23	The [Medical Officer or Health <u>Care</u> ] <u>SPECIALTY BRANCH</u> Officer <
24	Incentive Program is established within the department to
25	provide educational stipends to eligible [medical officers or <
26	health <u>care</u> ] <u>SPECIALTY BRANCH</u> officers in accordance with the <
27	provisions of this subchapter.
28	§ 3213. Program stipend.
29	(a) General rule
30	[(1) A resident physician, physician or physician
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1 assistant who meets the requirements under subsection (c) may 2 receive a stipend of \$1,000 per month for no more than 48 3 months of medicine residency or the first 36 accession months 4 of service to the Pennsylvania National Guard.

5 (2) A behavioral health officer, public health officer 6 or environmental science officer who meets the requirements 7 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$500 per month 8 for no more than the first 36 accession months of service to 9 the Pennsylvania National Guard.]

<u>(3) A medical officer or health care officer who is</u>
 <u>required to have obtained a doctoral degree for entry into</u>
 the officer's military specialty and who meets the

13 requirements under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of

14 \$1,000 per month for no more than 48 months of medicine

15 <u>residency or the first 36 accession months of service to the</u> 16 Pennsylvania National Guard.

17 (4) A medical officer or health care officer who is
18 required to have obtained a master's degree for entry into
19 the officer's military specialty who meets the requirements
20 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$750 per month
21 for no more than 48 months of medicine residency or the first
22 36 accession months of service to the Pennsylvania National
23 Guard.

(5) A medical officer or health care officer who is
 required to have obtained a bachelor's degree for entry into
 the officer's military specialty who meets the requirements
 under subsection (c) may receive a stipend of \$500 per month
 for no more than 48 months of medicine residency or the first
 36 accession months of service to the Pennsylvania National

Agree to serve as a [medical officer or health care] <--2 (3) 3 SPECIALTY BRANCH officer in the Pennsylvania National Guard [after completion of residency or initial service obligation] 4 5 for a period of one month for each monthly stipend received. 6 This service obligation shall be concurrent with any other 7 military service obligation of the officer. 8 (4) Meet Federal and State licensing requirements to 9 practice within the officer's medical specialty within the

10 <u>Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.</u>

11 (5) Meet any applicable Federal requirements for the
 12 Pennsylvania National Guard.

13 (6) Once licensed and eligible to be granted, maintain
14 clinical privileges as awarded at the national guard level by
15 the Centralized Credentials and Privileging Preparation Board
16 (C2P2).

17 (d) Receipt of stipend.--A stipend under subsection (a) 18 shall be paid to an eligible [medical officer or health care] <---SPECIALTY BRANCH officer whose application for the stipend is 19 20 approved at the completion of each month of residency or 21 service. A [medical officer or health care] SPECIALTY BRANCH <---22 officer may not receive a stipend under subsection (a) for more 23 than 48 months during the period of service in the Pennsylvania 24 National Guard.

(e) Adjustments.--If the Adjutant General determines that
the amount available for the program in any year will be
insufficient to provide stipends in the amount described under
subsection (a), the Adjutant General may place a cap on the
number of [medical officers or health <u>care</u>] <u>SPECIALTY BRANCH</u> <---</li>
officers eligible to receive stipends or may adjust the amount

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1 of the annual stipend.

(f) Construction.--Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit a medical officer or health <u>care</u> officer who is serving in the Pennsylvania National Guard before the effective date of this section and who meets the requirements under subsection (c) from receiving a stipend under subsection (a) during the period of [medicine] <u>medical</u> residency or service.

9 § 3214. Additional incentives.

To the extent that funds are available, the Adjutant General 10 may, by regulation, establish additional incentives to aid in 11 the recruitment and retention of [medical officers or health 12 <---13 care] <u>SPECIALTY BRANCH</u> officers in the Pennsylvania National <---14 Guard, provided that payment of such additional incentives shall 15 not result in a cap on participation or reduction in the amount 16 of stipends paid under section 3213 (relating to program 17 stipend).

18 § 3216. Recoupment of incentive payments.

19 (a) General rule.--A recipient of a stipend or other 20 incentive payment under this subchapter who fails to complete 21 [his] the recipient's service obligation or to meet other requirements established by the Adjutant General is liable to 22 23 the Commonwealth for repayment of all incentive payments made. 24 The Adjutant General shall notify the department if the 25 recipient fails to complete the service obligation, and the 26 promissory note under section 3215 (relating to promissory note) 27 shall be called to secure payment in full upon demand on a 28 schedule as the department may determine.

(b) Forgiveness of recoupment.--The Adjutant General mayforgive recoupment of all or part of a recipient's stipend or

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other incentive payment if the Adjutant General determines that 1 2 [his] the recipient's failure to fulfill the service obligation 3 was the result of [his] the recipient's death, discharge because of disability incurred in line of duty, discharge because of a 4 medical determination that [he] the recipient is medically unfit 5 for duty when the medical condition is outside [his] the 6 7 recipient's control and is not due to [his] the recipient's 8 misconduct, mandatory discharge, release or retirement for age or years of service or discharge, release, transfer or 9 10 retirement because of other compelling circumstances outside [his] the recipient's control. 11

12 § 3217. Adjustment of stipend amounts.

13 Beginning on January 1, [2016] 2024, and every [two] five 14 years thereafter, the Adjutant General may adjust, by notice 15 published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin, the amounts of the 16 stipends set forth in this subchapter by an amount equal to the change in the applicable Consumer Price Index in the preceding 17 18 [two] five years provided that the Adjutant General finds 19 sufficient funds are appropriated and available to pay for the 20 adjusted stipends.

21 § 3223. ELIGIBILITY.

22 AN ELIGIBLE MEMBER MAY [APPLY FOR PARTICIPATION] <u>PARTICIPATE</u> 23 IN THE PROGRAM IF THE ELIGIBLE MEMBER DOES OR MEETS ALL OF THE 24 FOLLOWING:

[(1) HAS BEEN A SATISFACTORY PARTICIPANT IN PENNSYLVANIA
NATIONAL GUARD ACTIVITIES FOR A MINIMUM SERVICE PERIOD
ESTABLISHED BY THE ADJUTANT GENERAL OR IS A FORMER ELIGIBLE
MEMBER AND HAS RECEIVED A DISCHARGE OTHER THAN A DISHONORABLE
DISCHARGE.]
(2) [HAS ACCEPTED] ACCEPTS AN OBLIGATION TO SERVE IN THE

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PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD FOR A PERIOD OF AT LEAST EIGHT
 YEARS AND HAS NOT ACCEPTED AN OBLIGATION UNDER SUBCHAPTER A
 (RELATING TO EDUCATIONAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM) OR A.1 (RELATING
 TO MILITARY FAMILY EDUCATION PROGRAM) FOR THE SAME SERVICE
 PERIOD. THE SERVICE OBLIGATION TO THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL
 GUARD SHALL BE TWO YEARS AS A CADET IN THE MILITARY COLLEGE
 AND EIGHT YEARS AS A COMMISSIONED OFFICER.

8 (3) SERVES AS A SIMULTANEOUS MEMBERSHIP PROGRAM CADET IN 9 THE PENNSYLVANIA NATIONAL GUARD AND ACCEPTS A PENNSYLVANIA 10 NATIONAL GUARD COMMISSION UPON GRADUATION FROM THE MILITARY 11 COLLEGE.

(4) PROVIDES PROOF OF UNITED STATES CITIZENSHIP.

(5) PROVIDES PROOF OF MEETING PHYSICAL STANDARDS, IN
EFFECT ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, REQUIRED TO BE
CONSIDERED TO SERVE IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY.

16 (6) PROVIDES PROOF OF MEETING ACADEMIC STANDARDS, IN
17 EFFECT ON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, REQUIRED TO BE
18 CONSIDERED TO SERVE IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY AS A
19 COMMISSIONED OFFICER.

(7) PROVIDES A LETTER OF INTENT.

21 (8) PROVIDES A LETTER OF ACCEPTANCE INTO THE EARLY22 COMMISSIONING PROGRAM.

23 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
