AN ACT

Amending Titles 53 (Municipalities Generally), 66 (Public 1 Utilities), 74 (Transportation) and 75 (Vehicles) of the 2 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in taxicabs and 3 limousines in first class cities, providing for medical discrimination prohibited; in transportation network 5 companies, further providing for transportation network service accessibility; in service and facilities, further 6 7 providing for discrimination in service; in transportation 8 9 network service, further providing for service standards; in sustainable mobility options, further providing for 10 definitions and providing for medical discrimination 11 prohibited; and, in miscellaneous provisions relating to 12 operation of vehicles, providing for student medical 13 discrimination prohibited. 14 15 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 16 hereby enacts as follows: 17 Section 1. Title 53 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 18 Statutes is amended by adding sections to read: 19 § 5723.1. - 12 vehicle:

- 2 that the school district is in compliance with this section.
- 3 Upon receipt of the certification, the department shall
- 4 provide to the school district or contractor any
- 5 transportation funds that the school district or contractor
- 6 would have been otherwise eligible for during the time period
- 7 <u>in which the transportation funds were withheld under</u>
- 8 paragraph (1).
- 9 <u>(4) The department may not withhold Federal funds under</u>
- 10 paragraph (1).

- 25 Section 8. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
