## AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in sexual offenses, further providing for the offense of institutional sexual assault. 3 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 3124.2(a.5) of Title 18 of the 6 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, added July 23, 2020 7 (P.L.641, No.63), is amended and the section is amended by 8 adding a subsection to read: § 3124.2. Institutional sexual assault. 10 11 \* \* \* (a.5) Consent not a defense. -- Consent is not a defense to a 12 1.3 violation of subsection (a), (a.1), (a.2), (a.3) [or], (a.4) or 14 (a.6).15 (a.6) Caretakers.--(1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) and in sections 16
- 17 3121, 3122.1, 3123, 3124.1 and 3125, a caretaker commits a
- 18 felony of the third degree if the caretaker engages in sexual

2	with a care-dependent person who receives care, services or
3	treatment in or from a facility, private care residence or
4	the care-dependent person's residence.
5	(2) Paragraph (1) does not apply if the victim and
6	defendant are spouses, persons living as spouses or current
7	sexual or intimate partners whose relationship preexisted the
8	caretaker relationship.
9	(3) As used in this subsection, the following terms
10	shall have the meanings given to them in this paragraph:
11	(i) "Care-dependent person." An adult who, due to
12	physical or cognitive disability or impairment, requires
13	assistance to meet the needs for food, shelter, clothing,
14	personal care or health care.
15	(ii) "Caretaker." A person who is any of the
16	<pre>following:</pre>
17	(A) An owner, operator, manager or employee of a
18	facility or private care residence.
19	(B) An individual who provides care to a care-
20	dependent person in a facility, private care
21	residence or the care-dependent person's residence.
22	(C) An individual who has an obligation to
23	provide care to a care-dependent person for monetary
24	consideration in a facility, private care residence
25	or the care-dependent person's residence.
26	(D) An individual who does not reside with a
27	care-dependent person but who, with respect to the
28	<pre>care-dependent person, has:</pre>
29	(I) a legal duty to provide care;
30	(II) affirmatively assumed a responsibility

1	to provide care; or
2	(III) responsibility by contract or court
3	order to provide care.
4	(iii) "Facility." Any of the following:
5	(A) A health care facility, as defined in
6	section 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130,
7	No.48), known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
8	(B) A facility as defined in section 1001 of the
9	act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the
10	<u>Human Services Code.</u>
11	(C) An intermediate care facility as defined in
12	section 801-C of the Human Services Code.
13	(D) A domiciliary care home as defined in 6 Pa.
14	Code, Ch. 21 (relating to domiciliary care services
15	<pre>for adults).</pre>
16	(iv) "Private care residence." A private residence:
17	(A) In which the owner of the residence or the
18	legal entity responsible for the operation of the
19	residence, for monetary consideration, provides or
20	assists with or arranges for the provision of food,
21	room, shelter, clothing, personal care or health care
22	in the residence, for a period exceeding 24 hours, to
23	fewer than four care-dependent persons who are not
24	relatives of the owner.
25	(B) That is not:
26	(I) required to be licensed as a long-term
27	care nursing facility, as defined in section
28	802.1 of the Health Care Facilities Act; and
29	(II) specified in subparagraph (iii) (A) <-
30	_(III).
