	(1) Indicate the potential for increasing jobs in this
19	Commonwealth.
20	(2) Indicate the potential for increasing capital
21	investment in this Commonwealth.
22	(3) Specify that the plan is based upon the development
23	or commercialization of intellectual property for which
24	either of the following apply:
25	(i) patent protection under 35 U.S.C. (relating to
26	patents) has been secured or is pending; or
27	(ii) a copyright under 17 U.S.C. (relating to
28	copyrights) has been secured or is pending.
29	Section 1705-M. Credit for qualified investment.
30	(a) ApplicationA taxpayer that made a qualified

1	investment in a taxable year may apply for a tax credit. The
2	application shall be on a form as required by the department and
3	shall include all of the following:
4	(1) The name and address of the applicant.
5	(2) The name and address of the business in which the
6	taxpayer has invested.
7	(3) A certified copy of the qualified business plan.
8	(4) Documentation that the applicant is an accredited
9	<u>investor.</u>
10	(5) Documentation that the business in which the
11	taxpayer has invested is a qualified business venture.
12	(6) Documentation that the qualified investment has been
13	made by the applicant.
14	(7) Any other information required by the department.
15	(b) ReviewThe department, in conjunction with the
16	Department of Revenue, shall review the application and
17	<u>determine if:</u>
18	(1) All requirements established under this article have
19	been met.
20	(2) The applicant has filed all required State tax
21	reports and returns for all taxable years and paid any
22	balance of State tax due as determined by the Department of
23	Revenue.
24	(c) ApprovalUpon being satisfied under subsection (b),
25	the department shall approve the application and award the
26	taxpayer a tax credit for the taxable year in the amount equal
27	to 25% of the taxpayer's qualified investment made during the
28	taxable year.
29	(d) NotificationThe department shall notify the taxpayer
30	of the amount of the taxpayer's tax credit within 30 days after

2	Section 1706-M. Carryover, application of tax credit,
3	carryback, refund and assignment.
4	(a) CarryoverIf the taxpayer cannot use the entire amount
5	of the tax credit for the taxable year in which the tax credit
6	is first approved, the excess may be carried over to succeeding
7	taxable years and used as a credit against the qualified tax
8	liability of the taxpayer for those taxable years. Each time
9	that the tax credit is carried over to a succeeding taxable
10	year, the tax credit shall be reduced by the amount that was
11	used as a credit during the immediately preceding taxable year.
12	The tax credit may be carried over and applied to succeeding
13	taxable years for no more than seven taxable years following the
14	first taxable year for which the taxpayer was entitled to claim
15	the tax credit.
16	(b) Application of tax creditA tax credit approved by the
17	department for a qualified investment in a taxable year shall
18	first be applied against the taxpayer's qualified tax liability
19	for the current taxable year as of the date on which the tax
20	credit was approved before the tax credit is applied against any
21	tax liability under subsection (a).
22	(c) Carryback or refundA taxpayer is not entitled to
23	carry back or obtain a refund of an unused tax credit.
24	(d) Sale or assignmentA taxpayer, upon application to and
25	approval by the department in consultation with the Department
26	<u>of Revenue, may sell or assign, in whole or in part, a tax</u>
27	credit granted to the taxpayer under this article if the
28	taxpayer does not have a qualified tax liability against which
29	the tax credit may be applied in the current taxable year. The
30	department shall establish guidelines, in consultation with the

1	Department of Revenue, for the approval of applications under
2	this subsection. Before an application is approved, the
3	Department of Revenue shall make a finding that the taxpayer and
4	the taxpayer's assignee have filed all required State tax_
5	reports and returns for all taxable years and paid any balance
6	of State tax due as determined by the Department of Revenue.
7	(e) Purchasers and assigneesThe purchaser or assignee of
8	all or a portion of a tax credit under subsection (d) shall_
9	immediately claim the credit in the taxable year in which the
10	purchase or assignment is made, although the purchaser or
11	assignee may carry over unused tax credits to the succeeding
12	taxable year for up to two years. The amount of the tax credit
13	that a purchaser or assignee may use against any one qualified
14	tax liability may not exceed 75% of the qualified tax liability
15	for the taxable year. The purchaser or assignee may not carry
16	back or obtain a refund of or sell or assign the tax credit. The
17	purchaser or assignee shall notify the department, and the
18	department shall notify the Department of Revenue of the seller
19	or assignor of the tax credit in compliance with procedures
20	specified by the department, in consultation with the Department
21	<u>of Revenue.</u>
22	<u>Section 1707-M. Time limitation.</u>
23	<u>A taxpayer shall not be entitled to a tax credit for</u>
24	qualified investments incurred in taxable years ending after
25	<u>December 31, 2030.</u>
26	Section 1708-M. Limitation on tax credits.
27	(a) Total amountThe total amount of tax credits approved
28	by the department in any calendar year shall not exceed
29	<u>\$20,000.</u>
30	(b) AllocationTax credits shall be allocated by the

2	Section 1709-M. Shareholder, owner or member pass-through.
3	<u>(a) Shareholder entitlementIf a Pennsylvania S</u>
4	corporation does not have an eligible tax liability against
5	which the tax credit may be applied, a shareholder of the
6	Pennsylvania S corporation shall be entitled to a tax credit
7	equal to the tax credit determined for the Pennsylvania S
8	corporation for the taxable year multiplied by the percentage of
9	the Pennsylvania S corporation's distributive income to which
10	the shareholder is entitled.
11	(b) Pass-through entity entitlementIf a pass-through
12	entity other than a Pennsylvania S corporation does not have tax
13	liability against which the tax credit may be applied, an owner
14	or member of the pass-through entity shall be entitled to a tax
15	credit equal to the tax credit determined for the pass-through
16	entity for the taxable year multiplied by the percentage of the
17	pass-through entity's distributive income to which the owner or
18	member is entitled.
19	(c) Additional creditThe following shall apply:
20	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), the tax
21	credit provided under subsection (a) or (b) shall be in
22	addition to any other tax credit to which a shareholder,
23	owner or member of a pass-through entity is otherwise
24	entitled under this article.
25	(2) A pass-through entity and a shareholder, owner or
26	<u>member of a pass-through entity shall not claim a tax credit</u>
27	under this article for the same qualified investment.
28	Section 1710-M. Repayment.
29	The department shall require the taxpayer to repay any tax
30	credit received under this article where the department, in

1	conjunction with the Department of Revenue, determines that any
2	of the following conditions exists:
3	(1) That the qualified business venture did not satisfy
4	the requirements of the qualified business plan submitted at
5	the time of application.
6	(2) That the business in which the taxpayer made the
7	qualified investment is no longer a qualified business
8	venture.
9	(3) That the taxpayer received the tax credit as a
10	result of fraud.
11	Section 1711-M. Recapture.
12	<u>A taxpayer shall repay to the Commonwealth any or all of the</u>
13	tax credit claimed by the taxpayer under this article if the
14	taxpayer withdraws any portion of the taxpayer's qualified
15	investment at any time during the period commencing with the
16	date of the taxpayer's investment through the taxable year that
17	the taxpayer claims or carries over unused portions of the tax
18	credit under section 1706-M. The amount of the repayment shall
19	be calculated as follows:
20	(1) If the withdrawal occurs in the taxable year in
21	which the investment was made or in the taxable year
22	following the taxable year in which the investment was made,
23	the aggregate amount of the tax credit claimed by the
24	taxpayer during both taxable years shall be repaid to the
25	Commonwealth.
26	(2) If the withdrawal occurs in the second taxable year
27	following the taxable year in which the investment was made
28	or any subsequent taxable year, the amount of the tax credit
29	claimed by the taxpayer in the taxable year in which the
30	withdrawal occurs shall be repaid to the Commonwealth.

1 <u>Section 1712-M. Reports.</u>

2	(a) Annual reportThe secretary shall submit an annual
3	report to the chairperson and minority chairperson of the
4	standing committees in the Senate and the chairperson and
5	minority chairperson of the standing committees in the House of
6	Representatives with jurisdiction over the department and the
7	Department of Revenue as follows:
8	(1) The report shall indicate the effectiveness of the
9	tax credit provided under this article.
10	(2) The report shall be submitted no later than March 15
11	following the fiscal year in which the tax credits were
12	approved.
13	(3) Notwithstanding any law providing for the
14	confidentiality of tax records, the report shall include the
15	following:
16	(i) The names of all taxpayers awarded the tax
17	<u>credits.</u>
18	(ii) The names of all taxpayers utilizing the tax
19	<u>credits.</u>
20	(iii) The amount of tax credits approved and
21	utilized by each taxpayer.
22	(iv) The names and locations of the qualified
23	business ventures for which the tax credits were awarded.
24	(4) The report may also include any recommendations for
25	changes in the calculation or administration of the tax
26	<u>credit.</u>
27	(b) Public recordThe report shall be considered a public
28	record as defined in section 102 of the act of February 14, 2008
29	(P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law.
30	Section 1713-M. Termination.

5	The department, in consultation with the Department of
6	Revenue, shall develop written guidelines for the implementation
7	and administration of this article. The guidelines shall be
8	posted on the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
9	Section 3. The addition of Article XVII-M of the act shall
10	apply to qualified investments made in taxable years beginning
11	after December 31, 2022.
12	Section 4. This act shall take effect as follows:
13	(1) The following shall take effect immediately:
14	(i) The addition of Article XVII-M of the act.
