AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 17, 2016 (P.L.84, No.16), entitled "An act establishing a medical marijuana program; providing for 2 patient and caregiver certification and for medical marijuana 3 organization registration; imposing duties on the Department of Health; providing for a tax on medical marijuana 5 organization gross receipts; establishing the Medical 6 7 Marijuana Program Fund; establishing the Medical Marijuana Advisory Board; establishing a medical marijuana research 8 program; imposing duties on the Department of Corrections, 9 the Department of Education and the Department of Human 10 Services; and providing for academic clinical research 11 centers and for penalties and enforcement," in preliminary 12 provisions, further providing for definitions; in medical 13 marijuana organizations, providing for additional dispensary 14 15 permits authorized; and, in administration, providing for available licenses. 16 17 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 19 Section 1. Section 103 of the act of April 17, 2016 (P.L.84,
- 20 No.16), known as the Medical Marijuana Act, is amended by adding

- 22 Section 103. Definitions.
- 23 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 24
- 25 context clearly indicates otherwise:

- 2 "Disadvantaged business." A business that is owned or
- 3 controlled by a majority of persons, not limited to members of
- 4 minority groups, who are subject to racial or ethnic prejudice
- 5 or cultural bias.

- 7 <u>"Diverse business." A disadvantaged business, minority-owned</u>
- 8 or women-owned business or service-disabled veteran-owned or
- 9 <u>veteran-owned small business that has been certified by a third-</u>
- 10 party certifying organization as defined in section 615(d).
- 11 * * *
- 12 "Small business." An independently owned and operated for-
- 13 profit business that employs 100 or fewer employees and not a
- 14 subsidiary or affiliate of a corporation.

- 16 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 17 Section 617. Additional dispensary permits authorized.
- 18 The department shall issue an additional dispensary permit in
- 19 each region established under section 603(d) to an applicant
- 20 that is any of the following:
- 21 <u>(1) A disadvantaged business.</u>
- 22 (2) A diverse business.
- 23 (3) A small business.
- 24 Section 3. Section 1106 of the act is amended to read:

- The department shall:
- 27 (1) No later than December 5 of each year, publish a
- 28 list of the surrendered or revoked licenses under this
- 29 <u>chapter on the department's publicly accessible Internet</u>
- website.

2	applications for the licenses that appear on the list under
3	paragraph (1), submitted by an applicant that is any of the
4	<pre>following:</pre>
5	(i) A disadvantaged business.
6	(ii) A diverse business.
7	(iii) A small business.
8	Section 4. This act shall take effect in 120 days.
