1 2 3	Amending Title 44 (Law and Justice) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in other officers and officials, providing for coroners; and making a related repeal.
4	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
5	hereby enacts as follows:
6	Section 1. Title 44 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
7	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

18	<u>§ 7521. Scope of subchapter.</u>
19	This subchapter provides for the education and training for
20	county coroners, chief deputy coroners, deputy coroners and
21	other individuals performing death investigations and for the
22	Coroners' Education and Training Account.
23	<u>§ 7522. Definitions.</u>
24	The following words and phrases when used in this subchapter
25	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
26	context clearly indicates otherwise:
27	"Account." The Coroners' Education and Training Account
28	established under section 7532 (relating to Coroners' Education
29	and Training Account).
30	"Association." The Pennsylvania State Coroners Association.
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1	"Board." The Coroners' Education and Training Board.
2	"Commission." The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and
3	Delinquency.
4	"Program." The Coroners' Education and Training Program
5	established under the provisions of this subchapter.
6	§ 7523. Coroners' Education and Training Board.
7	(a) EstablishmentThe Coroners' Education and Training
8	Board is established within the commission.
9	(b) CompositionThe board shall be composed as follows:
10	(1) The Executive Director of the commission or a
11	<u>designee.</u>
12	(2) Five coroners from different areas of this
13	Commonwealth, each with a minimum of six years' experience as
14	<u>a coroner.</u>
15	(3) A physician coroner or other licensed health care
16	professional coroner with a minimum of six years' experience
17	<u>as a coroner.</u>
18	(4) A board-certified forensic pathologist with a
19	minimum of four years' experience as a forensic pathologist.
20	(5) Two other forensic experts with a minimum of four
21	years' experience in death investigations and experience as a
22	toxicologist, an odontologist, an anthropologist or an
23	<u>entomologist.</u>
24	(6) One educator qualified in the field of criminal
25	justice.
26	(7) One county district attorney.
27	(8) The Executive Director of the association, who shall
28	<u>serve as an ex officio member.</u>
29	(c) Appointments and termsAll members of the board,
30	except for the executive directors of the commission and the

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1	association, shall be appointed as follows:
2	(1) Of the five coroners, two shall be appointed by the
3	President pro tempore of the Senate, two shall be appointed
4	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives and one shall
5	be appointed by the Governor, all from a list of 10 qualified
6	persons recommended by the Pennsylvania Coroners'
7	Association.
8	(2) The physician coroner or other licensed health care
9	professional coroner shall be appointed by the Governor from
10	a list of three qualified persons recommended by the
11	Pennsylvania Coroners' Association.
12	(3) The board-certified forensic pathologist shall be
13	appointed by the Governor from a list of three qualified
14	persons recommended by the Pennsylvania Coroners'
15	Association.
16	(4) Of the other two forensic experts, one shall be
17	appointed by the President pro tempore of the Senate and one
18	shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
19	Representatives from a list of five qualified persons
20	recommended by the Pennsylvania Coroners' Association.
21	(5) One educator qualified in the field of criminal
22	justice shall be appointed by the Governor.
23	(6) One county district attorney shall be appointed by
24	the Governor.
25	(d) VacanciesA member appointed to fill a vacancy created
26	by any reason other than expiration of a term shall be appointed
27	for the unexpired term of the member who the appointee succeeds
28	in the same manner as the original appointment.
29	(e) ExpensesThe members of the board shall serve without
30	compensation but shall be reimbursed the necessary and actual
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1	expenses incurred in attending the meetings of the board and in
2	the performance of their duties under this subchapter.
3	(f) RemovalMembers of the board, except the executive
4	directors of the commission and the association, may be removed
5	by the Governor for good cause shown upon written notice from
6	the Governor specifically stating the cause for removal.
7	(g) ChairThe members of the board shall select a chair
8	from among the members to serve for a period of one year. A
9	chair may be elected to serve successive terms.
10	(h) MeetingsThe board shall meet bimonthly in person or
11	via video or conference call. Special meetings may be called by
12	the chair of the board or upon written request of a majority of
13	members. Special meeting notices shall be provided two days in
14	advance and contain the agenda items to be discussed at the
15	special meeting.
16	(i) QuorumA quorum is required at all meetings in order
17	for votes to be taken. A simple majority of members present
18	<u>shall constitute a quorum.</u>
19	§ 7524. Powers and duties of board.
20	The board may consult with the commission on any matters it
21	deems necessary or appropriate. The powers and duties of the
22	board shall be to:
23	(1) Establish, implement and administer the Coroners'
24	Education and Training Program for county coroners, chief
25	deputy coroners, deputy coroners and any other individuals
26	performing death investigations, regardless of job title and
27	regardless of whether they are a full-time employee, part-
28	<u>time employee or per diem employee.</u>
29	(2) Establish, implement and administer a continuing
30	education program for county coroners, chief deputy coroners,

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1	deputy coroners and any other individuals performing death
2	investigations, regardless of job title and regardless of
3	whether they are a full-time employee, part-time employee or
4	per diem employee. In doing so, the board shall determine
5	which courses, seminars, lectures and meetings qualify for
6	credit hours and the number of credits to be given to each.
7	(3) Establish the minimum qualifications for instructors
8	and certify instructors.
9	(4) Approve or revoke the approval of any school or
10	entity that may be utilized to comply with the educational
11	and training requirements of this subchapter.
12	(5) Establish the tuition to be charged for the course
13	of instruction that shall be as nearly equal to the cost of
14	administering the course and the written examination,
15	including instruction materials, instructor fees, lodging and
16	meals.
17	(6) Certify county coroners, chief deputy coroners,
18	deputy coroners and any other individuals performing death
19	investigations, regardless of job title and regardless of
20	whether they are a full-time employee, part-time employee or
21	per diem employee, who have satisfactorily completed the
22	basic education and training requirements of this subchapter
23	and issue appropriate certificates to them.
24	(7) Revoke the certification of county coroners, chief
25	deputy coroners, deputy coroners and any other individuals
26	performing death investigations, regardless of job title and
27	regardless of whether they are a full-time employee, part-
28	time employee or per diem employee in accordance with section
29	7531 (relating to revocation of certification).
30	(8) Reinstate previously revoked certifications of

1	county coroners, chief deputy coroners, deputy coroners and
2	any other individuals performing death investigations,
3	regardless of job title and regardless of whether they are a
4	<u>full-time employee, part-time employee or per diem employee</u>
5	if the board finds that the circumstances which led to the
6	revocation of certification are no longer an impediment to
7	certification.
8	(9) Make rules and regulations and perform other duties
9	as may reasonably be necessary or appropriate to administer
10	this subchapter.
11	(10) Make an annual report to the Governor and to the
12	General Assembly concerning:
13	(i) The administration of the Coroners' Education
14	and Training Program.
15	(ii) The activities of the board.
16	(iii) The costs of the program.
17	§ 7525. Education and training program.
18	The Coroners' Education and Training Program shall be no less
19	than 40 hours of instruction and a final examination. The
20	program shall include subjects such as death scene
21	investigation, crime scene processing, toxicology, preservation
22	of evidence, forensic autopsies, child abuse deaths, elder abuse
23	deaths, pandemic needs and responses, office management,
24	including forms and reports to be implemented, and the legal
25	duties of the office of coroner.
26	<u>§ 7526. Continuing education.</u>
27	The continuing education program shall require no less than
28	12 hours of continuing education annually. No more than four
29	hours may be completed online. Continuing education requirements
30	may be obtained in conjunction with the annual conference of the

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1	association. The board may increase the required course hours if
2	it is determined that an increase is necessary to maintain
3	current knowledge in the operations of the coroner and shall
4	provide notice of the increase one year prior to the effective
5	date of the new requirements.
6	<u>§ 7527. Coroner training requirements.</u>
7	(a) Course of instruction and written examination
8	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2) and
9	subsection (c), an individual elected or appointed for the
10	first time to the office of coroner on or after the effective
11	date of this paragraph shall complete, prior to being sworn
12	into the office, the required course of instruction and shall
13	successfully pass the final examination with a score of no
14	less than 80%.
15	(2) The board may postpone the requirements under
16	paragraph (1) upon a showing of just cause.
17	(b) NoncomplianceIf the individual elected or appointed
18	to the office of coroner fails to comply with the requirements
19	under subsection (a) without just cause, the individual shall
20	not be eligible to take the oath of office and the office of
21	coroner shall be deemed vacant. The vacancy shall be filled in
22	accordance with the laws of this Commonwealth.
23	(c) VacancyIn the event of a vacancy in the office of
24	coroner, the individual appointed to fill the vacancy shall
25	complete the next available course of instruction and
26	successfully pass the written examination with a score of not
27	less than 80%. In the event the individual appointed to fill a
28	vacancy in the office of coroner is currently a medicolegal
29	death investigator within the office who has previously
30	completed the course and successfully passed the examination and
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1	has maintained any continuing education requirements, the
2	appointee shall not be required to participate in an additional
3	course and written examination.
4	§ 7528. Chief deputy coroner, deputy coroner or other
5	individual performing death investigations training
6	requirements.
7	(a) Course of instruction and written examination
8	(1) Except as provided under paragraph (2), an
9	individual appointed on or after the effective date of this
10	paragraph to the position of chief deputy coroner, deputy
11	coroner or as an individual performing death investigations
12	shall, within one year, complete the required course of
13	instruction and pass the final examination with a score of no
14	less than 80%.
15	(2) The board may postpone the completion requirement
16	under paragraph (1) upon a showing of just cause.
17	(3) The board may establish rules to apply to per diem
18	death investigators, as long as those rules do not eliminate
19	any of the course requirements and a successful passing score
20	of not less than 80%.
21	(b) NoncomplianceIf the appointed individual fails to
22	comply with the requirements under subsection (a) without just
23	cause, a vacancy shall be deemed to exist in that position and
24	the vacancy shall be filled in accordance with the manner of the
25	original appointment.
26	§ 7529. Continuing education requirements.
27	(a) RequirementEach year, every coroner, chief deputy
28	coroner, deputy coroner and any other individual performing
29	death investigations, regardless of job title and regardless of
30	whether they are a full-time employee, part-time employee or per
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1	diem employee, shall, while in office, meet the requirements for
2	continuing education established by the board.
3	(b) National certificationAs part of the continuing
4	education requirements for a coroner or chief deputy coroner,
5	each coroner and chief deputy coroner shall attain national
6	medicolegal death investigation certification through the
7	American Board of Medicolegal Death Investigators within two
8	years of taking office and shall maintain the number of hours of
9	continuing education required to maintain national
10	certification.
11	<u>§ 7530. Home rule counties.</u>
12	In the case of a county which has adopted a home rule charter
13	which provides for the appointment of the coroner, a coroner
14	appointed after the effective date of this section shall obtain
15	certification within six months of appointment and fulfill
16	continuing education requirements as required under this
17	subchapter.
18	<u>§ 7531. Revocation of certification.</u>
19	(a) Revocation of chief deputy coroner, deputy coroner and
20	any other individual performing death investigations
21	certificationThe board shall revoke the certification of any
22	chief deputy coroner, deputy coroner and any other individual
23	performing death investigations for one or more of the
24	following:
25	(1) Conviction for a felony or misdemeanor of the first
26	<u>degree or second degree.</u>
27	(2) If the board determines the individual was dismissed
28	for cause from employment as a chief deputy coroner, deputy
29	coroner and any other individual performing death
30	investigations regardless of job title.

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1	(3) If the board determines the individual is physically
2	or psychologically unfit to perform the duties of the office.
3	(4) If the board determines the individual has committed
4	misconduct which makes the person unfit to perform the duties
5	of the office, including:
6	(i) Submission to the board of a document that the
7	individual knows contains false information, including a
8	fraudulent application.
9	(ii) Cheating on board examinations or skills tests.
10	(b) Revocation of coroner certificationThe board shall
11	revoke the certification of a coroner only after the coroner is
12	removed from office. Nothing in this subchapter shall be
13	interpreted as providing grounds for removal of a coroner from
14	office, except as provided for by Article VI of the Constitution
15	<u>of Pennsylvania.</u>
16	(c) Notification by coronerIn the case of any chief
17	deputy coroner, deputy coroner and any other individual
18	performing death investigations regardless of job title, it
19	shall be the responsibility of the coroner to notify the board
20	within 15 days of the occurrence of an event described under
21	subsection (a).
22	(d) Notification by county commissionersIn the case of a
23	coroner, it shall be the responsibility of the county
24	commissioners to notify the board within 15 days of a coroner's
25	removal from office.
26	(e) RegulationsThe board shall establish regulations
27	providing for the following:
28	(1) Notice of a revocation and the right of coroners,
29	any chief deputy coroner, deputy coroner and any other
30	individual performing death investigations regardless of job

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1	title to request a hearing.
2	(2) Standards and guidelines for application for
3	recertification following revocation.
4	§ 7532. Coroners' Education and Training Account.
5	(a) EstablishmentThe Coroners' Education and Training
6	Account is established as a special restricted account within
7	the General Fund. Money in the account is appropriated on a
8	continuing basis to the commission for the purpose of financing
9	education and training expenses, the costs of administering the
10	program, reimbursements to counties and all other costs
11	associated with the activities of the board and the
12	implementation of this subchapter.
13	(b) FeeTwo dollars from the fee for each death
14	certificate issued shall be deposited into the account.
15	(c) DisbursementsDisbursements from the account shall be
16	made by the commission.
17	(d) Reimbursement to countiesEach county shall pay the
18	ordinary and necessary living and travel expenses and the
19	regular wages and per diem of each coroner, chief deputy
20	coroner, deputy coroner and any other individual that performs
21	death investigations while attending approved courses. The
22	commission shall reimburse each county 100% of the stated
23	expenses incurred by each coroner, chief deputy coroner, deputy
24	coroner and any other individual that performs death
25	investigations while attending the basic education and training
26	course, the national medicolegal death investigation
27	certification course and continuing education courses. The
28	commission shall provide for 100% of the tuition incurred while
29	attending basic education and training, national medicolegal
30	death investigation certification training and continuing

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1 <u>education.</u>

2 Section 2. Repeals are as follows:

3 (1) The General Assembly declares that the repeal under 4 paragraph (2) is necessary to effectuate the addition of 44 5 Pa.C.S. Ch. 75.

6 (2) The act of March 2, 1988 (P.L.108, No.22), referred 7 to as the Coroners' Education Board Law, is repealed.

8 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
