AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), entitled "An
- act to consolidate, editorially revise, and codify the public
- 3 welfare laws of the Commonwealth," in departmental powers and
- duties as to supervision, providing for plan for societal
- 5 reentry.
- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 7 hereby enacts as follows:
- 8 Section 1. The act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21), known
- 9 as the Human Services Code, is amended by adding a section to
- 10 read:
- 11 Section 923. Plan for Societal Reentry. -- (a) The
- 12 <u>department</u>, in consultation with the Department of Health and
- 13 the Department of Corrections, shall develop a plan to ensure
- 14 that by July 1, 2027, no individual is discharged into
- 15 <u>homelessness if the individual:</u>
- 16 <u>(1) Is released from an institution that:</u>
- 17 (i) the department has supervisory powers over under section
- 18 <u>902; or</u>
- 19 (ii) is supervised by the Department of Corrections.

- 1 (2) Was cared for overnight for seven consecutive days or
- 2 <u>longer by the institution.</u>
- 3 (b) The plan developed under subsection (a) shall:
- 4 (1) Specify actions that departments or agencies of the
- 5 Commonwealth must take to ensure that no individual is
- 6 <u>discharged into homelessness</u>.
- 7 (2) List needed statutory and funding legislative actions.
- 8 (3) Assign specific departments or agencies of the
- 9 Commonwealth actions to effectuate the plan.
- 10 (c) By March 1, 2024, the department shall distribute a copy
- 11 of the plan developed under subsection (a) to:
- 12 (1) The Governor.
- 13 (2) The Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the Senate.
- 14 (3) The Speaker of the House of Representatives and the
- 15 Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the House of
- 16 Representatives.
- 17 (4) The chair and minority chair of the following standing
- 18 committees of the Senate:
- 19 (i) Aging and Youth Committee.
- 20 (ii) Appropriations Committee.
- 21 (iii) Health and Human Services Committee.
- 22 (iv) Judiciary Committee.
- 23 (v) Local Government Committee.
- 24 (vi) Urban Affairs and Housing Committee.
- 25 (5) The chair and minority chair of the following standing
- 26 committees of the House of Representatives:
- 27 <u>(i) Aging and Older Adult Services Committee.</u>
- 28 (ii) Appropriations Committee.
- 29 (iii) Children and Youth Committee.
- 30 (iv) Health Committee.

- 1 (v) Housing and Community Development Committee.
- 2 (vi) Human Services Committee.
- 3 (vii) Judiciary Committee.
- 4 (viii) Local Government Committee.
- 5 (d) Prior to discharge from an institution under the
- 6 <u>supervision of the department under section 902</u>, the department
- 7 <u>shall ensure that a discharged individual has placement in</u>
- 8 <u>appropriate permanent housing.</u>
- 9 <u>(e) As used in this section:</u>
- 10 "Appropriate permanent housing" as follows:
- 11 <u>(1) The term includes:</u>
- 12 <u>(i) Single room occupancies.</u>
- 13 <u>(ii) Transitional housing.</u>
- 14 (iii) Housing obtained through housing and rental voucher
- 15 programs.
- 16 (iv) Other housing available through Federal or State
- 17 programs.
- 18 (2) The term does not include:
- 19 (i) Shelters or emergency shelters.
- 20 (ii) A public or private place designed without
- 21 accommodations for routine or regular living or sleeping.
- 22 (iii) Further incarceration in instances of an individual
- 23 released early from incarceration.
- 24 (iv) Continued housing in the current institution from which
- 25 the individual is being discharged.
- 26 "Homelessness" means "homeless," "homeless individual" or
- 27 "homeless person" as defined in 42 U.S.C. § 11302 (relating to
- 28 general definition of homeless individual).
- 29 <u>"Transitional housing" means temporary housing which is to</u>
- 30 facilitate the movement of individuals and families experiencing

- 1 <u>homelessness to permanent housing within twenty-four months or a</u>
- 2 <u>longer period as the secretary determines necessary.</u>
- 3 Section 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
