AN ACT

Amending the act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), entitled "An act to promote the public health and safety by providing for 2 examination, licensing and granting of permits for those who 3 desire to engage in the profession of cosmetology; defining 4 cosmetology, and regulating cosmetology salons, schools, 5 students, apprentices, teachers, managers, manicurists and 6 cosmetologists; conferring powers and duties upon the Commissioner of Professional and Occupational Affairs of the 7 8 Department of State; providing for appeals to certain courts 9 by applicants and licensees; and providing penalties," 10 providing for change of cosmetology salon location. 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 13 hereby enacts as follows: 14 Section 1. The act of May 3, 1933 (P.L.242, No.86), referred 15 to as the Cosmetology Law, is amended by adding a section to 16 read: 17 Section 4.5. Change of Cosmetology Salon Location. -- (a) The board shall immediately approve an application for a change of a 18 salon location submitted by a cosmetology salon that holds an 19 existing salon license and has not been found by the board to 20 21 have committed a violation of the provisions of this act if the 22 salon owner provides the following information to the board: (1) A sketch plan showing the layout of the new location of 23

- 1 the salon, including the position of the doors, windows,
- 2 partitions, shampoo basins, lavatories, adjustable chairs and
- 3 other floor equipment.
- 4 (2) The name and license number of the person who will be
- 5 the designated person in charge of the salon in the owner's
- 6 <u>absence</u>.
- 7 (b) A bureau inspector shall perform an inspection of a new
- 8 salon location for compliance with facility requirements within
- 9 ten days of the board's approval of an application under
- 10 subsection (a).
- 11 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
