AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.343, No.176), entitled
2	"An act relating to the finances of the State government;
3	providing for cancer control, prevention and research, for
4	ambulatory surgical center data collection, for the Joint
5	Underwriting Association, for entertainment business
6	financial management firms, for private dam financial
7	assurance and for reinstatement of item vetoes; providing for
8	the settlement, assessment, collection, and lien of taxes,
9	bonus, and all other accounts due the Commonwealth, the
10	collection and recovery of fees and other money or property
11	due or belonging to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
12	including escheated property and the proceeds of its sale,
13	the custody and disbursement or other disposition of funds
14	and securities belonging to or in the possession of the
15	Commonwealth, and the settlement of claims against the
16	Commonwealth, the resettlement of accounts and appeals to the
17	courts, refunds of moneys erroneously paid to the
18	Commonwealth, auditing the accounts of the Commonwealth and
19	all agencies thereof, of all public officers collecting
20	moneys payable to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,
21	and all receipts of appropriations from the Commonwealth,
22	authorizing the Commonwealth to issue tax anticipation notes
23	to defray current expenses, implementing the provisions of
24	section 7(a) of Article VIII of the Constitution of
25	Pennsylvania authorizing and restricting the incurring of
26	certain debt and imposing penalties; affecting every
27	department, board, commission, and officer of the State
28	government, every political subdivision of the State, and
29	certain officers of such subdivisions, every person,
30	association, and corporation required to pay, assess, or
31	collect taxes, or to make returns or reports under the laws
32	imposing taxes for State purposes, or to pay license fees or
33	other moneys to the Commonwealth, or any agency thereof,

4	(a) Use of fundsFrom money appropriated to the department <
5	AUTHORITY for COVID Relief - Nonprofit Economic Emergency <
6	<u>Delivery System Grants Program, \$200,000,000 shall be</u>
7	transferred to the authority and shall be used to make grants

9	(b) Establishment of programThe authority shall establish
10	the program as a Statewide competitive grant program.
11	(c) Purpose of programThe program shall receive
12	applications and award grants to eligible community-based
13	nonprofit organizations in accordance with this section.
14	(d) ApplicationThe authority shall develop an application
15	for eligible community-based nonprofit organizations to apply
16	for grants under this section within 30 90 days of the effective <

18	and posted on the authority's publicly accessible Internet
19	website and shall be in a form that can be completed
20	electronically or through the United States mail.
21	<u>(e) DeadlineNo application for a grant under this section</u>
22	may be submitted 30 days after the date the authority makes the

24	accessible Internet website.
25	(f) GuidelinesThe authority shall establish guidelines
26	that are consistent with the provisions of this section within
27	30 90 days of the effective date of this section. The guidelines <

4	<u>(g) Program requirements</u>
5	(1) An eligible community-based nonprofit organization
6	must be one of the following categories:
7	(i) Child-care centers, early childhood learning
8	centers and after-school programs.
9	(ii) Community-based, federally qualified health
10	centers and rural health clinics.
11	(iii) Substance abuse treatment facilities.
12	(iv) Domestic violence centers.
13	(v) Organizations operating transportation and food
14	distribution systems.
15	(vi) Employment and workforce training and
16	educational centers.
17	(vii) Alternative learning and career training
18	institutions.
19	(viii) Organizations serving intellectual or
20	<u>developmental disabilities.</u>
21	(ix) Early intervention service providers.
22	(x) Mental health and substance abuse counseling.
23	(xi) Food banks, food pantries and soup kitchens.
24	(2) An eligible community-based nonprofit organization
25	must provide one or more of the following services:
26	(i) Child care.
27	(ii) Education and safety net services for
28	vulnerable youth, including child welfare, youth
29	development programs and crisis intervention.
30	(iii) Homelessness and housing insecurity assistance

1	services, including mortgage and rent relief, emergency
2	guarantine housing, transitional housing, rapid rehousing
3	and warming shelters.
4	(iv) Mental health treatment programs and substance
5	abuse counseling services.
6	(v) Facility and home-based or community-based
7	services for individuals with intellectual or
8	developmental disabilities.
9	(vi) Early intervention services.
10	(vii) Medical treatment for chronic conditions.
11	(viii) Procurement and distribution of personal
12	protective equipment and testing.
13	(ix) Employment readiness, including career
14	readiness, placement and retraining programs.
15	(x) Procurement, distribution or transportation of
16	food.
17	(3) An eligible community-based nonprofit organization
18	that has already received public funding during the COVID-19
19	pandemic must explain in its application why additional
20	funding is necessary above and beyond the public funding
21	already received.
22	(h) Grant limitsThe authority may award a grant to an
23	eligible community-based nonprofit organization not to exceed
24	<u>\$500,000.</u>
25	(i) Award of grantsThe authority shall award grants and
26	make grant payments under this section no later than two months
27	after the deadline for submitting the grant application or 30
28	days prior to any Federal or State imposed deadline established
29	for the use of such funds, whichever is sooner.
30	(j) ExpirationThis section shall expire after the money

2	exhausted. The authority shall transmit notice of the date that <
3	the money is exhausted to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
4	publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
5	(k) DefinitionsAs used in this section, the following
6	words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
7	subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
8	"Authority." The Commonwealth Financing Authority.
9	"Eligible community-based nonprofit organization." A tax-
10	<u>exempt 501(c)(3) institution that meets the criteria for grants</u>
11	under subsection (g) and that was subject to financial strain
12	due to closure, increased service delivery or a loss of revenue
13	as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the proclamation of
14	disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020,
15	published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of
16	the state of disaster emergency.
17	"Program." The Nonprofit Economic Emergency Delivery System
18	(NEEDS) Grants Program established under this section.
19	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
