## AN ACT

- Amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for solitary confinement.
- 3 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 4 hereby enacts as follows:
- 5 Section 1. Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 6 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:
- 7 <u>CHAPTER 51</u>
- 8 <u>SOLITARY CONFINEMENT</u>

- 10 <u>5101</u>. <u>Definitions</u>.
- 11 5102. Data collection and reporting requirements.
- 12 § 5101. Definitions.
- 13 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 14 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 15 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 16 "Department." The Department of Corrections of the
- 17 Commonwealth.

- 1 "Inmate." An adult person committed to a term of
- 2 imprisonment or otherwise confined in a State correctional
- 3 institution.
- 4 "Member of a vulnerable population." Any of the following:
- 5 <u>(1) An inmate who is 21 years of age or younger.</u>
- 6 (2) An inmate who is 70 years of age or older.
- 7 (3) An inmate who is pregnant or in the postpartum
- 8 period.
- 9 <u>(4) An inmate who has recently suffered a miscarriage or</u>
- 10 <u>terminated a pregnancy.</u>
- 11 (5) An inmate who is perceived to be lesbian, gay,
- bisexual, transgender or intersex.
- 13 "Personally identifiable information." Any representation of
- 14 <u>information that permits the identity of an individual to whom</u>
- 15 the information applies to be reasonably inferred by either
- 16 <u>direct or indirect means, including, but not limited to, the</u>
- 17 <u>individual's:</u>
- 18 <u>(1) name;</u>
- 19 <u>(2) address;</u>
- 20 (3) Social Security number or other identifying number
- 21 <u>or code;</u>
- 22 (4) telephone number; or
- 23 <u>(5) email address.</u>
- 24 "Postpartum period." The period following delivery before an
- 25 inmate or a detainee has been discharged from a medical
- 26 facility.
- 27 "Solitary confinement." The confinement of an inmate in a
- 28 State correctional institution due to disciplinary,
- 29 <u>administrative</u>, protective, investigative, medical or other
- 30 classification, in a cell or similarly confined holding or

- 1 living space, alone or with other inmates for approximately 20
- 2 hours or more per day, with severely restricted activity,
- 3 movement and social interaction.
- 4 <u>"State correctional institution." A correctional institution</u>
- 5 or facility housing incarcerated individuals owned or operated
- 6 by the Commonwealth.
- 7 § 5102. Data collection and reporting requirements.
- 8 (a) Data collection. -- The department shall collect the
- 9 following information as required for reporting under subsection
- 10 (b):
- 11 (1) The average annual State prison population.
- 12 (2) The number of inmates housed within solitary
- 13 <u>confinement and the number of inmates released from solitary</u>
- 14 <u>confinement</u>.
- 15 (3) For each inmate housed within solitary confinement,
- the age, sex, race, ethnicity, mental health code, medical
- 17 class code, security level and custody level classification
- 18 of the inmate and whether the inmate is a member of a
- 19 <u>vulnerable population</u>.
- 20 (4) For each inmate released from solitary confinement,
- 21 any change to the inmate's mental health code, medical class
- 22 code, security level or custody level classification.
- 23 (5) The reason or reasons for which each inmate was
- 24 placed into solitary confinement.
- 25 (6) The number of days each inmate was housed within
- solitary confinement per confinement.
- 27 (7) The number of incidents of self-harm, offenses
- toward others, suicide attempts and suicides for inmates
- 29 housed within solitary confinement.
- 30 <u>(8) The number of incidents of self-harm, offenses</u>

1	toward others, suicide attempts and suicides for inmates
2	released from solitary confinement.
3	(9) The current three-year recidivism rate for all
4	inmates released from the State prison system and the three-
5	year recidivism rate for inmates released from the State
6	prison system who were housed in solitary confinement at any
7	time in the two years preceding their release.
8	(10) The number of staff persons, including a breakdown
9	by job classification, dedicated to inmates housed within
10	solitary confinement during the previous calendar year.
11	(b) Annual report The following shall apply:
12	(1) On August 1 of the year that begins immediately
13	following the effective date of this subsection, and each
14	August 1 thereafter, the department shall report to the
15	Governor, the chair and minority chair of the Judiciary
16	Committee of the Senate and the chair and minority chair of
17	the Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives in
18	the aggregate the data collected under subsection (a) for the
19	previous calendar year.
20	(2) The report shall also include a description of any
21	changes made during the previous calendar year to written
22	policies or procedures of the department relating to the use
23	and conditions of solitary confinement.
24	(3) The department shall ensure the report does not
25	contain any personally identifiable information of any inmate
26	as a result of the required data collection.
27	(c) Publication requirements The following shall apply:
28	(1) Within 30 days of the effective date of this
29	section, the department shall:
30	(i) provide a copy of the department's policies and

1	procedures governing the use of solitary confinement to
2	the Governor, the chair and minority chair of the
3	Judiciary Committee of the Senate and the chair and
4	minority chair of the Judiciary Committee of the House of
5	Representatives; and
6	(ii) publish the department's policies and
7	procedures governing the use of solitary confinement on
8	the department's publicly accessible Internet website.
9	(2) If the department changes a policy or procedure
L O	governing the use of solitary confinement following
11	dissemination of policies and procedures under paragraph (1),
_2	the department shall update the policies and procedures
13	published on the department's publicly accessible Internet
4	website and provide written notice to recipients listed in
.5	subsection (c)(1)(i). A policy or procedure updated under
16	this paragraph shall include an annotation with dates to
L 7	indicate any changes that have been made.
18	(3) Within 10 days of submission of the report as
_9	required under subsection (b), the department shall publish
20	the annual report on the department's publicly accessible
21	Internet website.
2	Section 2 This act shall take effect immediately
