Section 1106(b)(10) and (11) of Title 75 are 11 amended and the subsection is amended by adding a paragraph to 13 read: § 1106. 29	automated vehicle driver that the highly automated vehicle

19	The highly automated vehicle driver on board or in a remote
20	location must be properly licensed under this title to operate
21	the appropriate type and class of motor vehicle on highways.

23	A highly automated vehicle that is also a motor carrier
24	<u>vehicle requiring a commercial driver's license under section</u>
25	1606 (relating to requirement for commercial driver's license)

10	network service. Any provision of law which by its nature
11	reasonably applies only to a driver shall not apply to a highly
12	automated vehicle with an ADS engaged or without a highly
13	automated vehicle driver on board while logged onto a digital
14	network of a transportation network service.
15	§ 8508. Licensing and registration.
16	The following shall apply:
17	(1) The ADS is considered the driver of a highly
18	automated vehicle when the ADS is engaged for the purpose of
19	assessing compliance under this title and is considered to be
20	a driver licensed to operate the motor vehicle under section
21	1501 (relating to drivers required to be licensed). If a
22	police officer must issue a citation, a police officer shall
23	cite the owner or registrant of the highly automated vehicle.
24	(2) The highly automated vehicle driver in a remote
25	location is considered the driver of a highly automated
26	vehicle for the purpose of assessing compliance under this
27	title and is considered to be a driver licensed to operate
28	the motor vehicle under section 1501. If a police officer
29	issues a citation, a police officer shall cite the highly
30	automated vehicle driver.

1	(3) The requirements under this title relating to
2	exhibiting a driver's license and registration card are
3	satisfied if a vehicle registration card is in the highly
4	automated vehicle, physically or electronically and available
5	for inspection by a police officer.
6	§ 8509. Insurance.
7	Before a highly automated vehicle with an ADS engaged or
8	without a highly automated vehicle driver on board operates on
9	highways, the owner of the highly automated vehicle shall submit
10	proof of financial responsibility to the department self-
11	certifying that the highly automated vehicle is covered by
12	insurance or proof of self-insurance in the minimum amount of
13	\$1,000,000, which shall satisfy the applicable laws of this
14	<u>Commonwealth.</u>
15	<u>§ 8510. Control.</u>
16	In accordance with section 6101 (relating to applicability
17	and uniformity of title), this chapter preempts and supersedes
18	all ordinances relating to highly automated vehicles. A
19	political subdivision of the Commonwealth may not adopt or
20	enforce a policy, rule or ordinance that sets standards or
21	otherwise burdens, prohibits, limits or regulates the operation
22	of a highly automated vehicle.
23	§ 8510.1. Regulations.
24	(a) General rule. In order to facilitate the prompt
25	implementation of this subchapter, the department may promulgate
26	regulations or publish guidelines which are consistent with this
27	title that includes the following:
28	(1) The process for receipt review, and approval of a
29	request for a highly automated vehicle testing authorization
30	with or without a highly automated vehicle driver on board.

1	(2) The process for receipt and review of a self-
2	certification prior to commercial deployments of a highly
3	automated vehicle. The department must provide a response
4	within 30 days.
5	(3) The type and amount of information that is necessary
6	for adequate review of and response to each stage of request
7	for testing approval or commercial deployment.
8	(4) The process an emergency service responder must
9	follow when a highly automated vehicle without a highly
10	automated vehicle driver on board is involved in an emergency
11	<u>response area.</u>
12	(a.1) Guidelines. The department shall consult with the
13	advisory committee before publishing guidelines under subsection
14	<u>(a).</u>
15	(b) Temporary regulations. Notwithstanding any other
16	provision of law, regulations promulgated by the department
17	under this subchapter during the two years following the
18	effective date of this section shall be deemed temporary
19	regulations, which shall expire no later than three years
20	following the effective date of this section or upon
21	promulgation of final regulations. The temporary regulations
22	shall not be subject to:
23	(1) Sections 201, 202, 203, 204 and 205 of the act of
24	July 31, 1968 (P.L.769, No.240), referred to as the
25	Commonwealth Documents Law.
26	(2) Sections 204(b) and 301(10) of the act of October
27	15, 1980 (P.L.950, No.164), known as the Commonwealth
28	Attorneys Act.
29	(3) The act of June 25, 1982 (P.L.633, No.181), known as
30	the Regulatory Review Act.

- 3 Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania
