1	Amending the act of December 20, 1985 (P.L.45/, No.112),	<
2	entitled "An act relating to the right to practice medicine	
3	and surgery and the right to practice medically related acts;	_
4	reestablishing the State Board of Medical Education and	
5	Licensure as the State Board of Medicine and providing for	
6	its composition, powers and duties; providing for the	
7	issuance of licenses and certificates and the suspension and	
8	revocation of licenses and certificates; provided penalties;	
9	and making repeals," further providing for definitions; and	
10	abrogating an inconsistent regulation.	
11	AMENDING THE ACT OF OCTOBER 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, NO.261), ENTITLED	<
12	"AN ACT REQUIRING THE LICENSING OF PRACTITIONERS OF	
13	OSTEOPATHIC MEDICINE AND SURGERY; REGULATING THEIR PRACTICE;	
14	PROVIDING FOR CERTAIN FUNDS AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS AND	
15	REPEALS, " FURTHER PROVIDING FOR DEFINITIONS; AND ABROGATING A	
16	REGULATION.	
17	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania	
18	hereby enacts as follows:	
19	Section 1. The definitions of "athletic training services"	<
20	and "physically active person" in section 2 of the act of	
21	December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the Medical	
22	Practice Act of 1985, are amended to read:	
23	Section 2. Definitions.	
24	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall	
25	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the	

1	context clearly indicates otherwise:
2	* * *
3	"Athletic training services."
4	(1) The management and provision of care of injuries to
5	a physically active person as defined in this act with the
6	direction of a licensed physician. The term includes the
7	rendering of emergency care, development of injury prevention
8	programs and providing appropriate preventative and
9	supporting devices for the physically active person. The term
10	also includes the assessment, management, treatment,
11	rehabilitation and reconditioning of the physically active-
12	person whose conditions are within the professional
13	preparation and education of a licensed athletic trainer. The
14	term also includes the use of modalities such as mechanical
15	stimulation, heat, cold, light, air, water, electricity,
16	sound, massage and the use of therapeutic exercises,
17	reconditioning exercise and fitness programs.
18	(2) Athletic training services shall not include
19	[surgery, invasive procedures or prescription of any
20	controlled substance any of the following:
21	(i) Surgery.
22	(ii) Prescription of any controlled substance.
23	(iii) Invasive procedures, except an athletic
24	trainer licensed to practice may, with the direction of a
25	licensed physician, perform the following invasive
26	procedures pursuant to a written protocol:
27	(A) Rectal thermometry.
28	(B) Intramuscular or subcutaneous medication
29	administration injections.
20	(C) Airway adjuncts in conformity with basis

1	life support protocols and instruments.
2	(D) Capillary finger sticks for the purpose of
3	testing blood glucose levels.
4	(E) Nasal plugs.
5	(F) Blister and nail care.
6	(G) Administration of naloxone.
7	(II) Removal of superficial foreign bodies.
8	(I) Any other procedures authorized by the
9	board.
10	(3) Nothing in this definition shall be construed to
11	require a licensed physician to authorize a licensed athletic
12	trainer to perform invasive procedures.

14	"Physically active person." An individual who [participates
15	in organized, individual or team sports, athletic games or-
16	recreational sport activity. engages in an activity that may be
17	associated with any injury, disorder or medical condition which
18	requires a level of strength, endurance, flexibility, range of
19	motion, speed or agility or could result from exercise, sports,
20	recreation, wellness or employment.

22	Section 2. The provisions of 49 Pa. Code Ch. 18 Subch. E are
23	abrogated insofar as they are inconsistent with the amendment of
24	the definitions of "athletic training services" and "physically
25	active person" in section 2 of the act.
26	Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
27	SECTION 1. THE DEFINITIONS OF "ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES" <
28	AND "PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON" IN SECTION 2 OF THE ACT OF
29	OCTOBER 5, 1978 (P.L.1109, NO.261), KNOWN AS THE OSTEOPATHIC
30	MEDICAL PRACTICE ACT, ARE AMENDED AND THE SECTION IS AMENDED BY

- 2 SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.
- 3 THE FOLLOWING WORDS AND PHRASES WHEN USED IN THIS ACT SHALL
- 4 HAVE, UNLESS THE CONTEXT CLEARLY INDICATES OTHERWISE, THE
- 5 MEANINGS GIVEN TO THEM IN THIS SECTION:
- 6 * * *
- 7 "ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES."
- 8 (1) THE MANAGEMENT AND PROVISION OF CARE OF [INJURIES]
- 9 <u>AN INJURY</u> TO A PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON AS DEFINED IN THIS
- 10 ACT WITH THE DIRECTION OF A LICENSED PHYSICIAN. THE TERM
- 11 INCLUDES THE RENDERING OF EMERGENCY CARE, DEVELOPMENT OF
- 12 INJURY PREVENTION PROGRAMS AND PROVIDING APPROPRIATE
- 13 PREVENTATIVE AND SUPPORTING DEVICES FOR THE PHYSICALLY ACTIVE
- 14 PERSON. THE TERM ALSO INCLUDES THE ASSESSMENT, MANAGEMENT,
- 15 TREATMENT, REHABILITATION AND RECONDITIONING OF THE
- 16 PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON WHOSE CONDITIONS ARE WITHIN THE
- 17 PROFESSIONAL PREPARATION AND EDUCATION OF A LICENSED ATHLETIC
- 18 TRAINER. THE TERM ALSO INCLUDES THE USE OF MODALITIES SUCH AS
- 19 MECHANICAL STIMULATION, HEAT, COLD, LIGHT, AIR, WATER,
- 20 ELECTRICITY, SOUND, MASSAGE AND THE USE OF THERAPEUTIC
- 21 EXERCISES, RECONDITIONING EXERCISE AND FITNESS PROGRAMS.
- 22 (2) ATHLETIC TRAINING SERVICES SHALL NOT INCLUDE
- 23 [SURGERY, INVASIVE PROCEDURES OR PRESCRIPTION OF ANY
- 24 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.] ANY OF THE FOLLOWING:
- 25 (I) SURGERY.
- 26 (II) PRESCRIPTION OF ANY CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE.
- 27 <u>(III) INVASIVE PROCEDURES, EXCEPT AN ATHLETIC</u>
- TRAINER LICENSED TO PRACTICE MAY, WITH THE DIRECTION OF A
- 29 <u>LICENSED PHYSICIAN, PERFORM THE FOLLOWING INVASIVE</u>
- 30 PROCEDURES PURSUANT TO A WRITTEN PROTOCOL:

1	(A) RECTAL THERMOMETRY.
2	(B) INTRAMUSCULAR OR SUBCUTANEOUS MEDICATION
3	ADMINISTRATION INJECTIONS.
4	(C) AIRWAY ADJUNCTS IN CONFORMITY WITH BASIC
5	LIFE SUPPORT PROTOCOLS AND INSTRUMENTS.
6	(D) CAPILLARY FINGER STICKS FOR THE PURPOSE OF
7	TESTING BLOOD GLUCOSE LEVELS.
8	(E) NASAL PLUGS.
9	(F) BLISTER AND NAIL CARE.
10	(G) ADMINISTRATION OF NALOXONE.
11	(H) REMOVAL OF SUPERFICIAL FOREIGN BODIES.
12	(I) ANY OTHER PROCEDURES AUTHORIZED BY THE
13	BOARD.
14	(3) NOTHING IN THIS DEFINITION SHALL BE CONSTRUED TO
15	REQUIRE A LICENSED PHYSICIAN TO AUTHORIZE A LICENSED ATHLETIC
16	TRAINER TO PERFORM INVASIVE PROCEDURES.

18	"INJURY." A MUSCULOSKELETAL OR ORTHOPEDIC INJURY OR OTHER
19	MEDICAL CONDITION SUFFERED BY A PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON WHERE
20	PREVENTION, MAINTENANCE AND TREATMENT IS PROVIDED WITHIN THE
21	ACCEPTABLE STANDARD OF CARE AND EDUCATION FOR AN ATHLETIC
22	TRAINER.

24	"PHYSICALLY ACTIVE PERSON." AN INDIVIDUAL WHO [PARTICIPATES
25	IN ORGANIZED, INDIVIDUAL OR TEAM SPORTS, ATHLETIC GAMES OR
26	RECREATIONAL SPORT ACTIVITY.] <u>ENGAGES IN AN ACTIVITY ASSOCIATED</u>
27	WITH EXERCISE, SPORTS, RECREATION OR VOCATION THAT REQUIRES A
28	LEVEL OF STRENGTH, ENDURANCE, FLEXIBILITY, RANGE OF MOTION,
29	SPEED OR AGILITY.

- 2 ABROGATED INSOFAR AS THEY ARE INCONSISTENT WITH THE AMENDMENT OF

- 4 SECTION 3. THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY.
