## A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing the month of March 2021 as "National Social Work 2 Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, For decades, the social work profession has been
- 4 dedicated to improving human well-being and enhancing the basic
- 5 needs of all individuals, especially the most vulnerable; and
- 6 WHEREAS, This year's "National Social Work Month" theme,
- 7 "Social Workers Are Essential," embodies the heroic
- 8 contributions of the social work profession to our nation,
- 9 including the work social workers have done to heal our nation
- 10 during these times of pandemic, racial unrest, economic
- 11 uncertainty and political divisiveness; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Social workers have always been present in times of
- 13 crisis, helping individuals overcome issues such as death and
- 14 grief and helping individuals and communities recover from
- 15 natural disasters such as fires, hurricanes and earthquakes; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Social workers have helped the United States live up
- 17 to its values by successfully advocating for equal rights for
- 18 all individuals, no matter the race, sexual identity, gender,

- 1 gender expression, culture or religion; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Social work is one of the fastest growing
- 3 professions in the United States, with nearly 800,000
- 4 individuals expected to be employed as social workers by 2028;
- 5 and
- 6 WHEREAS, Social workers work in all parts of our society to
- 7 empower individuals to live to their fullest potential; and
- 8 WHEREAS, School social workers have worked with families and
- 9 schools throughout the pandemic to ensure students reach their
- 10 full academic and personal potential; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Social workers play a crucial role in the health
- 12 care system of the United States, including the response to
- 13 COVID-19 and helping individuals, families and communities cope
- 14 with the pandemic; and
- WHEREAS, Social workers for generations have advocated for
- 16 positive changes that have made society a better place to live,
- 17 including urging policymakers to adopt the minimum wage, improve
- 18 workplace safety and enact social safety net programs that help
- 19 ameliorate hunger, homelessness, and poverty; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Social workers are one of the largest groups of
- 21 mental health care providers in the United States, and work
- 22 daily to help individuals, whether in person or remotely,
- 23 overcome substance use disorders and mental illnesses such as
- 24 depression and anxiety; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Social workers will continue to stand ready to
- 26 assist our nation in overcoming present and future challenges,
- 27 including pushing for racial equity, ending gun violence,
- 28 improving health care and mental health care for all and urging
- 29 lawmakers to adopt immigration reforms; therefore be it
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the month of March 2021

- 1 as "National Social Work Month" in Pennsylvania and call upon
- 2 all residents of this Commonwealth to join the National
- 3 Association of Social Workers in celebration and support of the
- 4 social work profession.
