A RESOLUTION

- Designating April 24, 2021, as "Pennsylvania's Day of Remembrance of the Armenian Genocide of 1915-1923."
- 3 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania joins human rights
- 4 advocates and historians from around the world to recognize and
- 5 mourn the 1.5 million Armenians who perished in the Armenian
- 6 Genocide as ordered by the government of the Ottoman Empire,
- 7 which began on April 24, 1915, with the arrest, exile and murder
- 8 of hundreds of Armenian intellectuals and political, religious
- 9 and business leaders; and
- 10 WHEREAS, During the 1915-1923 Genocide, Armenian survivors
- 11 were forced to witness the slaughter of their relatives and the
- 12 loss of their ancestral land and property in what is now known
- 13 as the "First Genocide of the 20th Century"; and
- 14 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania declared in 1965
- 15 that April 24 of each year will serve as a day of remembrance of
- 16 the Armenian Genocide of 1915-1923; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The failure to learn from the past allows history to
- 18 repeat itself as the world saw during the 2020 Nagorno-Karabagh

- 1 War when the military forces of Azerbaijan and Turkey attacked
- 2 the Armenian civilian population of Nagorno-Karabagh and its
- 3 churches and civic buildings, resulting in casualties and loss
- 4 of ancestral land and property, motivated by the same genocidal
- 5 campaign that their ancestors suffered 106 years earlier; and
- 6 WHEREAS, The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania is proud to join
- 7 the Armenian-American community of Pennsylvania in its
- 8 commemoration of the 106th anniversary of the Armenian Genocide
- 9 in an effort to educate others about the tragic loss of life,
- 10 land and human rights of the Armenian people and the crimes of
- 11 genocide committed against them, as well as Greeks and
- 12 Assyrians, due to religious and political beliefs; therefore be
- 13 it
- 14 RESOLVED, That the Senate of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 15 designate April 24, 2021, as "Pennsylvania's Day of Remembrance
- 16 of the Armenian Genocide of 1915-1923"; and be it further
- 17 RESOLVED, That the Senate urge all residents of Pennsylvania
- 18 to join in this solemn remembrance in memory of the victims of
- 19 the Armenian Genocide and in honor of the survivors and their
- 20 descendants; and be it further
- 21 RESOLVED, That the Senate affirm the right of Christians and
- 22 all the residents of the Artsakh Republic to practice their
- 23 faith in freedom and without fear of foreign aggression; and be
- 24 it further
- 25 RESOLVED, That the Senate recognize the right to self-
- 26 determination and independence of the Artsakh Republic, and
- 27 respectfully urge the President and Congress of the United
- 28 States to do the same; and be it further
- 29 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 30 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each

1 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
