## AN ACT

5	payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid at the close
6	of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2022; to provide
7	appropriations from special funds and accounts to the
8	Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year July
9	1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, and for the payment of bills
10	remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June
11	30, 2022; to provide for the appropriation of Federal funds
12	to the Executive and Judicial Departments for the fiscal year
13	July 1, 2022, to June 30, 2023, and for the payment of bills
14	remaining unpaid at the close of the fiscal year ending June

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- 15 SECTION 8101. RETROACTIVITY.
- 16 SECTION 8102. EFFECTIVE DATE.
- 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 18 hereby enacts as follows:

- 22 This act shall be known and may be cited as the General
- 23 Appropriation Act of 2022.
- 24 Section 102. Definitions.

- 28 "COVID" or "COVID 19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an-
- 29 infectious disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome-
- 30 coronavirus 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in

- 1 Wuhan, China.
- 2 "Current fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1,-
- 3 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.
- 4 "Employees." Includes all directors, superintendents, bureau-
- 5 or division chiefs, assistant directors, assistant
- 6 superintendents, assistant chiefs, experts, scientists,
- 7 engineers, surveyors, draftsmen, accountants, secretaries,
- 8 auditors, inspectors, examiners, analysts, statisticians,
- 9 marshals, clerks, stenographers, bookkeepers, messengers and
- 10 other assistants in a department, board or commission.
- 11 "Expenses" and "maintenance." Includes all printing, binding
- 12 and stationery, food and forage, materials and supplies,
- 13 traveling expenses, training, motor vehicle supplies and
- 14 repairs, freight, express and cartage, postage,
- 15 telecommunication devices and telecommunication rentals and toll-
- 16 charges, newspaper advertising and notices, public advertising
- 17 by or through any medium, fuel, light, heat, power and water,
- 18 minor construction and renovation, repairs or reconstruction of
- 19 equipment, buildings and facilities, rent of real estate and
- 20 equipment, premiums on workers' compensation, insurance premiums-
- 21 on policies of liability insurance, insurance premiums on
- 22 medical payment insurance and surety bonds for volunteer
- 23 workers, premiums on employee group life insurance and employee-
- 24 and retired employee group hospital and medical insurance,
- 25 payment of Commonwealth share of Social Security taxes and
- 26 unemployment compensation costs for State employees, the
- 27 purchase of replacement or additional equipment and machinery
- 28 and all other incidental costs and expenses, including payment-
- 29 to the Department of General Services of mileage and other-
- 30 charges for the use of motor vehicles and rental payments for

- 1 permanently assigned motor vehicles and of expenses or costs of
- 2 services incurred through the Purchasing Fund. The term
- 3 "expenses" also shall include the medical costs for the
- 4 treatment of inmates of State institutions when the inmate must-
- 5 be transferred to an outside hospital, provided that in no case
- 6 shall the State institution pay more for patient care than that-
- 7 provided under the State medical assistance program.
- 8 "Prior fiscal year." The fiscal year beginning July 1 of the
- 9 fiscal year immediately prior to the current fiscal year.

- 22 (b) Special funds and accounts. Except as provided in Part
- 23 LI, the sums specified in this act, or as much thereof as may be
- 24 necessary, are specifically appropriated from the special funds-
- 25 and accounts in the State Treasury to agencies of the Executive-
- 26 and Judicial Departments of the Commonwealth for the payment of
- 27 salaries, wages or other compensation and travel expenses of the
- 28 duly appointed officers and employees of the Commonwealth, for-
- 29 the payment of fees for contractual services rendered, for the
- 30 <del>purchase or rental of goods and services and for payment of any</del>

- 1 other expenses, as provided by law or by this act, necessary for
- 2 the proper conduct of the duties, functions and activities and
- 3 for the purposes specified in this act for the current fiscal
- 4 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 5 at the close of the prior fiscal year.
- 6 Section 105. Federal appropriations.
- 7 Except as otherwise provided in Part LI, the Federal-
- 8 appropriations specified in this act, or as much thereof as may
- 9 be necessary, are specifically appropriated to the agencies of
- 10 the Executive Department of the Commonwealth specified in this-
- 11 act for the payment of the expenses of implementing and carrying
- 12 out the programs specified in this act for the current fiscal
- 13 year and for the payment of bills incurred and remaining unpaid
- 14 at the close of the prior fiscal year. Unless otherwise stated,
- 15 the Federal appropriations include any carryovers from the prior
