AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in open campus initiatives, further 5 providing for legislative intent, for definitions, for open 6 campus initiatives, for cooperative agreements, for 7 reimbursements by the Commonwealth and for parental and 8 public information. 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Sections 1501-G, 1502-G, 1503-G, 1504-G, 1505-G 13 and 1506-G of the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known 14 as the Public School Code of 1949, are amended to read: Section 1501-G. Legislative intent. 15
- 16 It is the intent of the General Assembly to encourage
- collaborative partnerships between [school districts] schools_ 17
- 18 for the purpose of providing expanded access to high-quality
- 19 curricula to students in a cost-effective manner through the use
- 20 of technology.
- 2.1 Section 1502-G. Definitions.

- 1 The following words and phrases when used in this article
- 2 shall have the meaning given to them in this section unless the
- 3 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 4 "Department." The Department of Education of the
- 5 Commonwealth.
- 6 "Nonparticipating school fentity." A school district,
- 7 [which is not a party to a cooperative agreement between school

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- 8 districts, a] charter school, cyber charter school, regional_
- 9 <u>charter school</u>, <u>multiple charter school organization</u>,
- 10 <u>intermediate unit</u>, area career and technical school, nonpublic
- 11 school or home education program provided under section
- 12 1327.1[.], which is not a party to a cooperative agreement
- 13 <u>between school entities establishing an open campus initiative.</u>
- "Open campus initiative." A program established under
- 15 section 1503-G.
- 16 "Participating school [district] entity." A school district,
- 17 <u>charter school, cyber charter school, regional charter school,</u>
- 18 <u>multiple charter school organization</u>, intermediate unit or area
- 19 <u>career and technical school</u>, which is party to the cooperative
- 20 agreement between school [districts] entities establishing [the]
- 21 <u>an</u> open campus initiative.
- 22 "SCHOOL ENTITY." A SCHOOL DISTRICT, CHARTER SCHOOL, CYBER <
- 23 CHARTER SCHOOL, REGIONAL CHARTER SCHOOL, MULTIPLE CHARTER SCHOOL
- 24 ORGANIZATION, INTERMEDIATE UNIT OR AREA CAREER AND TECHNICAL
- 25 SCHOOL.
- 26 Section 1503-G. Open campus initiatives.
- 27 (a) Establishment. -- An open campus initiative may be
- 28 established between school [districts] entities through a
- 29 cooperative agreement.
- 30 (b) Courses.--Courses of an open campus initiative may be

- 1 delivered outside of a school building in whole or in part using
- 2 technology that may include the Internet, video conferencing or
- 3 other electronic means.
- 4 (c) Grades, credit, promotion and graduation.--Course
- 5 grades, credit, promotion and graduation policies for students
- 6 participating in open campus initiative courses shall be
- 7 determined by the school [district, charter school, cyber
- 8 charter school, entity, nonpublic school or evaluator of a home
- 9 education program in which the student is enrolled and the
- 10 cooperative agreement between the participating school
- 11 [districts] entities.
- 12 (d) Student eligibility requirements.--Eligibility
- 13 requirements for student participation in open campus initiative
- 14 courses shall be determined by the school [district, charter
- 15 school, cyber charter school, entity, nonpublic school or
- 16 supervisor of a home education program in which each student is
- 17 enrolled and the cooperative agreement between the participating
- 18 school [districts] entities.
- 19 (e) Nonparticipating school [entities].--A cooperative

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- 20 agreement between participating school [districts] entities may
- 21 provide for students attending a nonparticipating school
- 22 {entity} to participate in an open campus initiative course.
- 23 (f) Compulsory attendance requirements. -- The time during
- 24 which a student participates in open campus initiative courses
- 25 shall be considered to be compliant with the compulsory
- 26 attendance requirements of section 1327.
- 27 (g) Student participation. -- The school [district, charter
- 28 school, cyber charter school, entity, nonpublic school or home
- 29 education program in which the student is enrolled shall ensure
- 30 that a student participating in open campus initiative courses

- 1 is offered at least 990 hours of instruction at the secondary
- 2 level and 900 hours of instruction at the elementary level.
- 3 (h) Technical assistance. -- The department shall provide
- 4 technical assistance as needed to school [districts] entities
- 5 establishing and operating an open campus initiative.
- 6 Section 1504-G. Cooperative agreements.
- 7 (a) Contents. -- School [districts] entities desiring to
- 8 establish and operate an open campus initiative shall develop
- 9 and enter into a cooperative agreement that shall, at a minimum,
- 10 include:

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- 11 (1) A policy for grading, credit and promotion of 12 students participating in open campus initiative courses.
- 13 (2) A policy for participation of students from
 14 participating school [districts] entities which shall include
 15 minimum academic and attendance criteria.
 - (3) A policy for participation of students from nonparticipating school entities, which includes a fee schedule for determining tuition charges for courses delivered to those students, if the participating school [districts] entities allow participation of students from nonparticipating fschool entities] schools.
 - (4) A policy for discipline and removal of students from open campus initiative courses in compliance with State law related to student discipline.

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- (5) Information about the attribution of student data to the school [district, charter school, cyber charter school,] entity, nonpublic school or home education program in which the student is enrolled, including student assessment data.
- 29 (6) Information about the sharing of costs between the
 30 participating school [districts] entities.] ENTITIES, EXCEPT <--

- 1 THAT A CYBER CHARTER SCHOOL, AS DEFINED IN SECTION 1703-A,
- 2 MAY PROVIDE DIGITAL COURSE CONTENT FREE OF CHARGE, BUT MUST
- 3 SHARE INFORMATION ON A NEGOTIATED FEE IF A NEGOTIABLE FEE IS
- 4 <u>ESTABLISHED TO PROVIDE STAFF, TECHNOLOGY, DIGITAL COURSE</u>
- 5 CONTENT, CURRICULUM MATERIALS AND OTHER SERVICES REQUESTED BY
- 6 <u>A PARTICIPATING SCHOOL ENTITY FOR CYBER COURSES.</u>
- 7 (7) Information about the use and distribution of
- 8 tuition revenue.
- 9 (8) Processes for adding and removing open campus
- 10 initiative courses.
- 11 (9) Processes for termination of the open campus
- 12 initiative.
- 13 (b) Adoption by [boards of school directors] governing board
- 14 of school entity. -- Each open campus initiative cooperative
- 15 agreement shall be adopted by majority vote of the [board of
- 16 school directors] governing board of the school entity of each
- 17 of the participating school [districts] entities.
- 18 Section 1505-G. Reimbursements by the Commonwealth.
- 19 For the purpose of making reimbursements under Article XXV, a
- 20 student participating in an open campus initiative shall be
- 21 considered to be enrolled in the school [district, charter
- 22 school, cyber charter school,] entity, nonpublic school or home
- 23 education program which determines the student's eligibility for
- 24 participation in the open campus initiative.
- 25 Section 1506-G. Parental and public information.
- 26 All policies related to an open campus initiative shall be
- 27 made accessible to parents and posted on the participating
- 28 school [districts'] entities' publicly accessible Internet
- 29 websites.
- 30 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
