AN ACT

Amending the act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 P.L.2897, No.1), entitled "An act establishing a system of 2 unemployment compensation to be administered by the 3 Department of Labor and Industry and its existing and newly 4 created agencies with personnel (with certain exceptions) 5 selected on a civil service basis; requiring employers to keep records and make reports, and certain employers to pay 6 7 contributions based on payrolls to provide moneys for the 8 payment of compensation to certain unemployed persons; 9 10 providing procedure and administrative details for the determination, payment and collection of such contributions 11 and the payment of such compensation; providing for 12 cooperation with the Federal Government and its agencies; 13 creating certain special funds in the custody of the State 14 Treasurer; and prescribing penalties," in compensation, 15 providing for COVID-19 vaccine. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 18 hereby enacts as follows: 19 Section 1. The act of December 5, 1936 (2nd Sp.Sess., 1937 20 P.L.2897, No.1), known as the Unemployment Compensation Law, is 21 amended by adding a section to read: 2.2 Section 409. COVID-19 vaccine. -- (a) An employe's refusal to 23 become vaccinated against COVID-19 shall not be considered 24 willful misconduct for the purposes of section 402(e).

(b) An employe's voluntary resignation from employment due

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- 1 to the employer requiring employes to become vaccinated against
- 2 COVID-19 as a condition of continued employment shall be
- 3 <u>considered a cause of a necessitous and compelling nature for</u>
- 4 the purposes of section 402(b) if the employer has not provided
- 5 the employe with suitable other work that would not require
- 6 <u>vaccination against COVID-19.</u>
- 7 (c) The following words and phrases when used in this
- 8 <u>section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection</u>
- 9 unless context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 10 "COVID-19." The novel coronavirus as identified in the
- 11 Governor's Proclamation of Disaster Emergency issued on March 6,
- 12 2020, published at 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020).
- 13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
