AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), entitled 1 "An act providing for and reorganizing the conduct of the 2 executive and administrative work of the Commonwealth by the 3 Executive Department thereof and the administrative departments, boards, commissions, and officers thereof, including the boards of trustees of State Normal Schools, or 5 6 Teachers Colleges; abolishing, creating, reorganizing or 7 authorizing the reorganization of certain administrative 8 9 departments, boards, and commissions; defining the powers and duties of the Governor and other executive and administrative 10 officers, and of the several administrative departments, 11 boards, commissions, and officers; fixing the salaries of the 12 Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and certain other executive 13 and administrative officers; providing for the appointment of 14 certain administrative officers, and of all deputies and 15 other assistants and employes in certain departments, boards, 16 and commissions; providing for judicial administration; and 17 prescribing the manner in which the number and compensation 18 19 of the deputies and all other assistants and employes of certain departments, boards and commissions shall be 20 determined," in powers and duties of the Department of Health 21 and its departmental administrative and advisory boards, 22 23 providing for administration of COVID-19 antigen tests. 24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 25 hereby enacts as follows: 26 Section 1. The act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175), known 27 as The Administrative Code of 1929, is amended by adding a
- 28 section to read:

- 1 Section 2127. Administration of COVID-19 Antigen Tests.--(a)
- 2 Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of
- 3 Health, in collaboration with other State agencies, shall
- 4 provide a temporary waiver to authorize licensed pharmacies to
- 5 <u>be reimbursed for medical billing related to the administration</u>
- 6 of COVID-19 antigen tests approved by the United States Food and
- 7 <u>Drug Administration</u>.
- 8 (b) The temporary waiver under subsection (a) shall remain
- 9 <u>in place for no less than six months following the termination</u>
- 10 of the Federal emergency declaration related to COVID-19 or
- 11 <u>December 31, 2022, whichever is later. The Secretary of Health</u>
- 12 shall transmit notice of the date of the expiration of the
- 13 temporary waiver to the Legislative Reference Bureau for
- 14 <u>publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.</u>
- 15 <u>(c) To the extent necessary in order to implement this</u>
- 16 <u>section</u>, the Department of Health shall request a waiver of
- 17 Federal law and regulations or any other necessary approval from
- 18 the Federal Government.
- 19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
