A RESOLUTION

Recognizing the week of February 22 through 28, 2021, as "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" in Pennsylvania in conjunction with 1 2 the observance of "National Eating Disorders Awareness Week." 3 4 WHEREAS, The National Eating Disorders Association's (NEDA's) "National Eating Disorders Awareness Week" is the largest and 5 best-known eating disorders outreach effort in the country; and 6 7 WHEREAS, The goal of "National Eating Disorders Awareness Week" or "NEDAwareness Week" is to shine the spotlight on eating disorders by educating the public, spreading a message of hope 10 and putting life-saving resources into the hands of those in need; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Eating disorders have the highest mortality rate of 13 any mental illness and approximately 30 million Americans 14 struggle at some point in their lives with an eating disorder; 15 and 16 WHEREAS, These disorders affect people across all backgrounds and include anorexia nervosa, bulimia nervosa and binge eating 17

disorders; and

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- 1 WHEREAS, The 2021 theme for "NEDAwareness Week" is "Every
- 2 Body Has a Seat at the Table"; and
- 3 WHEREAS, This theme invites inclusivity in the greater eating
- 4 disorder community and sends a message to individuals at all
- 5 stages of body acceptance that their eating disorder recovery
- 6 issues are valid; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Signs and symptoms of eating disorders are often
- 8 overlooked, and many individuals, families and communities are
- 9 unaware of the devastating mental and physical consequences of
- 10 eating disorders, as well as the pressures, attitudes and
- 11 behaviours that shape them; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Many cases of eating disorders go undetected, and
- 13 less than one-third of youths with eating disorders receive
- 14 treatment; and
- 15 WHEREAS, Eating disorder experts have found that prompt,
- 16 intensive treatment significantly improves the chances of
- 17 recovery; and
- 18 WHEREAS, The Senate recognizes that "National Eating
- 19 Disorders Awareness Week" highlights the importance of
- 20 screenings for early detection and intervention of eating
- 21 disorders, dispels myths and presents eating disorders as a
- 22 public health issue with close connections to substance abuse,
- 23 obesity, trauma and other mental health conditions such as
- 24 depression, anxiety and obsessive-compulsive disorder; therefore
- 25 be it

- 27 through 28, 2021, as "Eating Disorders Awareness Week" in
- 28 Pennsylvania in conjunction with the observance of "National
- 29 Eating Disorders Awareness Week."
