AN ACT

- 1 Providing for protection of pregnant individuals' information,
- for authorization for disclosure, for data breach and for
- 3 violation.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Short title.
- 7 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Protection of
- 8 Pregnant Individuals' Information Act.
- 9 Section 2. Definitions.
- 10 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 11 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 12 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 13 "Health information." Information or data, except age or
- 14 gender, whether oral or recorded in a form or medium, created by
- 15 or derived from a limited services pregnancy center or an
- 16 individual that relates to one or more of the following:
- 17 (1) The past, present or future physical, mental or

- 1 behavioral health or condition of an individual.
- 2 (2) A service provided to or discussed with the
- 3 individual, including any pregnancy-related service.
- 4 "Limited services pregnancy center." A pregnancy services
- 5 center that does not directly provide, or provide referrals for,
- 6 abortions or emergency contraception and is not covered by
- 7 medical privacy laws.
- 8 "Nonpublic personal health information." Health information
- 9 that identifies an individual who is the subject of the
- 10 information or health information that there is a reasonable
- 11 basis to believe could be used to identify an individual.
- 12 "Pregnancy-related service." A medical or counseling service
- 13 related to pregnancy, pregnancy prevention or pregnancy
- 14 termination, including contraception and contraceptive
- 15 counseling, pregnancy testing, pregnancy diagnosis, pregnancy
- 16 options counseling, obstetric ultrasound, obstetric sonogram and
- 17 prenatal care.
- 18 "Pregnancy services center." A facility, including a mobile
- 19 facility, the primary purpose of which is to provide services to
- 20 clients who are or have reason to believe that they may be
- 21 pregnant and that either:
- 22 (1) offers obstetric ultrasounds, obstetric sonograms,
- 23 pregnancy testing or diagnosis or prenatal care to pregnant
- 24 clients; or
- 25 (2) has the appearance of a medical facility by virtue
- 26 of having two or more of the following factors present:
- 27 (i) staff or volunteers who wear medical attire and
- 28 uniforms;
- 29 (ii) one or more examination tables;
- 30 (iii) a private or semiprivate room or area

- 1 containing medical supplies or medical instruments;
- 2 (iv) staff or volunteers who collect health
- 3 information from clients; or
- 4 (v) the facility is located on the same premises as
- 5 a licensed health care facility or health care provider
- or shares facility space with a licensed health care
- 7 provider.
- 8 Section 3. Authorization required for disclosure.
- 9 (a) Disclosure prohibited. -- A limited services pregnancy
- 10 center may not disclose nonpublic personal health information
- 11 about an individual unless an authorization is obtained from the
- 12 individual whose nonpublic personal health information is sought
- 13 to be disclosed.
- 14 (b) Exceptions. -- A limited services pregnancy center may
- 15 disclose nonpublic personal health information without
- 16 authorization if disclosure is required to comply with Federal,
- 17 State or local laws, a civil, criminal or regulatory inquiry,
- 18 investigation, subpoena or summons by Federal, State or local
- 19 authorities or to cooperate with law enforcement agencies
- 20 concerning conduct or activity that the business, service
- 21 provider or third party reasonably and in good faith believes
- 22 may violate Federal, State or local laws.
- 23 (c) Valid authorization contents. -- A valid authorization to
- 24 disclose nonpublic personal health information shall be in
- 25 written or electronic form and shall contain all of the
- 26 following:
- 27 (1) The identity of the individual who is the subject of
- the nonpublic personal health information.
- 29 (2) A general description of the types of nonpublic
- 30 personal health information to be disclosed.

- 1 (3) General descriptions of the parties to whom the
- 2 limited services pregnancy center discloses nonpublic
- 3 personal health information, the purpose of the disclosure
- 4 and how the information will be used.
- 5 (4) The signature of the individual who is the subject
- of the nonpublic personal health information or the
- 7 individual who is legally empowered to grant authority and
- 8 the date signed.
- 9 (5) Notice of the length of time for which the
- 10 authorization is valid, notice that the individual may revoke
- 11 the authorization at any time and the procedure for making a
- 12 revocation.
- 13 (d) Duration of authorization. -- An authorization shall
- 14 specify a length of time for which the authorization shall
- 15 remain valid, which may not be for more than 24 months.
- 16 (e) Revocation of authorization. -- An individual who is the
- 17 subject of nonpublic personal health information may revoke an
- 18 authorization provided under this act at any time, subject to
- 19 the rights of a limited services pregnancy center who acted in
- 20 reliance on the authorization prior to notice of the revocation.
- 21 (f) Record of authorization. -- A limited services pregnancy
- 22 center shall retain the authorization and a revocation of the
- 23 authorization, or copies thereof, for six years in the record of
- 24 the individual who is the subject of nonpublic personal health
- 25 information.
- 26 (q) Nondiscrimination. -- A limited services pregnancy center
- 27 may not unfairly discriminate against an individual because that
- 28 individual has not granted authorization for the disclosure of
- 29 nonpublic personal health information under this act.
- 30 Section 4. Data breach.

- 1 A limited services pregnancy center that maintains, stores or
- 2 manages computerized nonpublic personal health information shall
- 3 provide notice of any breach of the security of the system as
- 4 provided under the act of December 22, 2005 (P.L.474, No.94),
- 5 known as the Breach of Personal Information Notification Act.
- 6 Section 5. Violation.
- 7 A violation of this act constitutes unfair methods of
- 8 competition and unfair or deceptive acts or practices within the
- 9 meaning of section 2(4) of the act of December 17, 1968
- 10 (P.L.1224, No.387), known as the Unfair Trade Practices and
- 11 Consumer Protection Law, and shall be subject to the enforcement
- 12 provisions, civil penalties and private rights of action
- 13 specified in that act. Loss of money or property is not required
- 14 for private right of action under this act.
- 15 Section 6. Effective date.
- 16 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
