A JOINT RESOLUTION

1 2 3	Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, further providing for qualifications of electors.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby resolves as follows:
6	Section 1. The following amendment to the Constitution of
7	Pennsylvania is proposed in accordance with Article XI:
8	(1) That section 1 of Article VII be amended to read: <
9	§ 1. Qualifications of electors.
10	<u>(a)</u> Every citizen 21 years of age, possessing the following
11	qualifications, shall be entitled to vote at all elections
12	subject, however, to such laws requiring and regulating the
13	registration of electors as the General Assembly may enact.
14	1. He or she shall have been a citizen of the United States
15	at least one month.
16	2. He or she shall have resided in the State 90 days
17	immediately preceding the election.

1 3. He or she shall have resided in the election district 2 where he or she shall offer to vote at least 60 days immediately 3 preceding the election, except that if qualified to vote in an election district prior to removal of residence, he or she may, 4 if a resident of Pennsylvania, vote in the election district 5 from which he or she removed his or her residence within 60 days 6 7 preceding the election. (b) (1) In addition to the qualifications under subsection <--8 (a), a qualified elector shall provide identification at each 9 10 election by: 11 (i) presenting valid identification before receiving 12 ballot to vote in person; or 13 (ii) enclosing a copy of valid identification with 14 her ballot to vote by absentee or mail-in ballot. 15 (2) The types of valid identification that a person 16 provide to comply with this subsection shall be provided 17 law. 18 (B) IN ADDITION TO THE QUALIFICATIONS UNDER SUBSECTION (A) <--19 OF THIS SECTION, A QUALIFIED ELECTOR SHALL PROVIDE A VALID 20 IDENTIFICATION AT EACH ELECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE 21 FOLLOWING: 22 1. WHEN VOTING IN PERSON, THE QUALIFIED ELECTOR SHALL 23 PRESENT A VALID IDENTIFICATION BEFORE RECEIVING A BALLOT TO VOTE 24 IN PERSON. 25 2. WHEN NOT VOTING IN PERSON, THE QUALIFIED ELECTOR SHALL 26 PROVIDE A COPY OF A VALID IDENTIFICATION WITH HIS OR HER BALLOT. 27 (C) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY LAW REGARDING THE TYPES OF VALID 28 IDENTIFICATIONS NECESSARY FOR A QUALIFIED ELECTOR TO COMPLY WITH 29 SUBSECTION (B), VALID IDENTIFICATIONS SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, A VALID GOVERNMENT-ISSUED IDENTIFICATION. 30

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1 Section 2. (a) Upon the first passage by the General Assembly of this proposed constitutional amendment, the 2 Secretary of the Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to 3 4 comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the 5 6 required advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such newspapers are published in sufficient time after 7 passage of this proposed constitutional amendment. 8

9 Upon the second passage by the General Assembly of this (b) 10 proposed constitutional amendment, the Secretary of the 11 Commonwealth shall proceed immediately to comply with the advertising requirements of section 1 of Article XI of the 12 13 Constitution of Pennsylvania and shall transmit the required 14 advertisements to two newspapers in every county in which such 15 newspapers are published in sufficient time after passage of 16 this proposed constitutional amendment. The Secretary of the 17 Commonwealth shall submit this proposed constitutional amendment 18 to the qualified electors of this Commonwealth at the first 19 primary, general or municipal election which meets the 20 requirements of and is in conformance with section 1 of Article 21 XI of the Constitution of Pennsylvania and which occurs at least 22 three months after the proposed constitutional amendment is 23 passed by the General Assembly.

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
