## A RESOLUTION

- Establishing a task force on law enforcement policies and procedures used in response to large-scale demonstrations,
- protests and other acts of civil disobedience.
- 4 WHEREAS, The United States is currently engaged in a national
- 5 debate on law enforcement policies and practices; and
- 6 WHEREAS, High-profile incidents of use of force by law
- 7 enforcement have led to numerous demonstrations and protests in
- 8 recent months; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Several of these demonstrations and protests have
- 10 turned violent; and
- 11 WHEREAS, These violent demonstrations and protests have
- 12 resulted in millions of dollars in property damage, numerous
- 13 arrests, physical injuries and, in some cases, death; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Law enforcement responses to large-scale but
- 15 otherwise peaceful acts of civil disobedience have the potential
- 16 to escalate already charged atmospheres; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth have a
- 18 constitutional right to assemble peacefully; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Law enforcement has a duty and responsibility to
- 2 protect the general public from acts of violence, including
- 3 riots and militant protests; and
- 4 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth has an obligation to assist law
- 5 enforcement in developing best practices to ensure that large-
- 6 scale demonstrations do not become violent; therefore be it
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Senate establish a task force on law
- 8 enforcement policies and procedures for responding to large-
- 9 scale demonstrations; and be it further
- 10 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of the following
- 11 members:
- 12 (1) Two members of the Senate, one appointed by the
- 13 President pro tempore of the Senate and one appointed by the
- 14 Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 15 (2) The Chairman of the Pennsylvania Emergency
- 16 Management Council.
- 17 (3) The Commissioner of the Pennsylvania State Police.
- 18 (4) The Attorney General of the Commonwealth.
- 19 (5) The Adjutant General of the Commonwealth.
- 20 (6) The mayor of a city of the first class, or his or
- 21 her designee.
- 22 (7) The mayor of a city of the second class, or his or
- 23 her designee.
- 24 (8) The Police Commissioner of a city of the first
- 25 class, or his or her designee.
- 26 (9) The Chief of Police of a city of the second class,
- or his or her designee; and be it further
- 28 RESOLVED, That the task force be comprised of 10 members
- 29 appointed by the Governor as follows:
- 30 (1) One member representing the Pennsylvania League of

- 1 Cities.
- 2 (2) One member representing The County Commissioners
- 3 Association of Pennsylvania.
- 4 (3) Two incumbent mayors of a city of the third class.
- 5 (4) One incumbent chief of police the police department
- 6 of a city of third class.
- 7 (5) One chief of police of a university or campus police
- 8 department.
- 9 (6) One current or former Federal law enforcement
- 10 officer with experience in handling protests and other forms
- of civil disobedience.
- 12 (7) One current or former member of the United States
- 13 Department of Justice Civil Rights Division with experience
- in investigating, litigating or prosecuting claims of civil
- 15 rights violations.
- 16 (8) Two attorneys or legal educators specializing in the
- 17 field of civil rights or constitutional law; and be it
- 18 further
- 19 RESOLVED, That the task force direct the Joint State
- 20 Government Commission to establish an advisory committee
- 21 consisting of the following members:
- 22 (1) Two individuals representing the Pennsylvania
- 23 Chapter of the National Association for the Advancement of
- 24 Colored People to be selected by the Joint State Government
- Commission, upon the recommendation of the governing body of
- 26 the Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Association for the
- 27 Advancement of Colored People.
- 28 (2) Two individuals representing the Pennsylvania
- 29 Chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union to be selected
- 30 by the Joint State Government Commission, upon the

- recommendation of the governing body of the Pennsylvania
  Chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union.
  - (3) Two individuals representing Pennsylvania Chapters of the National Lawyers Guild to be selected by the Joint State Government Commission, upon the recommendation of the governing body of the National Lawyers Guild.
  - (4) One individual representing the Pennsylvania

    District Attorneys Association to be selected by the Joint

    State Government Commission, upon the recommendation of the governing body of the Pennsylvania District Attorneys

    Association.
- 12 (5) One individual representing the Pennsylvania State
  13 Troopers Association to be selected by the Joint State
  14 Government Commission, upon the recommendation of the
  15 governing body of the Pennsylvania State Troopers
  16 Association.
- 17 (6) One individual representing the Pennsylvania Chiefs
  18 of Police Association to be selected by the Joint State
  19 Government Commission, upon the recommendation of the
  20 governing body of the Pennsylvania Chiefs of Police
  21 Association.
- 22 (7) One individual representing the Pennsylvania 23 Sheriffs' Association to be selected by the Joint State 24 Government Commission, upon the recommendation of the 25 governing body of the Pennsylvania Sheriffs' Association; and 26 be it further
- 27 RESOLVED, That the Chairman of the Pennsylvania Emergency
- 28 Management Council serve as chairperson of the advisory
- 29 committee; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working

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- 1 with the task force and the advisory committee, conduct a
- 2 thorough and comprehensive study of existing State and local law
- 3 enforcement policies and procedures for responding to acts of
- 4 civil disobedience, including training and response programs,
- 5 crowd control tactics, the use of less-than-lethal force, the
- 6 issues set forth in this resolution and other related issues as
- 7 determined by the Joint State Government Commission; and be it
- 8 further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission, working
- 10 with the task force and the advisory committee, review the
- 11 following to identify the best law enforcement practices for
- 12 responding to acts of civil disobedience and the causes of
- 13 escalation from peaceful demonstration to violent protest and
- 14 develop recommendations best suited for law enforcement agencies
- 15 in this Commonwealth:
- 16 (1) Proposals and policies of other states.
- 17 (2) Policies currently in place at law enforcement
- 18 agencies in this Commonwealth and other states.
- 19 (3) Other resources on the issues of civil disobedience
- and law enforcement practices; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission
- 22 establish a process by which interested members of the public
- 23 can make suggestions and offer input to the task force; and be
- 24 it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the task force recommend changes to State law,
- 26 practices, policies and procedures relating to law enforcement
- 27 responses to acts of civil disobedience that are necessary to
- 28 ensure the rights and safety of demonstrators, law enforcement
- 29 and the general public; and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a

- 1 report of the task force's findings and recommendations to the
- 2 Senate within 12 months of the adoption of this resolution.
