## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12	Amending the act of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), entitled "An act providing for access to public information, for a designated open-records officer in each Commonwealth agency, local agency, judicial agency and legislative agency, for procedure, for appeal of agency determination, for judicial review and for the Office of Open Records; imposing penalties; providing for reporting by State-related institutions; requiring the posting of certain State contract information on the Internet; and making related repeals," in State-related institutions, further providing for reporting, for contents of report and for copies and posting and providing for contracts.
13	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
14	hereby enacts as follows:
15	Section 1. Sections 1502, 1503 and 1504 of the act of
16	February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know Law,
17	are amended to read:
18	Section 1502. [Reporting] <u>Filing</u> .
19	No later than May 30 of each year, <u>unless otherwise provided</u>
20	under this chapter, a State-related institution shall file [with
21	the Governor's Office, the General Assembly, the Auditor General
22	and the State Library] the information set forth in section 1503
23	under the requirements of section 1504.

1 Section 1503. Contents of [report] filing.

2 (a) Information included.--The [report] filing required
3 under section 1502 shall include the following:

4 (1) Except as provided in paragraph (4), all information
5 required by Form 990 or an equivalent form of the United
6 States Department of the Treasury, Internal Revenue Service,
7 entitled the Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax,
8 regardless of whether the State-related institution is
9 required to file the form by the Federal Government.

10 (2) The salaries of all officers and directors of the11 State-related institution.

12 (3) The highest 25 salaries paid to employees of the13 institution that are not included under paragraph (2).

14 (3.1) For a State-related institution with 2,500
15 employees or more, the next highest 175 salaries paid to
16 employees of the institution that are not included under
17 paragraph (2). The salaries of faculty members must be

18 presented in salary ranges comprised of bands of no more than

19 <u>\$75,000 with individual faculty member names itemized</u>

20 <u>alphabetically in the respective salary range. The</u>

21 <u>institution department to which a faculty member is assigned</u>

22 <u>must be presented with the name of the faculty member.</u>

23 (4) The [report] <u>filing</u> shall not include information
24 relating to individual donors.

25 (5) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the State-related
 26 institution's academic and administrative support units for
 27 the current fiscal year.

28 (6) The actual revenue and expenditures for the prior
29 year.

30 (7) For any defined project or program which is the

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1	subject of a specific line item appropriation from the
2	General Fund, the State-related institution shall disclose
3	the following:
4	(i) Revenue and expenditure budgets of the defined
5	program or project for the current fiscal year.
6	(ii) The actual revenue and expenditures of the
7	defined program or project for the prior year.
8	(8) The revenue and expenditures of any auxiliary
9	enterprise which is directly funded in whole or in part by
10	tuition or a State appropriation for the current fiscal year.
11	(9) The most recent audited financial statement for the
12	State-related institution.
13	(10) The following information for the prior fiscal year
14	for each academic or administrative support unit, for each
15	defined project or program and for an auxiliary enterprise:
16	(i) The number of employees by academic rank.
17	(ii) The number of administrators, staff, clerical
18	and technical service employees, by classification.
19	(iii) Median and mean salary by academic rank.
20	(iv) Median and mean salaries of administrators,
21	staff, clerical and technical service employees, by
22	classification.
23	(v) Nonsalary compensation as a percentage of
24	salary. Nonsalary compensation shall include:
25	(A) Medical benefits.
26	(B) Life insurance benefits.
27	(C) Pension benefits.
28	(D) Leave benefits.
29	(E) Employer Social Security payments.
30	(F) Workers' compensation benefits.

1	(vi) A statement of the State-related institution's
2	<u>retirement policies.</u>
3	(vii) A policy statement relating to a reduction of
4	tuition for employees' family members.
5	(viii) A list by academic or administrative support
6	unit in the aggregate of the expenses of travel,
7	subsistence and lodging, whether provided or reimbursed.
8	(b) Providing informationEach State-related institution
9	shall provide full, complete and accurate information as may be
10	required by the Department of Education or the chairperson or
11	minority chairperson of the Appropriations Committee of the
12	Senate or the chairperson or minority chairperson of the
13	Appropriations Committee of the House of Representatives.
14	(c) Financial statementsEach State-related institution
15	shall present and report its financial statements required under
16	the provisions of this act in accordance with:
17	(1) The generally accepted accounting principles as
18	prescribed by the National Association of College and
19	University Business Officers, the American Institute of
20	Certified Public Accountants or by another recognized
21	authoritative body.
22	(2) The "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Budget
23	Instructions for the State System of Higher Education, State-
24	Related Universities and Non-State-Related Colleges and
25	<u>Universities."</u>
26	(3) The financial reporting policies and standards
27	promulgated by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and by the
28	Federal Government that apply to the State-related
29	institutions.
30	(d) Nonpreferred appropriations

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1	<u>(1) In a year a State-related institution receives a</u>
2	nonpreferred appropriation, a report shall be submitted prior
3	to September 1 and must cover the 12-month period beginning
4	with the summer term of the preceding year. The report shall
5	<u>include:</u>
6	(i) The following counts and distributions for each
7	term during the period:
8	(A) The definition and number of:
9	(I) Faculty members employed full time.
10	(II) Faculty members employed part time.
11	(III) Full-time students enrolled in a
12	graduate course.
13	(IV) Full-time students enrolled in an
14	<u>undergraduate course.</u>
15	(V) Part-time students enrolled in a
16	graduate course.
17	(VI) Part-time students enrolled in an
18	<u>undergraduate course.</u>
19	(B) The total number of:
20	(I) Undergraduate student credit hours,
21	divided into lower division and upper division
22	<u>course levels.</u>
23	(II) Graduate student credit hours, divided
24	into three course levels: master's, first
25	professional and doctoral.
26	(C) The number of different courses scheduled by
27	level of instruction and the number of sections of
28	individual instruction scheduled by level of
29	instruction, each further subdivided by two-digit
30	Classification of Instructional Program (CIP)

1	categories of instructional programs of higher
2	education as defined by the National Center for
3	Education Statistics, United States Department of
4	Education.
5	(D) The number of terms scheduled and the dates
6	of the terms.
7	(ii) For the summer term and the following academic
8	year in total and for each two-digit CIP program
9	<u>category:</u>
10	(A) A classification of faculty members or other
11	professional employees by title, including:
12	<u>(I) Professor.</u>
13	(II) Associate professor.
14	(III) Assistant professor.
15	(IV) Instructor.
16	(V) Lecturer.
17	(VI) Research associate.
18	(VII) Librarian and academic administrator.
19	(B) Faculty members or other professional
20	employees under each title to be subdivided into
21	teaching and nonteaching.
22	(C) Each set of faculty members or other
23	professional employees to be further subdivided by
24	<u>full-time or part-time employment.</u>
25	(D) The following aggregates for each
26	subdivided classification:
27	(I) The number of faculty and other
28	professional employees and the full-time
29	equivalence in instructional and noninstructional
30	functions.

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1	(II) The sum of credits assigned to
2	undergraduate classroom courses and the sum of
3	credits assigned to graduate classroom courses
4	taught divided into lower division, upper
5	division, master's, first professional and
6	doctoral course levels.
7	(III) The sum of credits assigned to
8	undergraduate individual instruction courses and
9	the sum of credits assigned to graduate
10	individual instruction courses taught divided
11	into lower division, upper division, master's,
12	first professional and doctoral course levels.
13	(IV) The sum of undergraduate classroom
14	student credit hours and the sum of graduate
15	classroom student credit hours generated, divided
16	into lower division, upper division, master's,
17	first professional and doctoral course levels.
18	(V) The sum of undergraduate individual
19	instruction student credit hours and the sum of
20	graduate individual instruction student credit
21	hours generated, divided into lower division,
22	upper division, master's, first professional and
23	doctoral course levels.
24	(VI) The total salary paid for instructional
25	functions and for noninstructional functions and
26	the amount of salary paid for each of these
27	functions from State-related institution funds,
28	Federal funds and other funds.
29	(iii) For each term of the period covered for each
30	faculty member employed full time identified by two-digit

1	CIP program category and title, the report shall contain
2	an analysis of the average hours per week spent:
3	(A) In State-related institution-related
4	activities, stating specifically hours spent in
5	undergraduate classroom contact and graduate
6	classroom contact hours spent in preparation.
7	(B) In research.
8	<u>(C) In public service.</u>
9	(2) The report covering the 12-month period shall
10	include for each program of the State-related institution:
11	(i) Minimum number of credits required for a
12	baccalaureate degree and for a master's degree.
13	(ii) Number of bachelor's degrees, master's degrees,
14	first professional degrees and doctoral degrees awarded
15	for the previous five years and those estimates for that
16	year.
17	(e) MinutesEach State-related institution shall make a
18	copy of the minutes of each public meeting of the institution's
19	board of trustees available for public inspection in the
20	institution's library in print format and online on the
21	institution's publicly accessible Internet website. The minutes
22	shall be maintained in print and online for no fewer than 20
23	years.
24	(f) Data systems reportEach State-related university
25	shall make a copy of the institution's integrated postsecondary
26	education data systems report available for public inspection in
27	the institution's library in print format and online on the
28	institution's publicly accessible Internet website.
29	Section 1504. [Copies and posting] <u>Requirements for information</u>
30	<u>in filings</u> .

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1	[A State-related institution shall maintain, for at least
2	seven years, a copy of the report in the institution's library
3	and shall provide free access to the report on the institution's
4	Internet website.] <u>A State-related institution shall make the</u>
5	information required by section 1502 accessible to the public in
6	accordance with the following:
7	(1) The information shall be posted online on the
8	institution's publicly accessible Internet website in a
9	searchable, sortable and downloadable database format that is
10	freely accessible by the public. To the extent possible, a
11	State-related institution shall post the information online
12	in a similar manner in order to facilitate easy public
13	review. The information of prior years shall be maintained
14	for no fewer than ten years.
15	(2) The information shall be maintained in print format
16	in the institution's library for no fewer than ten years.
17	(3) The information shall be provided in electronic
18	format to the Department of Education and the Joint State
19	<u>Government Commission.</u>
20	(4) The information shall be provided in print format to
21	the General Assembly and to each of the State regional
22	library resource centers.
23	Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
24	Section 1505. Contracts.
25	(a) ScopeBy May 30 of each year, a State-related
26	institution shall file with the Governor's Office, the Secretary
27	of the Senate, the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives
28	and the State Library an annual list of contracts in excess of
29	\$5,000 for the purchase of all goods and third-party services.
30	(b) ContentsThe list shall include all of the following:
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1	(1) Date of execution.
2	(2) Amount of the contract.
3	(3) Beginning date of the contract.
4	(4) End date of the contract, if applicable.
5	(5) The name and address of the vendor.
6	(6) Subject matter of the contract.
7	(c) PrivilegeThis section shall not apply to a contract
8	for services protected by a privilege.
9	(d) EvidenceThis section:
10	(1) shall apply to a purchase order evidencing new
11	obligations; but
12	(2) shall not apply to a purchase order evidencing
13	fulfillment of an existing contract.
14	(e) PostingInformation under this section shall be posted
15	and maintained on the institution's publicly accessible Internet
16	website.
17	Section 3. This act shall take effect as follows:
18	(1) The amendment or addition of sections 1503 and 1505
19	of the act shall take effect July 1, 2022, or immediately,
20	whichever is later.
21	(2) This section shall take effect immediately.
22	(3) The remainder of this act shall take effect July 1,
23	2021, or immediately, whichever is later.

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
