A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 2021 as "Testicular Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, According to Johns Hopkins Medicine, testis cancer
- 4 is most common in men in their late 20s and early 30s with an
- 5 average age of diagnosis of approximately 33 years old; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Testicular cancer is the most common cancer among
- 7 men between the ages of 20 and 40; and
- 8 WHEREAS, While the average age of men diagnosed is 33 years
- 9 old, about 6% of cases occur in children and teens and
- 10 approximately 8% will occur in men over the age of 55; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Testicular cancer is the second most common cancer
- 12 for boys ages 15 to 19 years old; and
- 13 WHEREAS, According to the American Cancer Society, 1 in 270
- 14 men, or approximately 9,470 men, will be diagnosed with
- 15 testicular cancer annually; and
- 16 WHEREAS, There will be an estimated 450 testicular cancer-
- 17 related deaths this year; and

- 1 WHEREAS, According to The American Society of Clinical
- 2 Oncology (ASCO), the number of cases associated with testicular
- 3 cancer has seen an increase over the course of several decades;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, The survival rate is higher for men diagnosed with
- 6 early-stage testicular cancer rather than later-stage testicular
- 7 cancer; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Approximately 68% of men are diagnosed with early-
- 9 stage testicular cancer; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The increase of testicular cancer cases is
- 11 attributed to men being less likely to schedule regular health
- 12 examinations and give self-examinations for a variety of common
- 13 diseases; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Greater education on testicular cancer will
- 15 encourage men to introduce positive health-related habits into
- 16 their lives; therefore be it
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate designate the month of April 2021
- 18 as "Testicular Cancer Awareness Month" in Pennsylvania.
