11	education under this article shall qualify as a resident of
12	this Commonwealth for purposes of educational financial aid
13	through PHEAA.

15	application for an individual under this section. The
16	application shall not require an applicant's Social Security
17	number or a parent of the applicant's Social Security number.
18	<u>Section 2006-K. Departmental requirements.</u>
19	The department shall submit to the chairperson and minority
20	chairperson of the Education Committee of the Senate and the
21	chairperson and minority chairperson of the Education Committee
22	of the House of Representatives an annual report consisting of a
23	compilation of the reports submitted to the department under
24	section 2004-K.
25	Section 2007-K. Confidentiality.
26	Information obtained in the implementation of this act is
27	confidential and shall be used or disclosed only for purposes of
28	administering this program.
29	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2021, or
30	immediately, whichever is later.

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
