AN ACT

1 Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An
2 act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and
3 duties of the Department of Health; establishing and
4 providing the powers and duties of the State Health
5 Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care
6 Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health
7 Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice;
8 providing for certification of need of health care providers
9 and prescribing penalties," in general provisions, repeals
10 and effective date, providing for acute care mental health
11 bed registry and referrals.

12 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
13 hereby enacts as follows:

14 Section 1. The act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known
15 as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by adding a
16 section to read:

17 Section 901.1. Acute care mental health bed registry and
18 referrals.

19 (a) The department shall develop and administer a voluntary
20 Internet web-based acute care mental health bed registry to
21 facilitate the temporary hospitalization and treatment of
22 individuals who meet the criteria for inpatient examination and

1 treatment under Article II or III of the act of July 9, 1976
2 (P.L.817, No.143), known as the "Mental Health Procedures Act."
3 The department shall encourage facilities to voluntarily submit
4 the information specified in subsection (c). The department
5 shall make the registry accessible to health care professionals
6 and their designees who are treating patients in need of mental
7 health inpatient examination and treatment and to participating
8 facilities.

9 (b) The department shall design the registry to collect,
10 aggregate and display the information under subsection (c).

11 (c) The registry shall include all of the following
12 information:

13 (1) General descriptive information for each
14 participating facility, including contact information and the
15 type of treatment and services available at each
16 participating facility.

17 (2) Information on the number of acute care mental
18 health beds available at each participating facility. The
19 information shall be updated every eight hours.

20 (3) For each available acute care mental health bed at a
21 participating facility, the type of patient that may be
22 admitted.

23 (4) The level of security provided at each participating
24 facility.

25 (5) Any other information that may assist a health care
26 professional in identifying an appropriate acute care mental
27 health bed for an individual in need of inpatient examination
28 and treatment.

29 (d) The department shall design the registry to allow
30 health care professionals and their designees to search the

registry for an appropriate acute care mental health bed for an individual in need of inpatient examination or treatment.

(e) In order to be eligible to access the registry, a facility must:

(1) submit information specified under subsection (c) to the department for inclusion in the registry; and

(2) permit the facility's contact information to be monitored and accessed at any time in accordance with the department's regulations promulgated under subsection (h).

(f) The department may contract with a third party to develop and administer the registry.

(g) The department shall transmit notice of the date when the department completed the development of the registry to the Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

(h) The department shall promulgate regulations necessary to implement this section.

(i) As used in this section, the following words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection:

"Acute care mental health bed." A bed located at a mental health facility that provides acute care mental health services.

"Facility." A mental health facility.

"Health care professional." An individual licensed as a physician, osteopath, physician assistant or certified registered nurse practitioner.

"Mental health facility." A distinct part or unit of a general hospital licensed by the department under this act or a facility that exclusively cares for the mentally ill and is licensed by the Department of Human Services under the "Mental Health Procedures Act" and Article X of the act of June 13, 1967

1 (P.L.31, No.21), known as the "Human Services Code," that
2 provides inpatient mental health examination and treatment. The
3 term shall not include the emergency department of a general
4 hospital.

5 "Participating facility." A facility that satisfies the
6 conditions under subsection (e).

7 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
